

WHY BOTHER?

I have spent quite a bit of time this summer reading posts on a Jewish Moms Facebook group. I usually am a silent observer, but a few weeks ago there was a question posed that sparked my interest. A mother wondered at what age other moms were beginning to send their children to Religious School. I promptly replied that we welcome and encourage students to begin their Jewish education as early as possible. I let this mom, and others, know that we have fantastic parent/child programs through our Early Childhood Center for babies as young as 8 months, and incredible drop-off programs when toddlers are 20 months. We have Sunday school classes for students beginning when they are 4. It is never too early to start Jewish learning! Many other moms chimed in, sharing their own opinions and stories about

when they began enrolling their children in Religious School. I was a little disappointed that so many parents opted to begin Religious School when their children were 9 or 10, citing the busyness of life, and the many other extracurriculars their children were engaged with that took priority over Religious School.

In the midst of this conversation, I came across an excellent, and timely, article, written by a colleague of mine in California. Like me, Rabbi Nicki Greninger is a Rabbi-Educator. And like me, she regularly encounters questions about Jewish education, and the value of Religious School. So, in response to all of these inquiries, she wrote, "Why Bother? A Religious School Manifesto." Why is it so important that we provide a Jewish education to our children? Rabbi Greninger reminded us in her manifesto that being Jewish connects us to a chain of tradition thousands and thousands of years old. In order to continue that link, it is necessary to teach our children the Jewish values, rituals, laws, stories and traditions that ground us and guide us. While parent involvement is critical, and we certainly cannot successfully teach your children without your help, most parents cannot do it alone. We are your partners in linking your children to Judaism of the past and of the future. Being Jewish means being a part of a community. We are a people. The Jewish people. We pray together. We support one another. And we learn from and with each other.

Religious school today is not what it was a generation ago. We strive to provide family-based and experiential learning. We endeavor to teach our children to be a part of our community, to take pride in being a part of the Jewish people. We put a greater emphasis on relationships and community building. This year as we continue to develop alternative programming—midweek Hebrew offerings at West Hills and Seaholm, and a midweek K-6 grade Religious School at Burton Elementary School in Huntington Woods—we are making Jewish learning easily accessible by coming to you. As we partner with ShalomLearning and Jewish Interactive we are making Jewish learning innovative by incorporating new technology. And as we plan multiple family programs each month, we are making Jewish learning a family affair. This is truly not your parents' Religious School.

So why bother? To join our chain of tradition. To know who you are, and what you believe in. To be a part of a community. To find greater meaning in your life. And to learn how to make Judaism relevant in your life. And when should you bother? As soon as possible! Religious School begins September 10, 2017!

HIGH HOLY DAYS

GET INVOLVED

High Holy Days will be here before you know it! We invite you to participate in our services this year. Opportunities include:

Chanting or Reading from the Torah: You must be able to read Hebrew and be willing to work in preparation for services. You will receive a recording of your portion and will work with Carolyn lwrey, our Service Coordinator, to assist you. You do not need to have a professional voice, just a desire to learn how to chant.

Chanting Torah and Haftarah Blessings: The Torah Blessings are the same as the blessings you hear on Shabbat. The Haftarah Blessings, although similar to the Shabbat Blessings, are slightly different. You will receive a recording with the Blessings and will work with our Service Coordinator.

Hebrew Reading: This reading is very short and does not involve chanting. You will receive a CD with the reading and should be able to learn this on your own. However, Carolyn Iwrey will be available to assist you.

English Reading: This reading will either be the English version of the Haftarah or an English prayer. You will receive a hard copy of your portion via the mail two or more weeks prior to the High Holiday.

Torah Carrier: You will be given the honor of carrying the Torah during High Holiday Services. There is no speaking involved.

We hope you will consider joining us in our outreach to include new faces on the Bimah, whether you have been a member of Temple for one year or many years. IT'S TIME TO START THINKING ABOUT THE HIGH HOLY DAYS

Which Service Is Right For Your Family?

<u>Adult Services</u> are for adults and young adults who have attained Bar/Bat Mitzvah age.

