## Simchat Torah 5781 at CBY

*Moadim l'simcha!* Simchas Torah clearly was not designed for our current circumstances, but we at Bnai Yeshurun have been working on a combination of changes to make it into a meaningful day to express our love for Hashem's Torah. We are happy to share many of those plans with you below. As a continued theme of this year's Yamim Noraim, we recognize that this year will look different than any other, but with a continued emphasis on flexibility and positivity, we believe it can be a wonderful cap to the Yamim Noraim season.

### Shmini Atzeret

At each of our minyanim on Shmini Atzeret morning we will have Yizkor, Tefillat Geshem, and Megillat Kohelet.

On Shimini Atzeret afternoon the David Frohlich z"l Youth Department will hold outdoor family hakafos, (only for those who pre-registered). Dancing will take place within families only and social distancing between families as well as mask guidelines will be followed. Children will receive a to-go treat.

### Simchat Torah Night

On Simchat Torah night Rabbi Zahtz will give a special shiur between mincha and maariv on the History and Origin of Simchas Torah. Following maariv we will conduct brief hakafos. As there does not seem to be any safe way to have dancing in the shul or outside, the Torahs will be carried around the bimah by designated individuals and we will instead remain in our individual spots, singing in place and expressing our love for Hashem's Torah. As much as we yearn to hold the Torah tightly, our love is in no way diminished by our inability to do so, similar to our loved ones we can't hug, but still love deeply.

As a way of incorporating the 14 parshiyos we were unable to *lein b'tzibbur* this year, during each of the 14 hakafos (between night and day) there will be a 60 second thought from each parsha presented, either by Rabbi Zahtz or Rabbi Weinberger.

*Please note there will be no candy for the children or other food at hakafos.*

Following seudas Yom Tov at home there will be an open-learning Seder in the Beis Medrash from 9:45 pm -11:45 pm. At 11:45 pm Rabbi Zahtz will deliver a *sicha* in the Beis Medrash followed by refreshments outdoors in the area near the shul sukkah sponsored by Elana & Marc Rothenberg.

### Simchat Torah Day

Hashkama minyanim will take place in the Ogden Tent and Old Main at 6:45 am. Due to space constraints and the same areas being needed for davening later, these minyanim will not have hakafos, but will have individual aliyos (using the same safety protocols we have been using for aliyos).

Please feel free to join one of the later minyanim for hakafos.

Davening at the later minyanim will take place at 8:45 am in the New Main, Old Main, Ogden Tent, and Social Hall (Nusach Sefard).

At each of the 8:45 am minyanim *Atta hareisa* and four brief hakafos will be conducted (in the same safe manner as at night) followed by the opportunity for everyone to get aliyos. For safety reasons (and general decorum), we ask that everyone please remain in their room and not congregate in any hallways during this time. In order to maintain safe distancing and allow a minyan to hear the krias hatorah, we will not be subdividing within the rooms for multiple stations for aliyos.

At 10:45 am there will be a reading of the Torah outside on Jefferson Street for Kol HaNearim. (There will not be a reading for Kol HaNearim at any of the other locations.) There will not be a chuppah for all of the children to crowd under (nor for any of the other chassanim), but they can go individually under a Tallis (please bring your own from home). Please make sure to remain masked and maintain social distancing even when outside.

The conclusion of davening will resume in the New Main, Old Main, Ogden Tent, and Social Hall (Nusach Sefard).

Please note that the safety protocols regarding hakafos are not exclusively for minyanim on the CBY campus; we urge all of our members to please follow these guidelines.

At 4:30 pm Rabbi Zahtz will give a special shiur for women in the shul sukkah looking at the story of Kayin and Hevel.

Mincha will be at 5:50 pm (please note the earlier time) and we will hold the remaining 3 hakafos briefly in the same manner as the morning, and then conclude Yom tov outside with a beautiful *neilas hachag Kumzitz* on Jefferson Street. This will be a wonderful opportunity for *dveykus*, as we express our love for Hashem, His Torah, His land, and His people. All of our ba'alei tefillah are encouraged to help lead us to bring this Yamim Noraim season to its apex.

Simchas Torah in its essence is expressing our love for Hashem's Torah. We hope and pray that in the various mediums we have arranged over Yom Tov, everyone will have the opportunity to tap into his or her unique connection to Hashem and His Torah and be inspired in a way that will last in the days ahead.

