THANKSGIVING AND CHANUKAH

A man walked into the post office one day and purchased a card. He turned to the man next to him and said: "Sir, would you mind addressing this card for me?" And of course, the man gladly helped him out. "I hate to bother you again," said the first man, "but would you mind writing a short message on the card for me?" The kind gentleman agreed to this second request and wrote out the message as the man dictated it to him. He gave the completed card to the man who looked at it for a moment and then asked just one more favor. "I know this is an imposition," he said, "but would you mind doing one more thing for me? At the end of the message, would you

apologize for the horrible handwriting?"

Like the gentleman in this apocryphal story, sometimes we as Jews and as human beings, forget to be grateful for the many blessings in our lives. And first and foremost amongst the blessings for which we should be grateful in the months of November and December, is the incredible gift of religious freedom that we enjoy as both Americans and as Jews.

It is a freedom I worry we sometimes take too much for granted. How sad it would be if we gave up the precious religious freedom to live openly and freely as Jews out of apathy or disaffiliation. The thing about freedom is that, if you do not act on it, it essentially disappears. The months of November and December are a clarion call to take full advantage of our hard-won religious freedoms. After all, that is what both the Pilgrims and the Maccabees were fighting for! In essence, we activate our freedoms by becoming active in our respective faith traditions.

Indeed, I often argue that Thanksgiving and Chanukah are both Jewish holidays! Why? Well, the Pilgrims who were fleeing England for their religious freedom believed themselves to be the spiritual descendants of the Children of Israel from our Hebrew Bible and, to them, America was the New Jerusalem. In fact, their celebration of Thanksgiving was based on the Jewish Festival of Thanksgiving for a bountiful harvest, Sukkot.

Now, on Sukkot we sing a prayer known as Hallel, or Praises: "Hodu L'adonai Ki Tov. Give thanks to God, for God is good." Ironically, Hodu in Hebrew also means poultry or turkey, so Hodu L'adonai could be translated as "Give a turkey to God, because it is good." Maybe the Pilgrams were Jewish after all!

Chanukah, in essence, is also a Thanksgiving Festival. Why do we light one candle the first night, two the next and so on until the last night? Because, the rabbis declare, in issues of light, one must always increase. Chanukah, therefore, is a Festival of increasing light, of increasing dedication to our Jewish faith, and of increasing gratitude for the rights and freedoms that were won for us through the struggles and victories of our ancestors.

My prayer for all of us, therefore, during this season of gratitude, is that this Thanksgiving/Chanukah season of 5784, will find the light of religious freedom ever increasing here in our beloved America, around the world and, perhaps most especially, in our sacred homeland of Israel.

Oh, and speaking of giving thanks.... It is probably a good idea to thank the guy who helps you out in the post office. After all, in issues of giving thanks to the people around us, we should also always increase!

STAFF SPOTLIGHT:

The Susan and Rabbi Harold Loss Early Childhood Center is one of the pillars of the Temple Israel community. It's been that way for more than 40 years, with the ECC serving as a welcoming and nurturing space, which for many families has been their first connection to Temple Israel.

Much of the success of the ECC wouldn't be possible without administration staff led by director Rachel Levine, who is joined by assistant director Abby Johnson, administrative assistant Natalie Walls, and family engagement coordinator Heather Bershas.

"I work with three amazing women that help the ECC run so well," Levine said. "It's like coming home when I come into the office and it feels like a family, which is something I feel like extends to our entire program."

It often starts with Natalie, who is one of the first faces ECC families typically meet when considering bringing their children to Temple Israel. Natalie is the head of registration and for more than seven years has been the initial touchpoint to a family connection with the ECC.

"I love being one of those first faces they see, being able to connect with them and the families right away," she said. "It's an important part of my job, and I love being able to see families grow with our ECC."

Abby has been the ECC assistant director since August and brings a wealth of experience from her time teaching in public and private schools. Her position with Temple is effectively a homecoming type placement after growing up at Temple Israel. Throughout her career she's focused and helped drive literacy programs, and has a master's in Teaching and Curriculum with a specialization in reading and literacy.

"Temple has always felt like home and the opportunity to work and help grow the ECC has been an amazing opportunity," she said. "It's been great to bring my past experiences and what I've learned and be able to share and connect that here."

Heather is newer to her role as the family engagement coordinator, but has long been a fixture in the ECC, and

also still serves as a teacher.

Her past teaching experiences,
combined with her expertise,
have helped build and grow family
engagement for both the ECC
and Temple at large.

"It means a lot to me to be involved with families and to do it through the program here," she said. "The ECC has been a big part of my life, and in this new role I get to make sure others have similar great experiences."

Rachel has 30 years of experience as a teacher in both public and

private schools, and holds a master's degree in teaching Language Arts and Reading from Oakland University. She has worked as a mentor for Teach for America, and has been the assistant-director (and science teacher) here at Temple Israel's ECC for the last 10 years.

When asked about her position as ECC Director at the Susan and Rabbi Harold Loss Early Childhood Center, Rachel said, "I have developed deep and forever connections to the staff and the families here, and I am honored to serve in this new position. I was torn about leaving the classroom for an exclusively administrative role at first, but the three women working beside me (Natalie, Abby and Heather) have been a great support. I am really enjoying the challenge, and have a great feeling about moving the ECC forward in a positive and encouraging way!"

And as the ECC moves deeper into the school year, with the administration on staff, that's only going to continue thanks to these four women.



Make a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your IRA before December 31!

Who can take advantage of the required minimum distributions provision?

If you have an IRA and you are 70 $\frac{1}{2}$ or older, you and your spouse (each) can make a tax-free charitable distribution from your IRA.

BENEFITS:

- Help Temple Israel fulfill its mission while meeting your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your IRA.
- Pay no taxes on distributions of \$100,000 or less.
- Use your IRA to create a gift that pays you! Get reliable income for life by making a
 one-time, tax-free Qualified Charitable Distribution of up to \$50,000.



A gift of up to \$100,000 per person can be made from your IRAs.



Who can receive this gift?

The RMD must be gifted directly to a public charity, such as Temple Israel.

FUNDS IN ACTION

It's been 50 years since Don Rochen lost his brother.

It was the first day of Rosh Hashanah in 1973, one year after his mother passed, that Jeffrey David Rochen z"I was a victim of suicide. He was 25, a resident at Yale University in the department of Pediatrics, and by all outside accounts was a healthy young man.

"We didn't have any warning that this was going to happen, he's the only sibling I had," Don said.
"I miss him terribly, and over the years started to have trouble remembering him. I wanted to find a way to keep his memory alive and help others at the same time."

That's why Don and his wife Phyllis started the Jeffrey David Rochen z"l Memorial Fund. The fund focuses on providing mental health programming and support for teens and young adults.

The fund was originally started to help those in time of crisis, and those having suicidal thoughts, but has been expanded to be more encompassing with mental health. Don said the fund evolving and better serving young people today is important to his Jeffrey's legacy.

"I have five teenage grandchildren between the ages of 15 and 18 and they give me all kinds of stories about what they see, what they hear and talk to me about the challenges that seem to only have grown within the cell phone age," Don said. "We need to do more for mental health for our young people, we always have, but it feels like it's become even more challenging now for everyone."

For Don, the fund has served one purpose, it's honored his brother and helped keep memories alive. But its greater purpose is the lasting legacy for the next generation, which will hopefully be better served with mental health services and support.


