A Message from Rabbi Weinberger



How many Egyptians survived ים סוף קריעת? According to the דעת זקנים, only one: Paroh. The pasuk says that all the soldiers drowned, "לא נשאר בהם עד אחד", *not one of them remained*. Here the דעת זקנים comments, "אבל אחד נשאר והוא פרעה", *but one did survive, and that was Paroh*. The reason for this was so Paroh could relay the story of the exodus and all the miracles that occurred. (Parenthetically, this reason- that many of us

are familiar with- should give us some pause. Why does G-d need Paroh to spread word about the story of יציאת מצרים? Wouldn't it be sufficient for us- His chosen nation- to bear that responsibility?)

Either way, one of the key words in this phrase is "נשאר" - remained. The Netziv points out how the word נשאר refers to when something- or someone in this case- is deliberately left over. This is in contrast to the word "נותר" - remainder/extra- which means something that was left over incidentally or accidentally. Therefore, regarding Paroh, the pasuk uses the word "נשאר" - deliberately left to survive so that he could relay his first-hand account of G-d's wonders. When it comes to the rest of his army, however, the pasuk in Tehilim (which we recite daily in our tefilah) says "ויכסו מים צדיהם, אחד מוהם לא נותר", *and the waters covered their enemies, not one of them remained*. Here, it refers to the rest of the Egyptian army, and we praise Hashem over the fact that not one מצרי escaped. Not a single one was accidentally forgotten about- they all met their end.

This is the difference between נשאר and נותר. The former refers to a "remainder" that is the result of specific intention, while the latter implies when people (or things) happen to be left over. A timely example of this is when one is unable to finish eating the entire Korban Pesach. That leftover meat is referred to as "נותר". Ideally there would be no leftovers in this case. It just happened to be the family didn't finish what they intended to. That's נותר. On the flip side, in Parshas Noach the Torah describes the complete and utter destruction of all human, animal and plant life. Then it says "וישאר" *"Only Noach and those with him on the ark, were kept alive"*. Once again, the operative word being וישאר - Hashem specifically kept Noach and his family safe during the flood. Rabbi Yisrael Reisman points out that we find this distinction quite clearly in recounting the history of our kings, as well. In Sefer Malachim the Navi will wrap up the story of a king by stating "ויתר" *"and the rest of this king's days"* - and the rest of this king's days- "דברי מלך" - are recorded in Divrei Ha'yamim. Meaning, everything else that happened in his life was not so essential to the Sefer. It's just the "יתר" - the leftovers, so to speak- of his days and accomplishments. A quick Bar Ilan search shows that this phrase appears over 20 times in Sefer Malachim. There is one- and only one- instance in which the word "שאר" is used in place of "יתר".

And that is regarding *שלמה המלך* where the pasuk says *וַיִּשְׂאָר שָׂאֵר* דברי שלמה. It's the same concept, just with the word *שאר* instead of *יתר*. Perhaps this is because *שלמה המלך* *deliberately left over* his teachings of Mishlei, Shir Ha'Shirim and Koheles for a later time. They were not meant to be included in his story in Sefer Malachim, but specifically saved for a separate set of seforim.

With this background, we can truly appreciate the name associated with the survivors of the Holocaust: the *שארית הפליטה*. This term was initiated, in this context, by the Klausenberger Rebbe (Rabbi Yekusiel Yehuda Halberstam) in the DP camps following the war. Many of these survivors had lost everything- family, faith, possessions etc. The message that the Klausenberger Rebbe conveyed was that they were in fact a *"שארית"*. There were no accidents here. Of course, no one could dare suggest a reason for the death of 6 million kedoshim. But those who did survive- it was for a reason. It was G-d's way of charging them with the mission of keeping the flame of Torah alive.

The Yuntif of Pesach marks the first of many attempts to eradicate our people and the message of Hashem that we represent. These attempts have always been- and will forever be- futile. Each and every one of us- whose ancestors have made it through all of the trials and tribulations of our history- is here today for a reason. We are all the *"שארית"*. We have all been Divinely chosen to perpetuate our sacred mesorah *עד ביאת משיח צדקנו במהרה בימנו*.

With the closure of the CBY parking lots for our tents we recognize there is a great challenge in finding parking near shul. We implore everyone coming to CBY to be cognizant of where you are parking; obey all parking regulations & be courteous of the shul's neighbors & never block their driveways.

"Pikuach Nefesh Docheh Shabbat: The Value of Saving a Life in Jewish Law"

Dr. Schick will trace the question of whether one may violate shabbat to save a life from Second Temple sources through rabbinic sources. We will examine the history of how this question was addressed and in so doing, gain a new appreciation for the singular value that Chazal instituted in emphasizing the preservation of life.



