

IT'S TIME TO START THINKING ABOUT THE HIGH HOLY DAYS

WHICH SERVICE IS RIGHT FOR YOUR FAMILY?

<u>Adult Services</u> are for adults and young adults who have attained Bar/Bat Mitzvah age.

<u>Family Services</u> are recommended for children who are 8 years old and above (or reading age) along with their parents and grandparents who are Temple Israel members. There will be a "Family Friendly" service for members eight and older on Kol Nidre. The service will be 7:15 - 8 pm in Korman Hall. This will be the ONLY Family Service on Kol Nidre.

<u>Children's Services</u> are geared to non-readers and their families and are recommended for children 8 years and under, along with parents and grandparents.

YIZKOR (MEMORIAL) AND NEILAH (CONCLUDING) SERVICES

Our integrated Yizkor/Neilah Service will begin at 5:15 pm and conclude at 6:30 pm. Please do not bring a prayer book as one will be provided. An important aspect of the Yizkor service will be our Memorial Booklet. The names of those who have passed away on or since last Yom Kippur will be listed. Please note that these names will not be read aloud. It is important that we have the correct names. If you have a loved one whose name should be listed in this Memorial Booklet we urge you to contact the Temple office at 248-661-5700 or in advance of Rosh Hashanah to confirm the spelling of the name.

HIGH HOLY DAY GUEST PASSES

Guest passes for visiting out-of-town family only will be available on request if seats are available. ALL families who wish to bring out-of-town guests to a High Holy Day service MUST complete and submit a Guest Request Form. Forms are mailed with your High Holy Days ticket information. Guest pass selections will be distributed on a first requested basis. Requests for guest passes may necessitate your entire family being changed to a more available service.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

HOW DO I REQUEST TICKETS? WHEN WILL I GET MY

FORMS? By now you should have received your forms. Online registration is open. Services are processed on a first come, first served basis. A ticket request must be received to process your High Holy Days service selection.

Online membership account access is needed to request high holy day tickets via the website.

HOW DO I GET A LOGIN/PASSWORD? If you need help logging in, please contact us at info@temple-israel.org.

WHEN WILL MY HIGH HOLY DAYS TICKETS ARRIVE?

Watch your mailbox near the beginning of September for your tickets.

HOW DO WE REGISTER FOR BABYSITTING DURING THE HIGH HOLY DAYS SERVICES? A sitter service for children one year of age and older will be available at all High Holy Day services, except Children's Services, BY ADVANCE REGISTRATION ONLY. Complete the Babysitting Request Form online after you receive your High Holy Days tickets.

HOW IS OUT OF TOWN SEATING REQUESTED?

If you will be out of town for the holidays and would like us to arrange for courtesy seating at another reform temple, please complete the RECIPROCITY REQUEST FORM online (available August 1). We will make every effort to secure reciprocity for Temple Israel members. For a list of reform congregations in your desired location, visit congregations.urj.org. Reciprocity is never easy at the last moment, so please complete the form as early as possible.

ALL DAY ON YOM KIPPUR, INCLUDING SPECIAL AFTERNOON "MINCHA MOMENTS" SERVICE

Spiritually moving and intellectually stimulating study sessions will lead directly into our beautiful Yom Kippur Afternoon Service. Afternoon Mincha Moments services begin at 3:45 pm.



ALTERNATING SERMONS

When you come to our services on Kol Nidre, you will take a seat in either the Sanctuary or Herman Hall. The next day, those who were in the Sanctuary will worship in Herman Hall, and vice versa. This will allow you to worship with all our clergy and to hear each of the sermons.

GET INVOLVED

High Holy Days will be here before you know it! We invite you to participate in our services this year. Opportunities include:

CHANTING OR READING FROM THE TORAH: You must be able to read Hebrew and able to work throughout the summer in preparation for services. You will receive a recording of your portion and will work with Carolyn Iwrey, our Service Coordinator.

CHANTING TORAH AND HAFTARAH BLESSINGS: The Torah Blessings are the same as the blessings you hear on Shabbat. The Haftarah Blessings, although similar to the Shabbat Blessings, are slightly different.

