# Mew Year Clean Slate...



As you receive this month's Messenger, we are deep into the High Holy Days. We have just celebrated Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur is only a few days away. And even though it is the holy day season, during these 10 days, it is easy to fall back into our daily routine and forget about the fact that these in-between days are special days too. They are called the *aseret yamei teshuva*—the 10 days of Repentance, and while they are not holidays, per se, there is a purpose to this period. Tradition teaches that the Gates of Heaven are open now, bringing us even closer to God than in normal times. As Maimonides explains, "Even though repentance and prayer are desirable at all times, during the days between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, they are even more

desirable and will be accepted immediately." Therefore, we dedicate this time to repairing ourselves and our relationships. It is about wiping the slate clean in order to begin again. Take this time to heal relationships with family and friends. Go to them. Acknowledge the wrongs you have done. Make amends. And most of all, commit to not doing them again. That is the essence of *teshuva*—which we generally translate as repentance, but literally means return. In making atonement, we return to our essential selves, we return to wholeness, we return to God, Judaism, tradition. It is never too late to fix those things which we have broken—with ourselves, our relationships and of course, with God. In fact, that is the point of this season, and particularly Yom Kippur—as we open ourselves up entirely, allowing ourselves to be vulnerable, recognizing who we are and preparing to start again.

And then we do an absolute 180° turnabout, for break fast doesn't end the season. If fact, we're just getting started. Five days later, it's time for Sukkot, followed by Shemini Atzeret, Yizkor and Simchat Torah. There is a lot to celebrate. Sukkot is called z'man simchateinu—the season of our joy. It is a time to rejoice and delight in our Judaism. I love the fact that the first thing we do after Yom Kippur, after the intensity and solemnity of atonement, is have a party! Check out the pages of the Messenger (pgs. 4-5) for everything that is going on this month—there is literally something for everyone from Sukkah Decorating, Birkat Yeladim, and a Food Truck Rally (pg. 14); to Yizkor services and Simchat Torah.

In the meantime, in case you are concerned that you didn't get enough time for making *teshuva* during this holiday season, no worries. Some say the Gates of Repentance are actually open all the way through Simchat Torah. (And if that's still not enough time, others say, they are open until Chanukah!).

Wishing you all a happy and sweet new year.
