NEXT YEAR IN JERUSALEM...LITERALLY!

For almost two millennia, Jews around the world concluded their Passover Seders with the words, "Next Year in Jerusalem" despite the fact that there was very little chance that their fervent wish could ever come to fruition. This year, however, when you conclude your Seder with those same words, it is eminently possible for you to realize that ancient dream. If you have never visited Eretz Yisrael, you must consider traveling with Rabbi Loss (Tzvi over there in Israel) Shoshi, Wendy and me, along with Cantor Michael Smolash and his wife Dr. Jen Green, on our Temple Israel Adult Mission from April 5th through 18th, 2018. If it were within our power, we would most certainly make this a mandatory experience for every member of our congregation! Since, nebuch, Reform rabbis have no such powers, we can only cajole, persuade, wheedle, entice, inveigle, enthuse, gush,

rave and exhort. A trip to Israel is a mitzvah that every Jew should perform at least once in his or her lifetime, and fulfilling that mitzvah with one's own congregational family is the most meaningful way to do so.

So nu? What about those who have already been to Israel? Well, you can come along as well! For the very first time, we will be offering a "second timers" track, geared specifically to people who have traveled to Israel with us in the past. So if traveling to Israel with Tzvi and Shoshi, say back in the 70s or 80s was one of the highlights of your Jewish life, you can replicate and build on that experience next year...in Jerusalem...but without repeating the sites you have already seen and experienced.

If your worry can be summed up in the sentence, "I just don't do group tours," please know that Wendy and I feel the same way about other types of travel. As you will see if you join us, however, Jewish travel is most joyful, most uplifting, most educational, most emotional and even most fun when experienced with other Jews together as a community.

That is true, by the way, of travel to other Jewish destinations as well. This past year, we journeyed with over 200 members of our congregation on two separate missions back to our Ashkenazic roots in Eastern Europe. There we laughed, we cried, we ate, we celebrated, we prayed, we danced and we learned together. In the spring of 2019, it is time for us to turn to what, for most of us, are our more distant Sephardic Jewish roots as we journey together to Spain and Morocco. That too should be an incredible experience, but make sure you have been to Israel first!

If our adult missions are not for you from a demographic point of view, we have an Israel opportunity for almost everyone, including:

- ~ A Tamarack/TSS Community Trip: Israel from June 20th-July 14th, 2017 co-led by Rabbi Bennett.
- ~ The Temple Israel Family Mission to Israel, December 2018 co-led by Rabbis Bennett and Hornsten as well as Cantor Neil Michaels and his wife Stephanie.
- ~ In July of 2018, Temple Israel teens will once again join Rabbi Lader for the adventure of a lifetime on the Teen Mission to Israel. They spend a month hiking, touring, learning, eating, exploring, and connecting to the homeland of the Jewish people with 120 of their closest (new) friends.
- ~ And we are working on securing the funding for a very special young adult "adventure travel" mission co-sponsored by Temple Israel and The Well.

There is, you see, a very good reason that we are known as Temple Israel. Our synagogue was built on a firm foundation of Zionism and thus all of our clergy, going back to our founding Rabbi Leon Fram z"l, are reaching out to you--cajoling, persuading, wheedling, enticing, inveigling, enthusing, gushing, raving and exhorting you to spend "next year in Jerusalem."

For the past two years, Temple Israel has partnered with Forgotten Harvest to provide food for members of our local community. Every first and third Tuesday of the month, we serve nearly 150 families who suffer from “food insecurity,” meaning they are not sure where they will get their next meal. Because of the hard work of our dedicated volunteers, we help provide healthy, fresh food to these families twice every month.

During 2016, we distributed 287,140 pounds of food valued at \$479,523.00. A special thanks to our three chairpeople: Stacy Gordon, Laura Markle and Karen Rouff. 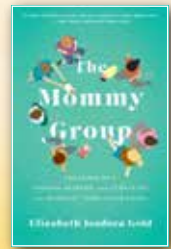

