A LETTER FROM RABBI MARLA HORNSTEN



READ. WATCH. DO.

This summer was the final straw.

George Floyd's murder sparked the protests still on-going in cities around the country now three months later. I was born in 1969—at the tail end of the '60s during the last round of civil unrest and civil rights protests in our country, but for most of my life, the political scene has been fairly quiet. That's not to say that there haven't been protests—I've

participated in many of them—but not like the '60s and not like today.

I serve as the co-chair for the Coalition for Black and Jewish Unity together with Reverend Deedee Coleman from Russell Street Baptist Church in Detroit. In these last months, I've tried to learn about what it means to be Black in America. I've engaged in dialogue, in listening sessions, in trainings. One of my favorites was through the Coalition entitled: "Dear White People, Please Listen" (you can find it on the Coalition Facebook page). I have learned that I must watch the news. I must read. I must listen. I must learn. I must act.

On the one hand, it is incredible how much material there is out there including books, podcasts, movies, and articles. There are lists, upon lists of sources to dig into, to learn about the structural racism in this country; and inspiring texts on how to commit ourselves to antiracist work. I'm so grateful for all these resources. And on the other hand, there is so much material that it is overwhelming: The top 100 books, the top 1000 articles (I'm exaggerating).

In these months, a small group of temple members have gathered over Zoom to begin a conversation about race. The overwhelm of all of these resources has been a common thread among us: Where to start? What conversations should we be having? What can we do to make a difference?

And so, our self-declared, anti-racism task force conceived of Read. Watch. Do.

Starting today, we will post on our Temple social media, one book or article to read, one movie to watch or one podcast to listen to (the verbs might change from post to post), along with an action step: the "Do." And while we will provide several sources, feel free to work at your own pace: engage in one or all—however works best for you. Our goal is to post on the 1st of the month. Each of our suggestions has been recommended by members of this task force—that means we have read the book or listened to the podcast or watched the movie, and that member will moderate the conversation. These aren't random lists that we have taken off the internet. They are meaningful to us and therefore, we hope, to you.

With Read. Watch. Do., our goal is make the task achievable, and in so doing, to encourage healthy discussion via our social media platforms, to foster constructive dialogue with members of our task force; to support our temple members on their individual journeys and to inspire action. We hope to make a small difference in our community, and ultimately, we hope to change our society, and perhaps our world. For Rabbi Tarfon taught in the Pirke Avot: it is not your task to complete the work, but neither are you free to desist from it. There is much to be done, and I hope you will join us!
