MESSAGE FROM OUR LEADERSHIP



L'SHANA TOVA

Our team at Temple Israel is hard at work going over our final preparation for the High Holy Days.

I am grateful to each member of our staff who contributes in their own way, whether big or small, to putting Temple in a place where it is ready to welcome thousands of congregants and community members over a 10-day period as we usher in the New Year. To put on the High Holy Days is truly a team effort and the group around me at Temple really shines when called upon this time of year.

We are excited to share the addition of the B'tzelem Elohim (Created in God's Image), an inclusive Rosh Hashanah service that comes from the work being done by our Belonging & Inclusivity Task Force, spearheaded by Rabbi Josh Bennett and our Robert Sosnick Family Life Center Director Kari Provizer. This duo is joined by a talented cross section of lay leaders who have provided direction to small tweaks in our physical plant and how we interact with congregants. These recent tweaks including the installation of accessible doors into the Wasserman Atrium from the front of our building. This enhancement was generously underwritten by our Temple Brotherhood.

Additionally, you may notice that all our worship services are indoors this year except for Selichot. In my short time here in West Bloomfield, I have grown accustomed to sharing outside worship experiences with our Temple community. With eyes on the future of these outdoor opportunities, Temple Israel is currently in the process of constructing two permanent structures outside.

Construction of the smaller permanent structure on our upper patio got underway in August and should be completed after the High Holy Days. The larger permanent structure where our tent(s) have been these last few years will start construction in September with the goal of getting as much done on the site as possible this fall to maximize our chances to be outside in the new space next summer. Our 'Shabbat Under the Stars' may get a later start in the summer of 2024 but we are optimistic that at least part of our traditional series of Shabbats will get to take place under the new structure. We look forward to sharing more about these structures, giving proper recognition to the donors behind them in the coming months.

As you read through the pages of our Messenger or visit our website, please take the time to learn more about the forthcoming High Holy Day experience. The two changes referenced above to our traditional worship schedule are just some of the enhancements for this year's worship.

We want these services to be enjoyable, accessible and meaningful to all whom worship with us whether in our building or online. If our team can provide any assistance in insuring this during the lead up to or throughout the 'Days of Awe', please reach out.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

PASSES

High Holy Day passes were mailed the week of August 28th to all members who have made their 2023-2024 annual commitment. There is no need to preregister for services. Your pass will include a schedule of all services. You may attend any age-appropriate service you wish. Simply bring your pass to each service you would like to attend.

If you need a guest pass for a family member or out of town guest, please fill out the form on our High Holy Days webpage (www.temple-israel.org/hhd23). Guest passes will be mailed to the Temple member. Guests must present their pass at each service they would like to attend.

RECIPROCITY

Will you be out of town for Rosh Hashanah and/or Yom Kippur? If you are planning to worship at a congregation near your travel destination, you are eligible for reciprocity. Through our affiliation with the Union for Reform Judaism, our congregation enjoys reciprocity with hundreds of synagogues nationally. We will work with our partners to ensure your seat at your destination synagogue.

STREAMING VIDEO

BABYSITTING

A sitter service for children one year of age and older will be available at all High Holy Day services, except Children's Services, BY ADVANCE REGISTRATION ONLY. Complete the Babysitting Request Form on our High Holy Days page online by Monday, September 11 for Rosh Hashanah and Wednesday, September 20 for Yom Kippur so we can plan accordingly. We apologize but we will not be able to admit walk-ins.

ARRIVING AT THE TEMPLE FOR SERVICES

We hope that your family will all arrive at Temple in one car. Parking is difficult for all synagogues during the High Holy Days. However, if you must drive separately we suggest that you simply arrange to meet at the doors and walk in together. Please keep in mind that out of town guest will have their own passes.

ACCESSIBILITY

Please display any handicapped stickers or placards clearly so our parking lot attendants can help those who need accessible parking arrangements.

HHD PRAYER BOOK

New this year, you will no longer need to bring or purchase *Gates of Repentance* prayer books. Temple will have the prayer books available in the pews. You do not need a prayer book for Family, Children's, B'tzelem Elohim, or Yizkor services.

YIZKOR (MEMORIAL) AND NEILAH (CONCLUDING) SERVICES

Our integrated Yizkor/Neilah Service will begin at 5:00pm and conclude by 6:15pm. Please do not bring a prayer book as one will be provided. An important aspect of the Yizkor Service will be our Memorial Booklet. The names of those who have passed away on or since last Yom Kippur will be listed. Please note that these names will not be read aloud. It is important that we have the correct names. If you have a loved one whose name should be listed in this Memorial Booklet we urge you to contact the Temple office at 248-661-5700 or in advance of Rosh Hashanah to confirm the spelling of the name.

HIGH HOLY DAYS FAO

WHAT EVEN ARE THE HIGH HOLY DAYS?

When we talk about the High Holy Days, we are generally referring to Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, two of our most meaningful and important holidays in our calendar cycle. There are other holidays in the same time period, like Slichot, Sukkot, and Simchat Torah, which makes the season feel festive and full.

WHEN DO WE CELEBRATE THE HIGH HOLY DAYS? DO I NEED TO TAKE OFF WORK?

Our holidays are set by the Hebrew calendar, based on the lunar cycle, so they fall at different times every year. This year, Rosh Hashanah falls on September 15th/16th, and Yom Kippur on September 24th/25th.

These are the holiest days of the year, and like Shabbat, are days when Jews typically do not work. Most folks will choose to take the day off, and join us at synagogue to observe the holidays.

SO, WHAT EXACTLY ARE WE CELEBRATING?

Rosh Hashanah marks the beginning of a new Jewish calendar year. It is a joyful day where we celebrate the passing of time, and the cycle of our lives. It's also the beginning of the Ten Days of Awe, during which we turn inward and reflect, asking ourselves tough questions about who we are, and reach out to those we've wronged in order to ask forgiveness before Yom Kippur.

