VOTE FOR ME AND I'LL SET YOU FREE!

Rabbi Hornsten and I are both honored to have been chosen as candidates for the World Zionist Congress and we want you to vote for us!

As the WZO website explains: "The First Zionist Congress was convened by Theodor Herzl in 1897 in Basel Switzerland, with the participation of some 200 delegates representing 17 countries. Together, the delegates to the first Zionist Congress established the World Zionist Organization and endorsed the Basel Program which called for Zionism to establish a home for the Jewish people to be secured under public law with international recognition in what was then the Ottoman-ruled territory

of Palestine. It was immediately after this Congress that Herzl wrote in his diary, 'In Basel I founded the Jewish State. If I were to say this out loud today, I would be met with universal laughter. But in five years perhaps, certainly in fifty, the whole world will know it.'

The work of the World Zionist Organization and the institutions it founded came to fruition on the 29th of November 1947, when the U.N. General Assembly adopted Resolution 181(II) calling for a partition of the British Mandate into two states, one Jewish and one Arab. Having gained recognition for a Jewish state under public law, Chairman of the Jewish Agency David Ben Gurion announced the creation of the State of Israel on May 14, 1948 and became Israel's first Prime Minister."

So, as you can see, this is a big deal indeed! In January, you will be receiving a WZC ballot in your email inbox. By paying the small voter fee and voting for ARZA you will be sending Rabbi Hornsten and me to represent you, thereby increasing the power of the Reform Movement in the World Zionist Congress which will take place in Jerusalem.

Why is it so important that you vote for us? Well, as you know, we at Temple Israel are ardent Zionists, but we are dismayed by the fact that Reform Jews are sometimes treated as second class citizens in our shared Promised Land, and that women are forced literally, on some routes, to sit in the back of the bus. By voting for us, you will be sending your own rabbis to help make these crucial decisions and to oversee how your communal dollars are spent in Eretz Yisrael.

Now, all we need is a campaign slogan. I first came up with "Vote for Yedwab; he's no slob," but Rabbi Hornsten vetoed that one. She did like "There's no I in Hornsten." But I think we will go with:

"Vote for us, and we will be driving the Zionism bus!"

Lynn Rubin has always been exceptionally active in the community, volunteering for Hadassah, ORT, Sisterhood, Jewish Federation and many more organizations in the area. A few years after their dear son passed away, Sylvia and Michael Gotlib wanted to create a fund that would give tangible assistance to people in need. In an effort to make a powerful difference where it was needed the most, the Gotlibs created the Steven Gotlib Memorial Fund to support Temple Israel's Housing the Homeless program.

For over 20 years, Temple has welcomed men, women and children from the South Oakland Shelter for a week in the winter, providing secure housing, nourishing meals, winter essentials and personal care items. This year, Temple is planning another warm, safe week for approximately 30 men, women and children, delivering the kind of assistance the Gotlibs hoped to help provide in memory of their son.

During this week, Temple also offers games, activities, entertainment and art projects for the guests. In addition, professional services from dentists, physicians, nurses, hairdressers and manicurists will be provided. More than 150 volunteers help make the week a caring and comforting experience for the guests.
