CBY Rabbinic Survey: Opportunity to Define Our Future

For the past several months, Bnai Yeshurun's Rabbinic Transition Committee has been performing its analysis. But they have **not** been looking outward to find and analyze candidates to serve as our next **מרא דאתרא**. Rather, they have been looking inward and analyzing you. (Me? You talkin' to me? Yeah, we're talkin' to you!)

Working closely with YU's Center for the Jewish Future, the transition team has conducted focus groups and reviewed inputs from many members, to understand our needs for our next senior rabbi and our hopes and vision for the future of our shul. All of that input has led to a survey that was sent to every full member this past week. We hope that every member will respond. It is your response that will drive our Rabbinic Search Committee as it embarks on the next phase of this process.



Please understand. It is not the Search Committee's role to select our next **מרא דאתרא**. That is your job. It is their role to present to you multiple candidates who appear to meet the job description that you will effectively be writing in your responses to the survey.

Obviously, virtually the entire membership will agree that we want a *rav* who is a "good speaker" with "strong pastoral skills." We all want someone who is "warm and approachable" and is an "outspoken supporter of Israel." But there are many additional nuanced issues that already have emerged from our focus groups which need to be clarified and prioritized through the survey and with the largest possible membership participation.

The CJF team was useful in helping us identify some areas in which, surprisingly, CBY may differ from the "typical" large modern Orthodox shul. For example, we seem to have an especially wide-spread concern about the continued growth of our shul. (This concern is more typical of young shuls whose membership is in the 100-200 family range, than it is in a well-established shul with close to 600 families.)

It was also surprising to see the large percentages of members that focused on **רוחניות** issues, on their desire to be spiritually moved and religiously inspired.

(The YU team feels this is a wonderful attribute that will be a "draw" for potential candidates, but it is not the typical response that they see from other shuls.)

As expected, there were a number of concerns that might be lumped together under a category called the evolution of women's roles in modern Orthodoxy- the role of a יועצת הלכה, the treatment of a *bat mitzvah* vs a *bar mitzvah*, women serving as officers of the shul, etc. These are clearly important issues to many members and will be the subjects of questions in the survey.

At this point, the communal desire of Bnai Yeshurun has yet to be defined. Do you want a well-known and universally respected scholar and orator who will confirm our standing as a flagship shul of modern Orthodoxy? Do you want a warm, unifying, high-potential candidate who will serve as a role model for your children? Do you want....? Yeah, we're talkin' to you!... and we need you to talk back.

Surely, we all recognize the importance of devoting twenty minutes to help set the future course of our shul. Responding to the survey should take no longer than twenty minutes. Thanks from your fellow members for being an active participant in this exciting activity.