<u>Family Services</u> are recommended for children who are 8 years old and above (or reading age) along with their parents and grandparents who are Temple Israel members. There will be a "Family Friendly" service for members eight and older on Kol Nidre. The service will be 7:15 - 8 pm in Korman Hall. This will be the ONLY Family Service on Kol Nidre.

<u>Children's Services</u> are geared to non-readers and their families and are recommended for children 8 years and under, along with parents and grandparents.

Yizkor (Memorial) and Neilah (Concluding) Services

Our integrated Yizkor/Neilah Service will begin at 5:15 pm and conclude at 6:15 pm. Please do not bring a prayer book as one will be provided. An important aspect of the Yizkor service will be our Memorial Booklet. The names of those who have passed away on or since last Yom Kippur will be listed. Please note that these names will not be read aloud. It is important that we have the correct names. If you have a loved one whose name should be listed in this Memorial Booklet we urge you to contact Donna Bolda-Moss at 248-661-5700 or in advance of Rosh Hashanah to confirm the spelling of the name.

HIGH HOLY DAY TICKETS

How do I request my High Holy Day Tickets? By now you should have received your High Holy Day ticket request information. Online registration is now available on our website at Temple-Israel.org/hhd2017member. Services are processed on a first come first served basis. A ticket request must be received to process your High Holy Days service selection.

High Holy Day Guest Passes

Guest passes for visiting <u>out-of-town</u> family only will be available on request if seats are available. ALL families who wish to bring out-of-town guests to a High Holy Day service MUST complete and submit a Guest Request Form. Forms are mailed with your High Holy Days ticket information or feel free to complete the form online at Temple-Israel.org/hhd2017guest. Guest pass selections will be distributed on a first requested basis.

Requests for guest passes may necessitate your entire family being changed to a more available service.

Tickets will only be mailed to those requesting them. Requests must be completed by each family. Tickets will be mailed in the beginning of September.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

When will my High Holy Days tickets arrive? Watch your mailbox near the beginning of September for your tickets.




How do I attend the Yom Kippur Study Sessions? Complete the Study Session Form that will arrive with your High Holy Days tickets.

HHD2017Reciprocity if you will be out of town for the holidays and would like us to arrange for courtesy seating at another Reform temple. We will make every effort to secure reciprocity for Temple Israel members. To get a list of reform congregations in the appropriate location visit congregations.urj.org. Coordinating reciprocity is never easy at the last moment, so please contact us as soon as possible if you need courtesy seating.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Family Admittance Cards: Please come to Temple Israel together as a family on the High Holy Days and display your family admittance cards to our ushers as you enter. At age 26, young people need to sign up for their own, independent membership and tickets. Please call Temple for details on our special, young adult membership plan or visit our Temple Israel website for details.

All day on Yom Kippur, including special afternoon "Mincha Moments" Service: Spiritually moving and intellectually stimulating study sessions will lead directly into our beautiful Yom Kippur Afternoon Service. Afternoon Mincha Moments services begin at 3:30 pm.

Separate Cars: We hope that your family will all arrive at Temple in one car. Parking is difficult for all synagogues during the High Holy Days. However, if you must drive separately we suggest that you simply arrange to meet at the doors and walk in together.

Tallit: We encourage you to wear your tallit at the Kol Nidre evening service and at any morning service.

Prayer Books: Each member of your family should have a copy of The Gates of Repentance, which can be purchased at Temple during weekday office hours. On Wednesday, September 20 and Friday, September 29 the office will close at noon. The office will also be closed on the High Holy Days.

Handicapped Stickers: Please display any handicapped stickers so our parking lot attendants can see them clearly.

Live Streaming Services: If you cannot be here in person for High Holy Days services, we will bring the services to you! We offer Live Streaming on our website, see page 3 for details.

Alternating Sermons: When you come to our services on Erev Rosh Hashanah, you will take a seat in either the Sanctuary or Herman Hall. The next day, on Rosh Hashanah, those who were in the Sanctuary will worship in Herman Hall, and vice versa. This will allow you to worship with all our clergy and to hear each of the sermons. Anyone who goes to the same room in the evening and during the day will hear the same sermon twice. The same is true for Yom Kippur.
