## AN ATTITUDE OF GRATITUDE

Have you ever heard the one about the fellow who is looking for a parking space in a crowded lot? He offers up a prayer to God: "God, if only you could help me find a parking spot, I'll pray every day, I'll light the candles, I'll even go to temple...." Suddenly a spot opens up right in front of him, and he cries out: "Oh never mind God, here's one!"

While the joke always gets a chuckle, it has a serious side—reminding us to be grateful for the good things that happen in our lives. Whether or not you attribute them to God—that's for another article—but the awareness of

the good, appreciation for what we have, that is serious business. In Judaism, we are commanded to say blessings—over practically everything—from the most ordinary, day-to-day activities, like eating or washing hands, to the most extraordinary ones—like seeing a rainbow or hearing thunder (which depending on the season might either be ordinary or extraordinary). It's hard to say blessings consciously every day, but I believe that reciting a blessing does three things:

- 1. Transforms ordinary behaviors into something special—a rabbi might call it sacred
- 2. Creates appreciation for daily miracles
- 3. Helps us turn our attitude toward the positive.

While I've never recited a blessing over a parking spot, it sure feels miraculous when I find one, and even that small recognition, changes my overall attitude; and attitude is everything. I think of the wedding guest who sits at the dinner table saying, "This chicken sure is dry," versus the one who says, "Isn't it nice to be celebrating with such a beautiful couple?" If we can find the good in every situation, if we can articulate our gratitude each day by just saying thank you to the kind stranger for opening the door, to the clerk who greets you with a smile, to the driver who lets you in when you're merging into traffic, it makes all the difference. Moreover, saying blessings, along with an appreciative mindset, requires us to be aware of our surroundings rather than walking through life blindly, as they literally awaken us to what is in front of us, making us aware of the good in our lives.

When you next come to temple, flip to page 162 in our Shema Yisrael prayer book to find one of my favorite sayings from Reb Nachman of Bratslav:

Gratitude rejoices with her sister joy and is always ready to light a candle and have a party.

Gratitude does not much like the old cronies of boredom, despair and taking life for granted.

At this season as we approach the Thanksgiving holiday, let's take the time to count our blessings, to recognize the good of each day and the miracles of our lives. Let's invite Gratitude and Joy to our table, not just on Thanksgiving day, but every day, realizing that when we're appreciative and approach life from a positive outlook, it's a lot more meaningful and let's be honest, it's also a lot more fun.

# J Goodman Family Judaic & Archival M U S E U M at Temple Israel

Temple Israel's Goodman Family Judaic & Archival is pleased to highlight one of the newest additions to our permanent collection.

#### Mi Polin Mezuzot

Our three new mezuzot, made by Anna Morawiec and Pawet Jozwicki, are created from the traces taken by the artists from homes where Jews had formerly lived in Eastern Europe. Each mezuzah reminds us of a family, who when walking in the door of their home, placed a kiss on this sacred object.

The artist has linked together the past and present.

On the side of each mezuzah there is an address engraved.

Poland had 3.5 million Jewish inhabitants before World War II.


In almost all Jewish houses, there was at least one mezuzah.

During the war almost all Jews perished and with them their mezuzot. Only empty holes are left in the doorposts of the Jewish homes. The traces are cast in bronze creating new trace-based mezuzot.
