VI-BING THE DIVINE



"The thing we tell of can never be found by seeking, but only seekers will find it. Just the act of searching is sometimes the end in itself." Emmylou Harris.

Do you remember the first time you listened to a great song?

I remember having the overpowering feeling of being touched by something profound and ethereal. Great popular songs inspire soul searching when songwriters and performers reach out and tread a path beyond the trite rhyming schemes and crass materialism that tends to characterize the bulk of popular culture. Great songwriters habitually explore deep questions about who we are and what we should live for. Their songs act as a springboard – often reflecting and fueling the dreams of the listener's deeply personal spiritual longings.

The spirituality we most often encounter in pop music is more subtle and complex than the ritualistic singing of hymns or the grandeur and sacredness felt when hearing Mozart's Requiem or Lewandowski's Mah Tovv. Popular music's spirituality conjures up unique, highly-personal reflection whereas "liturgical music" is generally a communal experience and evokes emotions in a collective and shared way. The spirituality I'm referring to in pop music covers a wide spectrum, from the message to "love one another" to more focused specifics that point out injustice, inequality, and personal transformation or redemption.

These songs have found their way into our sacred moments over the generations. The bible-based American Negro spiritual "Go Down Moses", for example, has long accompanied our retelling of the Exodus story around the Seder table. In more recent years, the Pete Seeger folk ballad, "Turn, Turn, Turn - To Everything There Is A Season" which was later made famous by The Byrds, uses words taken directly from the Book of Ecclesiastes that we read during the holiday of Sukkot, and has become a yearly standard in worship services at temples all over the country.

The Jewish summer camp experience was a liminal space that with the onset of the civil rights movement, helped address issues of identity, and explored what constituted the connection between Jews and African Americans in the struggle for justice. Songs like, "Times They Are A Changin'", "Get Together", and "Blowin' In The Wind" became sacred even in their first unveiling to the public, and inspired great Jewish songwriters like Debbie Friedman and Jeff Klepper to find their musical muses.

The song "Turn the World Around" made famous by Harry Belafonte in an album by the same name, has bridged the gap between the sacred and the secular and found its way onto our bimah on several occasions. When its powerful message that we and all of creation share a Divine spark is delivered mightily by our children's choir, we are left with little doubt as to its true and rightful place in a house of worship.

It is this song and other similar gems that has brought together our illustrious artists, BDN&N, for this year's Laker Concert. Josh Nelson and Dan Nichols are no strangers to Temple Israel and our concert series, just as their familiar music has infused and enriched our Shabbat services and the greater Reform community for decades. Simply put, their songwriting and artistry are a vital link in the great tradition of contemporary Jewish music making that was started by Debbie Friedman so many years ago. Cantors Rosalie Boxt and Ellen Dreskin also sit at the helm of Reform Jewish Music. As master Cantors, professors, and scholars at HUC-JIR's Debbie Friedman School of Sacred Music they have and continue to help shape generations of Cantors in seminary and beyond by providing them with, in the words of Liam Neeson, "a particular set of skills" for the professional Jewish music world that lies ahead. I am proud to count myself among their many students.

The kicker of it all is that Boxt, Dreskin, Nelson, and Nichols are the best of friends. So, when this gifted foursome came together, their love and admiration of music and each other spawned a recording project called, "So Is Life" to benefit a charity named in memory of Ellen Dreskin's late son, Jonah – the Jonah Maccabee Foundation. The recording is a refreshing and uplifting compilation of "sacred secular songs" that have at varying moments played an important spiritual role in their lives. Songs like Billy Joel's "And So It Goes", Carrie Newcomer's "If Not Now", and Nichols inspired spin on Belafonte's "Turn the World Around" are featured, as well as many other exciting surprises.

Each one of these amazing people and beautiful artists would be reason enough to come to this year's Laker Concert which is free and open to the public, but the four of them together truly does add up to an experience that will transcend the mundane, inspire hope, and shed new light on the important spiritual role of secular songs in our world and their ability to resonate deeply within each of us.



JOSH NELSON

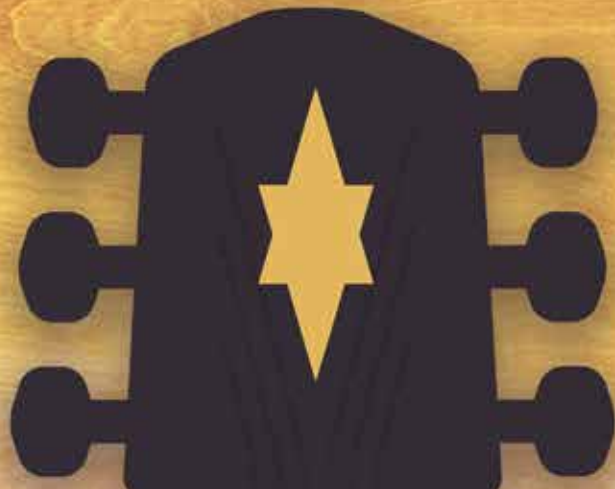