Yom Kippur, which takes place at the end of these sacred ten days, is our Day of Repentance, during which we seek forgiveness for the wrongs we have committed in the previous year, and commit to doing better in the fresh new year to come. Traditionally, Jews fast throughout Yom Kippur to focus on this sacred task.

WHAT'S HAPPENING AT TI DURING THE HIGH HOLY DAYS?



"I've always liked the people who came here, they became good

friends of mine and I've become good friends of theirs," Stevenson said. "We help each other, I can't drive because I have problems with my eyes, but people volunteer to pick me up and bring me to a meeting and bring me home after. I keep going because I want to stay sober, and the stories and support are always positives for me."

Stevenson said each meeting he attends he leaves with proper perspective and appreciation for others.

This year is the double-chai anniversary for the group at Temple Israel, 36 years, and September is National Recovery Month.

National Recovery Month (Recovery Month), which started in 1989, is a national observance held every September to promote and support new evidence-based treatment and recovery practices, the nation's strong and proud recovery community, and the dedication of service providers and communities who make recovery in all its forms possible.

This month serves as an opportunity to highlight the importance of prevention, treatment, and recovery services, while also emphasizing the need to eliminate the stigmas associated with addiction and mental health issues. By shedding light on these critical matters, National Recovery Month promotes empathy, understanding, and support for those navigating the path to recovery.

Eliminating stigmas surrounding addiction and mental health is crucial because these stigmas can deter others from seeking help. Many struggling with substance use disorders or mental health conditions may avoid seeking treatment due to fear of judgment or discrimination. These negative perceptions can isolate individuals and perpetuate a cycle of shame and secrecy, hindering their ability to access the necessary care and support. By erasing stigmas, society can create an environment where individuals feel comfortable seeking help, sharing their stories, and connecting with others who have similar experiences. This inclusivity fosters a sense of community and empowerment that are essential for successful recovery journeys.





In Review: ECC Camp Shemesh - The ECC Summer Camp at Temple Israel offered a vibrant and engaging experience for campers. With a blend of enriching activities, creative exploration, and a focus on fostering social skills, the camp created a nurturing environment where campers thrived. From arts and crafts to outdoor adventures, lifelong memories and friendships were formed. Some of our themes included Over the Rainbow, Outer Space, and Spirit Week.



On weekday mornings you should stop and listen to the sounds of Temple Israel. If you listen carefully, you'll hear laughter. You'll hear young voices giggling at stories being told, and joy from games being played. Parents and grandparents are laughing, watching their kids or grandkids play, while on Thursdays the smell of tasty cookies or challah typically wafts through the hallways.

It's part of Temple Israel's Family Fun Classes, which through Marla Gartrell and Faye Friedman serve as many young families' first introduction to Temple and The Susan & Rabbi Harold Loss Early Childhood Center.

"It's an amazing experience for us, and more importantly for the families," Faye said. "We get to offer a space where kids and their parents, from the youngest age, get to play and learn, and really start to socialize for the first time outside of the house."

Faye works with some of the youngest group, the Baby Bunch and Beyond, and as toddlers grow, the class evolves. Many start coming to her class unable to walk, and leave it running around after a story or circle time.

From Baby Bunch and Beyond, many "graduate" to spending time with Marla through Temple Tots and the cooking class, Challah to Hamentashen.

Both are well structured, and provide a balance between structure and free play. The lessons are smartly woven in, and like the ECC, it's a place where lasting memories are made for both kids and their parents or grandparents. And while it's an intro to Temple Israel and the ECC for some, for others it can be a long-term legacy to a strong life in Judaism. In the summer session of the Challah to Hamentashen, Marla had a parent with their child, and two decades earlier that parent had been introduced taken part in the class with their mother.

It's not just an introduction to Jewish life, it's a legacy building experience happening each week at Temple Israel thanks to Faye and Marla.

And you can be part of it too. While the summer session of the Family Fun Classes recently wrapped up, you can still register for our fall classes. Don't miss out on that chance!



Markovitz has recorded albums before, but this is his first Jewish album, and it serves as both a nod to his distinct style, mixing in Blue Grass and singer-songwriter elements, and Jewish life that he's focused on since coming to Temple Israel in a formal role in 2022.

The album is also a mix of English and Hebrew, and some of the songs have been heard, and celebrated, already at Shabbat services. In fact, the first song on the album "Pursuers of Peace" was initially written for a Shabbat service, and then was brought in as part of the album process.











"I guess that's when you could say the album started, I didn't know I was working on the album then, but that's when the ideas and things started to come together," Markovitz said. "It was pretty cool to be able to craft the album, using some new things, some original, and some other things from the past."

When Markovitz writes music he usually establishes the lyrics first. It's not a fast and hard rule, but in general the line will come to mind, that's when he'll start to think about the melody and the best way to deliver the line.

From there, it's all about finding the right finish and not being afraid to try new things with both lyrics and melodies. For example, Markovitz had some elements of certain songs that he said sounded good, but needed to be changed or tweaked in the process.

In the end, he created an album that flows from start to finish, touching on important Jewish elements like redeeming the world, key holidays, and finding peace in everyday life.

The album title, "An Infinite Wave" came after Markovitz was researching Jewish history and knowledge.

"I had just started to play around with musical ideas and a line that just spoke to me, and it connects really well to Judaism, and what I had been reading," Markvovitz said. "So it kind of became the title track or theme, without it officially being the title track."

The line "An Infinite Wave," is used in the final two songs of the album, it's part of a fitting closeout to a new musical tradition that Temple Israel and the larger Jewish community have embraced with Markovitz.