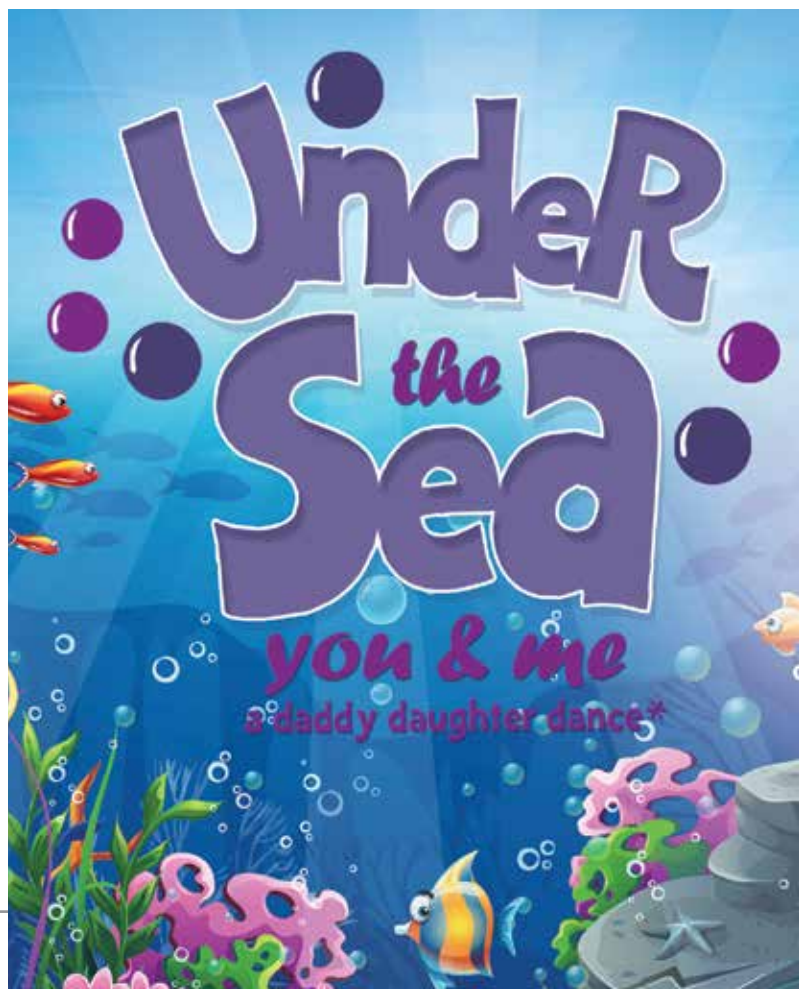

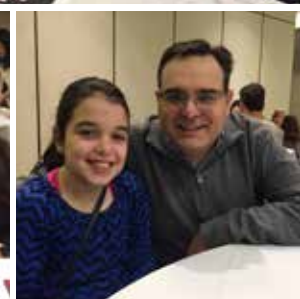

A Seder in Every Home

A Statement by Rabbi Leon Fram

I am writing to urge every member of Temple Israel to have a Seder at home on the first night of Passover, Wednesday night, April 1.

Our Religious School teachers have been preparing your children for their part in the Seder Ceremony, its songs and its games.

Beautiful as the Seder Ceremony is, it is also very simple to arrange.

Let us show you the booklet called, "The Union Haggadah," which describes the arrangements for a modern Seder. You may come up to your Temple Israel office any weekday during office hours, to read it there, or to purchase it. You may also see copies at our office in the Religious School at Hampton Public School on Saturday and Sunday mornings.

The Union Haggadah, written in a clear English translation from the original Hebrew, and richly illustrated, is available at fifty cents per copy. For a successful Seder you should have at least one book for every two persons at the table.

Miss Anna Oxenhandler will be glad to give advice on the arrangements for a modern Seder to any member who telephones or calls at the office.

In the event that you are a guest at someone else's home on April 1, we suggest that you observe Seder in your own home on the second night of Passover, Thursday night, April 2.

Let no child in Temple Israel miss the delight of the Seder.

Temple Israel Sisterhood investigated the possibilities for a Congregational Seder and came to the conclusion that this year the project was faced with too many difficulties. However, the idea of a Congregational Seder remains on the Sisterhood program, to be carried out on the very first Passover of a more nearly normal world.

A special reason why you should have a Seder is that it may give you the opportunity to offer Seder hospitality to one or more Jewish men in the service of our country, who, unable to get a furlough for Passover at home, be made happy by a Seder at your home. Members of the Sisterhood will be telephoned about Seder Hospitality for our soldiers. Be prepared for the opportunity to serve.

The Seder is a feast in celebration of the first Victory for Freedom in human history—the emancipation of Israel from the bondage of Egypt.

Let us all celebrate it now to gain strength to achieve Victory in Freedom's Battle today.
