



Rimonim Menorah by: Gidon Chai

This menorah is made of copper, silver, and brass. Artist, Gidon Chai, has more than fifty years of experience in silversmithing using traditional techniques – cutting, sawing, and hammering. Since 1963 he has done so in his studio at the Artists' Colony of Jerusalem. Gidon's goblets were given as gifts to the King of Jordan and the King of Saudi Arabia on behalf of the director of the ADL. A special Menorah of Chai's was awarded as a Peace Prize on behalf of "Hadassah" to Yitzhak Rabin and Shimon Peres.

Is anger a natural emotion? Should one vent anger to release it? Does G-d really get angry? Is there a 'Jewish psychology'?

For the past 32 years Rabbi Laibl Wolf has been a spiritual mentor and a worldwide teacher of the mystical side of Judaism, known as kabbalah. He has lectured in over 350 cities across the globe, and is a sought after speaker, conducting retreats, seminars, master classes and training programs continually throughout the world.

Addressing groups as divergent as the American Psychological Association, the Fortune 500 convention, and Buddhist monks, he is often the keynote speaker at worldwide conferences such as the recent "Argentinean Economy and Psycho/Spiritual Solutions" in Argentina.
