

COUPLES AND CONVERSATIONS

According to a recent report, 70% of Reform-raised Jews who married in the last ten years married non-Jews. Some of their spouses convert, some don't. Some of those couples decide to have Jewish families, and some don't.

But that 70% is a really important number. It's an unbelievable opportunity to open our doors, our hearts and our community to a whole host of incredible people. They have to be incredible if our neighbors and brothers and daughters and friends are choosing to marry them, right? It is up to us to make Judaism a place where all of these families not only feel accepted, but loved,

admired, and supported. Wouldn't you want to be a part of something like that?

As a rabbi married to a partner who chose Judaism, I understand the complexity in being part of a diverse extended family — it can be messy and challenging, eye-opening and beautiful, and can feel overwhelming to navigate, especially at the beginning.

Being part of an interfaith/Jew-ish/multi-faith/however-you-define-yourself couple can be challenging, especially this time of year, but you don't need to find the answers alone. I am a proud new participant in the Rukin Rabbinic Fellowship, which focuses on deepening rabbis' practices and understanding of working with interfaith couples — those who are seriously dating, engaged, and newly married — as they navigate these important questions together.

To that end, I am offering a new online workshop intended to provide a safe environment to work on creating your religious/cultural lives together, and to give couples a chance to build intentional homes and an amazing community.

Do you want to explore questions about your life together, including: How can we honor both of our heritages? Can we raise our children in one religion while exposing them to the other one? How will we celebrate holidays and lifecycle events? How can we talk to parents and other relatives about issues related to our interfaith relationship?

Would you like to discuss and begin to make decisions about your religious/spiritual/cultural life together with support from other couples, and address particular challenges that arise in your life? Do you want to get to know and develop relationships with other interfaith couples who are thinking about similar issues?








TYNER RELIGIOUS SCHOOL
