Congressional Candidates Visit CBY For Pre-Election Forum on Key Issues

For two brief hours this past Sunday morning, the political rancor stopped as the candidates for the U.S. House of Representatives for our (Fifth) district visited Bnai Yeshurun to present their credentials and views to our membership. In two separate one-hour sessions, the candidates, challenger Republican John McCann and incumbent Democrat Josh Gottheimer, responded to a broad range of questions posed by Rabbi Pruzansky about some of the more controversial issues that we currently face- taxes, immigration, excessive partisanship and, of course, support for the state of Israel.

Both candidates expressed general support for the recent tax reduction bill, though Gottheimer did not vote for it because of his opposition to its SALT (limitations on deductions for state and local taxes) provisions. He indicated that he is actively working to legislate "work arounds" to reduce the impact of SALT on New Jersey residents. McCann, on the other hand, largely dismissed the "moocher state" argument that claims that some states, including New Jersey, bear an unfair burden of federal taxes.

The Rabbi challenged Gottheimer, asking why states that have more should not have to help the poorer states. The candidate responded that it was his job to fight for the interests of his constituents.

He explained that affordability has become a problem for many to live in New Jersey. We have lost funds for infrastructure and Head Start. Businesses are not moving to New Jersey.

The candidates gave examples of their successes in working in a bi-partisan manner to achieve significant results. McCann pointed to his leadership in consolidating the operations of the Bergen County Sheriff's Office with the County Police Department, overcoming initial resistance from both political parties. Gottheimer described his work as co-chair of a bi-partisan caucus in the House that has achieved consensus and made some progress on issues including stabilizing the health care market, immigration reform, gun control, prison reform and avoiding a government shutdown.

He recognized that to have a more significant impact, his group would have to enlist the participation of more congressmen (which he is trying to do). "We need to govern again," he added, "not just scream at each other."

Questioning McCann's desire to run for federal office, the Rabbi asked, "If Democrats win the House, they are liable to pursue a scorched earth policy against their enemies. If they lose the House, the left will be even more violent and unhinged; why do you want to be part of that toxic environment?" McCann replied that his argument was with "the American left," not with Gottheimer. "Voting for either one of us, is good for New Jersey," he said. But McCann believes he has a better approach to addressing the issues that challenge us than does his opponent. McCann listed as his two highest priorities a) the fight for liberty and freedom and b) fixing healthcare and improving the doctor-patient relationship.

Both candidates supported the Trump administration's move of the U.S. embassy to Jerusalem. In discussing the Middle East, the Rabbi asked McCann, "How do you feel about the two-state illusion?" McCann explained that he had formulated and taught a course on Zionism as a successful movement and, with respect to current Arab-Israeli negotiations, he said, "As long as there is one side that is not standing down," disruption will continue.

McCann indicated that he had not asked President Trump to campaign for him and did not always agree with the tone of the President but, in response to the Rabbi's continued questions, he did not identify any Trump policies with which he disagreed.

Questioned about his position on the cancellation of the Iran deal, Gottheimer supported the President's cancellation. Gottheimer explained that his biggest objection to the agreement was that it did not adequately address Iran's funding of terrorist activity. Iranian funding of terrorism has increased, he claimed, and we need to impose very tight economic sanctions.

Challenging Gottheimer on the Democratic Party's lack of support for Israel, the Rabbi said, "Israel is no longer a bi-partisan issue" and then proceeded to list a number of Democrats with anti-Israel views. Gottheimer responded by saying that "the rhetoric on the far left of the Democratic party is based on ignorance." "They don't understand that support of Israel is in America's interest."

Gottheimer said that he feels his job is to educate new members of Congress about Israel and the threats from its neighbors

"Would you vote to impeach Trump?" the Rabbi asked Gottheimer. He responded that he first wanted to see the outcome of the Mueller probe. He added that if there are no serious charges against the President, we have work to do and we should not be disruptive for political reasons.

The Rabbi challenged both candidates, asking "How would you handle the caravan of immigrants coming from Guatemala and Mexico?" There are many, many oppressed people in the world, explained the Rabbi, but what is our responsibility? McCann responded, "We need strong borders. If you do not have a border, you do not have a country." Gottheimer, similarly advocated for strong borders- whatever it takes- repairing walls, increased aerial surveillance, whatever it takes. We need a good process to analyze each immigration applicant. "This should not be a political football."

An informal, unscientific "exit poll" of attendees found that most thought the congressional candidate forum was "very worthwhile," "helpful" and "informative." Please remember: Election Day is Tuesday, November 6th.

Measles: What to Know

If you believe you have or have been exposed to measles, call your doctor

immediately.

Measles spreads through the air by breathing, coughing or sneezing. People infected with measles are infectious four days before a rash appears and continue to be infectious four days after the rash appears. It is highly contagious to anyone who is not immune to Measles is a respiratory disease (in the lungs and breathing tubes) caused by the measles virus.

Signs and Symptoms

- Fever often as high as 104 to 105 degrees Cough
- Stuffy or Runny Nose
- Conjunctivitis (Pink Eye) Rash breaks out 3-5 days after symptoms begin

Complications

While measles can be a serious in all age groups, children younger than 5 and adults older than 20 are more likely to suffer from measles complications which can include:

- Ear infections
- Pneumonia
- Swelling of the brain
- Miscarriage, pre-mature birth, or a low-birth-weight baby can result in a measles infection among pregnant women

Prevention

Measles can be prevented with a vaccine. The measles vaccine is given with the vaccines for mumps and rubella (MMR) and is given in two doses (one shot at 12 months and a second shot at 4 to 6

You can also get the MMRV vaccine (MMR plus varicella or chickenpox). MMRV is only approved for children between the ages of 12 months through 12 years. Ask your doctor which option is best for you or your child.
