Just over three years ago, Temple Israel temporarily ceased our in-person operations in concert with much of the world as we stared into the face of the first pandemic of our lifetime. Remembering back, this presented an existential challenge for the congregation in an uncertain time. I am proud of the actions of Temple's clergy and lay leaders who responded to the crisis with steady and clear vision. We are a stronger community because of the decisions that were made.

Worship went online as we welcomed you into our homes and private spaces for spiritually-uplifting services. Students in our Tyner Religious School and Susan & Harold Loss Early Childhood Center did

not lose a beat with classes on Zoom and outside on the driveways of our teachers and staff. Our social action team supported members of the community in need with the Free Fresh Food Pantry, check-in phone calls, and visits to our most vulnerable members through windows and across backyards.

HOW MUCH HAVE THINGS CHANGED IN THREE YEARS!!!

The United States Department of Health and Human Services has announced that on May 11, 2023 the Public Health Emergency for COVID-19 to expire. What this means for our country will be different for each of us. There are a number of legal and social ramifications for various populations. For some, COVID vaccines and tests will no longer be free, medical coverages will change, and required reporting of the disease will look different. In light of this change, many organizations will begin to imagine "life after COVID" and a new "normal." For many of us, this is just a formality as we have already eased into a post-pandemic world.

In the Book of Ecclesiastes we find insight for this transitional time in our lives:

To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven:

A time to be born, and a time to die; A time to plant, and a time to uproot that which is planted;

A time to kill, and a time to heal; A time to break down, and a time to build up;

A time to weep, and a time to laugh; A time to mourn, and a time to dance;

A time to cast away stones, and a time to gather stones together;

A time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing;

It feels as if these words were written purposefully for this exact time. Through the pandemic we experienced the tension of life and death...weeping and laughing...challenge and purpose. It was a roller coaster ride with ups and downs and an occasional "loop-the-loop" for good measure.

Today I am most struck by the final line of this biblical excerpt. There was a time to refrain from embracing others for the sake of safety and communal health. But now, we need to restore human connections. Most of us have already done this in our personal lives. Travel is back to pre-pandemic levels, restaurants are full, and people are comfortable attending theater, sporting events, and other public gatherings. But synagogues, mosques, and churches are not full the way we were before 2020. It is time to change that as we sustain our community for the future. We all need a spiritual hug and Temple Israel is offering them to anyone who needs one. Our doors are open and we are ready to welcome everyone back to your Spiritual Home.

So please join us this summer for one of our magnificent Shabbat Services Under the Stars. Take advantage of a class with your clergy. Enjoy a Shabbat Dinner at Temple with family and friends. Volunteer in one of our many social action projects like Do Good Date Night; or join a committee to help us Make a Difference. Last, but definitely not least, get ready for an incredible in-person High Holiday season in the Fall when we fill our sanctuary again...embracing community and prayer even if it means a short wait in the over-crowded parking lot.

We cannot wait to see you in this post-pandemic version of the most incredible congregation on earth.



WE TAKE PRIDE

STAFF SPOTLIGHT:

For Temple Israel, the Tyner Religious School is one of the most important connection points to the local Jewish community.

For many students it's their first formal connection to Temple, sometimes it's the first connection for a family to a great support group that Temple can provide.

Rabbi Arianna Gordon, Temple's Director of Education & Lifelong Learning, doesn't take this lightly.

"Teaching about Judaism and basic Jewish literacy is very important," Rabbi Gordon said. "But even more important is giving students the tools to really help them grow their Jewish identity, to feel connected to Temple, to feel confident in who they are, to learn to love Judaism."

Rabbi Gordon leads a team and works closely with Heidi Pevos and Lisa Kaplan to make things run smoothly in the education department.

Lisa Kaplan joined Temple staff in 2012 and for more than a decade has been responsible for making sure every logistic question is answered. In addition to working with the Tyner Religious School, she takes an active role in organizing and developing adult education programs alongside Rabbi Gordon and other Temple Clergy.

"I love it because I really feel like I'm being part of the community and advancing Jewish education for everyone from kindergarten to adults," Kaplan said. "We try to keep our programming relevant and exciting and I'm part of that process and we have a great team of staffers and clergy that work together to keep Judaism exciting for all of us and for all of our members."

Kaplan is also quick to point out how valuable the education department can be to helping those outside Temple better understand or connect with Judaism and the greater Detroit Jewish community.

"I think that we serve as a home base to people, for Jews and other community members and, and people who are exploring Judaism or new to Judaism," Kaplan said. "And this just kind of serves as a home base to reconnect with our culture and our history and our traditions."

Heidi Pevos is the newest full-time addition to our education department. She spent 19 years as a classroom teacher, working primarily with early elementary students, before she formally joined Temple as the Assistant Director of the Tyner Religious School.

As a classroom teacher she also worked as a cooperating teacher with student teachers, had on-hands training in that realm, and sat on the school improvement teams at various schools.

And that's the lens that she brings to her new role at Temple.

"Bringing that experience I find really helpful," Pevos said.

"This is kind of the year we come back from being online
(after COVID), so I think it's been really great that I've been
able to come with that lens as a classroom teacher."

Before joining the staff at Temple full time, Pevos had a part-time role at Temple teaching in the religious school and serving as a substitute teacher. When the opportunity opened up, she was interested because it represented a chance to continue working in education, but with new challenges and opportunities as an administrator.

"I think first and foremost really trying to create an environment where kids and families feel welcome and safe back in the building," Pevos said. "We want them to continue to use us as their link to Judaism, with everything that's going on in the world it's so important to make it so they love Temple. We want them to keep coming back, we want them to feel the programming and what we offer here helps that."

Pevos said her history at Temple and knowing Kaplan and Rabbi Gordon have helped a pretty seamless transition.

"I think we complement each other well," Pevos said. "I think we understand each other well, Lisa and I are very similar in nature, we have similar work habits, approaches, it's just hard to believe we are almost done with the school year the time has flown, and I think in general we are really looking forward to what's next all the time while still looking at the present."