HEBREW READING: This reading is very short and does not involve chanting. You will receive a recording with the reading and should be able to learn this on your own.

ENGLISH READING: This reading will either be the English version of the Haftarah or an English prayer. You will receive a hard copy of your portion two or more weeks prior.

TORAH CARRIER: You will be given the honor of carrying the Torah during High Holiday Services. There is no speaking involved.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

FAMILY ADMITTANCE CARDS: Please come to Temple Israel together as a family on the High Holy Days and display your family admittance cards to our ushers as you enter. At age 26, young people need to sign up for their own, independent membership and tickets. Please call Temple for details on our special, young adult membership plan or visit our Temple Israel website for details. Please note, all out of town quests will be included on your family admittance card.

SEPARATE CARS: We hope that your family will all arrive at Temple in one car. Parking is difficult for all synagogues during the High Holy Days. However, if you must drive separately we suggest that you simply arrange to meet at the doors and walk in together. Please keep in mind that Out of Town Guest Passes will be included on your Member High Holy Day Ticket.

TALLIT: We encourage you to wear your tallit at the Kol Nidre evening service and at any morning service.

HANDICAPPED STICKERS: Please display any handicapped stickers so our parking lot attendants can see them clearly.

LIVE STREAMING SERVICES: If you cannot be here in person for High Holy Days services, we will bring the services to you! We offer Live Streaming on our website.



SUSAN & HANLEY YORKE FAMILY FUND

REPURPOSED FUND:

Provides challahs for all Temple sponsored Friday night Shabbat dinners

Susan Yorke, Temple Israel Past President, remembers her childhood Shabbat dinners fondly. Lighting the candles with her mother provided a warm security blanket. The challah on their table represented the sweet circle of life, and the togetherness strengthened her family. She now carries on that tradition with her daughter and granddaughters.

It was this beautiful ritual that prompted Susan to change her fund's purpose, originally created for social action, to provide challahs for Temple Israel Shabbat dinners. While she is proud that her original fund helped bring people together for important causes over many years, she is equally happy that her fund's new purpose will hold such a prominent place on the Shabbat dinner tables at Temple.

As Rabbi Jennifer Kaluzny often explains, "Bread is the foundation of every meal - so much so, that if bread isn't served, it really isn't even considered a meal!" Susan agrees and is looking forward to having her repurposed fund provide this enriching foundation for Temple's family members. Like the braids in the bread, each loaf of challah will provide those at the Shabbat table a warm and loving hug from their Temple family. And she feels her husband, Hanley z^n , would be equally connected to the new purpose, knowing that this breaking of bread will strengthen, not only individual families, but also our entire Temple Israel community and its mission.

JOSEPH & BESSIE LEBOWSKY NURSERY SCHOOL FUND

Provides toys, equipment and supplies used by the Early Childhood Center

After the passing of Joseph and Bessie Lebowsky, Helen Linden, Lina Small, Sylvia Lee and Bernice Arnkoff wanted to honor their parents in a meaningful way. Because Bessie and Joseph were founding members of Temple Israel, and Helen's daughter, Bryna Leib, was the founding Director of Temple's Early Childhood Center, creating a fund to support the ECC felt like the perfect way to honor their loved ones' memories.

For many years before she retired in 2015, Bryna was able to experience firsthand the impact this fund has on the children and the ECC staff. "What's wonderful about this fund is that it is not used for a specific program," Bryna explained. "We were able to determine the specific needs of the school each year and purchase items and plan programs that would not have been possible within the allotted ECC budget."

The fund has supported the purchase of iPads and subsidized important professional development for the ECC staff through classes and seminars. It's had a powerful impact on the school, keeping the ECC on the cutting edge of premier technology and educational opportunity.

Current director Julie Levy is very grateful for the fund and especially appreciates its flexibility. "It's nice to know we have funds available to support us with special programs and projects that will enhance our students' educational experience," Julie said.

Bryna and her family are thankful that Joseph and Bessie's legacy lives on year after year through this remarkable fund – and that generations of children continue to benefit.
