DIGITAL WORSHIP - PRAYER IN THE 21ST CENTURY

When Moses went up to the top of Mt. Sinai, I am certain the "tablet" he received was NOT an iPad or Surface Pro. While the commandments were carved into stone, this was the beginning of a shift that would forever change how we communicate with God and with each other. The words on those tablets reached us because of meticulous care for the chain of transmission. Because of that day Moses's analog conversation with God made its way through rabbinic tradition, and has finally arrived in the digital age. Consider the awesome nature of this process as understood by the sages of Jewish tradition. In the Mishnah, we read: "Moses received the Torah from Sinai and transmitted it Joshua. Joshua transmitted it to the Elders, the Elders to the Prophets, and the Prophets transmitted it to the Men of the Great Assembly." First it

was stone. Then it was parchment. Then paper. Then screens. This was the start of a 5000-year tradition being handed to us in the 21st century, and the content has remained faithfully the same.

While Temple Israel has been forward thinking in every area of Jewish life, Judaism as a whole lags behind in this transition to the digital age. Jewish prayer has been virtually unchanged for 2000 years. Even with our amazing musical programming on Friday nights and the first ever fully digital prayerbook at Shabbat Unplugged we are behind the digital curve. Until now!!!

Thanks to the incredible generosity of Shari & Stanley Finsilver and Frances & Kenneth Eisenberg, we have changed the physical and spiritual spaces of Temple to match a modern age. As a part of this renovation, with the support of the Gilbert Family Innovation Fund, we have now also arrived technologically. Our upgraded lighting and sound systems allow participants in the Sanctuary & Herman Hall to fully engage in the music and prayer of life cycle events and services. And our new LED Screens bring us closer than ever to the digital era of Judaism. Finally, our Jewish lives can match the secular world in which we live.

We are excited about the power of this technology to connect people to the same story that Moses did when he experienced God at Mt. Sinai. That moment, in thunder and lightning, was a powerful shift in our relationship with the divine. The same can be said of the experience of our renovated Sanctuary. Imagine a Bat Mitzvah celebrant delivering her D'var Torah along with video footage of her mitzvah project. Consider the emotional impact of baby pictures of a bride & groom as they are blessed on the bimah. Or visualize how a live stream to one of our clergy at the Western Wall might enhance the healing power of the mi shebeirach. The possibilities are endless. We are used to watching videos, using digital images, and connecting with technology at work, home, and in school. Why should our Jewish spiritual experiences be any different?

Now, of course, comes the hard part. The 10 Commandments were easy to receive...but harder to implement. The same will be true of our new digital imprint on worship. In order to accomplish our goal of enhancing prayer, we are seeking the help of members of this congregation who want to be a part of this technological evolution. If you have experience in the areas of Television, Radio, Visual Production (producing, camera work, or editing), or computers and would like to be a part of our new Digital Worship committee, we want you. 

AMAZING SPACES, GENEROUS FAMILIES

As congregants entered Temple Israel on Friday, September 1, for the Building Dedication, they were greeted by Clergy proudly introducing them to the freshly renovated space. The dark wood and brick traded out for stylish pillars wrapped in polished stone. The pillars draw your eye to the open ceiling, once enclosed, now exposed and illuminating the Atrium in natural light. As the service opened and progressed, one clergy member observed that the first inside service following Shabbat in the Sun is sometimes melancholy, signifying the end of summer. However, this year, there was great anticipation and excitement in bringing Shabbat inside and celebrating in this beautiful space.

When the service and dedication concluded, members were invited to Herman Hall, which also received a full renovation. Updated with modern and sophisticated touches with obvious attention to detail, Herman Hall hosted an enhanced Oneg, creatively displayed by Temple's in house caterer, The Epicurean Group.

Many hands shaped the Sanctuary, Atrium and Herman Hall. Temple offers their thanks to the internal team, the skilled craftsman and the designers who worked so diligently to create a new experience for congregants. However, none of the work would have been possible without the generosity and foresight of Frances and Kenneth Eisenberg and Shari and Stanley Finsilver.

The Eisenbergs' family roots run deep at Temple Israel. They married at Manderson and have celebrated several additional life cycle events at the current location.