### Shabbat & Yom Tov Davening Guidelines 5781

#### Shemini Atzeret: Friday Night

- Candle lighting at 6:04 pm.
- An abridged קבלת שבת is recited that begins with שיר ליום השבת. מזמור מדליקין. מזור שיר ליום השבת should also be omitted.
- Both ושמרו & וידבר are recited before the Amidah.
- Ma'ariv עמידה for Yom Tov with proper insertions for Shabbos & Shemini Atzeres. Our מנהג is to say יום השמיני חג העצרת הזה.
- לדוד & עלינו is recited after the עמידה (omitting the beracha "מגן אבות" if it is not a קבוע) followed by מנין קבוע.
- According to the ערוך שלחן ערוך Shemini Atzeres meals take place in the Sukkah. One does not recite לישב בסוכה on Shemini Atzeres.
- It is preferable to wait until nightfall (7:04 pm) to begin Kiddush.
- Kiddush for Yom Tov with proper Shabbos & Shemini Atzeres insertions. Kiddush begins with יום הששי. After מוקדש השבת וישראל ויהוה is recited.
- In the event of rain, one may eat indoors. There is no special requirement to recite Kiddush or eat bread in the sukkah when it is raining.
- Birkat hamazon should include the insertions for Shabbos & Shemini Atzeres.

#### Daytime

- (הכל יודוך) for Shabbos ברכות קריאת שמע.
- Shacharis עמידה for Yom Tov with the proper insertions for Shabbos & Shemini Atzeres.
- Full הלל is recited.
- The Torah reading for Shemini Atzeres is דברים 14:22-16:17, the maftir is במדבר 29:35-30:1 & the הפטרה is from מלכים א 8:54-9:1.
- יזכור can be recited even without a minyan. Please remember the CBY Yizkor Fund before reciting יזכור.
- We do not recite ל-ה-א-ל after יזכור.
- At מוסף of Shemini Atzeres we begin reciting משיב הרוח ומוריד הגשם. While not required, an individual davening at home may recite תפילת גשם. However, the switch to משיב הרוח ומוריד הגשם does not take effect until the congregation recites תפילת גשם. Therefore, an individual davening at home should wait to recite Mussaf until at least one of the minyanim in the community has reached Mussaf (which is at approximately 8:45 am). At that point, this individual should recite משיב הרוח ומוריד הגשם during the Mussaf עמידה.
- Mussaf עמידה for Yom Tov with proper insertions for Shabbos & Shemini Atzeres.
- Mincha עמידה for Yom Tov with the proper insertions for Shabbos & Shemini Atzeres.
- סעודה שלישית should ideally be eaten before 3:33 pm. If one did not do so, one may eat סעודה שלישית until sunset.
- Preparations for the second day may not begin until nightfall (7:07 pm).

#### Simchas Torah (Second Day of Shemini Atzeres): Saturday Night

- Candle lighting must be performed after nightfall.
- Ma'ariv should be recited after nightfall.
- Ma'ariv for Yom Tov with insertions for Shemini Atzeres includes ותודיענו.
- We do not eat in the Sukkah on Simchas Torah.
- Kiddush for Yom Tov includes מאורי האש & הבדלה, מאורי האש.
- (יקנה"ז) שהחיינו & הבדלה, מאורי האש.
- Birkat hamazon should include the insertions for Shemini Atzeres.

#### Daytime

- (המאיר לארץ) for weekday ברכות קריאת שמע.
- Shacharis עמידה for Yom Tov with proper insertions for Shemini Atzeres.
- Full הלל is recited.
- On Simchas Torah, we complete the Torah by reading וזאת הברכה. We then begin the new cycle with בראשית 1:1-2:3, the מפטיר is במדבר 29:35-30:1 & the הפטרה is יהושע 1:1-1:18.
- Mussaf עמידה for Yom Tov with proper insertions for Shemini Atzeres.
- The כהנים should duchen at מוסף.
- Mincha עמידה for Yom Tov with proper insertions for Shemini Atzeres.

#### Motzaei Yom Tov

- Yom Tov concludes at nightfall 7:02 pm.
- Weekday עמידה for Ma'ariv including חוננתנו. Havdalah consists of two ברכות & הגפן המבדיל (no בשמים or אש).

Dear Teaneck residents,  
Yesterday, ballots for the general election started to arrive in mailboxes. As you may know, Teaneck has 23 election districts and we are split between two congressional districts. Teaneck Election District 9 is part of Congressional District 5 (currently served by Rep. Josh Gottheimer). Due to an error, residents in (local) District 9 appear to have received ballots for CONGRESSIONAL District 9, instead of their correct CONGRESSIONAL race candidates for Congress. A similar error happened in reverse for residents in Districts 19 and 22.

Here is what we know:  
The ballots are created, printed and mailed by the county clerk for Bergen County. The clerk is aware of the problem, which they believe affects approximated 4,500 ballots in (local) district 9 and 1,500 ballots in (local) districts 19 & 22.

The Bergen County clerk will be re-issuing ballots with a note of apology and explanation to those affected. They are working last night and this morning to confirm the extent of the error before sending out the printed corrections and robo-calls. This may take a day or two to complete.

If you live in an affected district and already sent in your ballot, please return the corrected one when it arrives. The first ballot will be voided (there are systems in place to ensure only one ballot is counted).