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Tefilah Instructions from Rabbi Zahtz

Seventh day of Pesach/Shabbat

Candle lighting is 7:02 pm. We do not recite שהחיינו when lighting candles (or making קדוש).

If davening early, make sure to repeat שמע after 7:55 pm.

We do not recite קבלת שבת, only ליום השבת.

We add the insertions for שבת into the יום טוב שמונה עשרה.

The latest time for שמע is 9:47 am.

During פסוקי דזמרה we read the pesukim of אז ישיר aloud.

Half Hallel is recited.

Before קריאת התורה we read שיר השירים (followed by a קדיש יתום).

The שמואל ב כב-א- נא is הפטרה and במדבר כח:יט- כה is מפטיר. שמות יג:יז- טו:כו is קריאת התורה.

In the bracha following the הפטרה we mention both שבת and פסח.

We recite קה קלי before מוסף.

Earliest mincha is at 1:32 pm. Mincha should be completed by 7:23 pm.

Acharon shel Pesach

No preparations for יום טוב may be done before 8:08 pm and before reciting בין קדש לקדש. Candles may be lit after that time. We do not recite שהחיינו when lighting candles, (or making קדוש).

The latest time for שמע is 9:46 am.

In Shul the מגדות are recited before taking out the ספרי תורה.

ישעיה ילב- יבו is הפטרה and במדבר כח:יט- כה is מפטיר. דברים טו:יט- טז:יז is קריאת התורה.

Yizkor can be recited without a minyan. Certainly, pledge money to tzedaka in memory of the loved one being commemorated. Keep in mind the CBY Yizkor Fund!

Earliest מנחה is at 1:32 pm. Mincha should be completed by 7:24 pm

Yom Tov concludes at 8:06 pm. Those who wait for the time of רבנותם it is at 8:37 pm

Havdala only includes two brachot: הגפן and המבדיל.

Wait until 8:45 pm before using any sold chametz.

Davening protocols:

We continue to have beautiful minyanim both in Shul and outdoors on the Shul campus, please join and please remember your masks (both mouth **and** nose must be covered) and social distancing. In the New Main Shul please only sit in the seats with blue tape on the back of them. In all other locations, please only sit where the chairs have been set up.

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CBY COVID Safety Protocols

In our ongoing efforts to provide a safe makom Tefilla and Torah for our community, the CBY Medical Committee met this week to discuss the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and review our policies and procedures. We continue to emphasize that by working together and adhering to the following guidelines, we hope to ensure that our shul remains safe.

- Health:** No one with a fever or symptoms of COVID-19 may attend any event at CBY. COVID-19 symptoms are:
 - Fever or chills
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - Fatigue
 - Muscle or body aches
 - New headache
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Sore throat
 - Congestion or runny nose
 - Nausea or vomiting
 - Diarrhea
- Masking:** Masking is required at all indoor and outdoor minyanim. Masks should cover both nose and mouth. There are no exceptions.
- Seating Plans:** In addition to masking, we continue to urge social distancing, leaving six feet between seats occupied by non-family members. There are blue stickers in the New Main sanctuary which indicate where people should sit to ensure a safe environment. In all other locations chairs are spaced appropriately; please do not move or add seats in these locations. In the tents we have put out chairs in groups of two to allow one chair for sitting and one for tallis/tefillin/chumash etc.
- Ventilation & Duration:** Efforts, including consultation with HVAC experts, have been made to ensure proper ventilation of the space. Masking, distancing, and ventilation reduce risk but do not eliminate it. Every individual who chooses to daven inside must be aware of this risk and signs are posted to this effect. We do suggest N95 masks for those individuals at increased risk as they are proven to be safer in most studies.
- Avoid Crowding:** While in shul, as well as while entering and exiting, congregants should maintain social distance.
- Quarantine Guidelines:** The Medical Committee is continually looking at COVID trends in our area, research related to vaccination, and CDC guidelines. With that in mind, please see below for the most recent update to our quarantine policies.
 - Those individuals who have received a COVID vaccine, beginning 2 weeks after the second dose of a two-dose vaccine or 2 weeks after the dose of a single-dose vaccine, will no longer need to quarantine due to exposure or travel (as long as they are asymptomatic).
 - Individuals who have previously tested positive for COVID will be exempt from quarantine due to exposure or travel (as long as they are asymptomatic) for up to 3 months of their positive diagnosis.
 - CBY will continue to require a 14-day quarantine for individuals following any known COVID exposure who does not meet the criteria identified in the above points.
 - Travel: CBY asks all individuals to follow the Travel Guidelines from the State of NJ (available [HERE](#)) following return from travel outside the immediate area (NY, NJ, CT, DE, PA) which requires self-quarantine for 10 days after travel, or 7 days with confirmation of a negative PCR test on days 3-5.
 - Please note, any individual who is exhibiting symptoms of COVID, regardless if they have been vaccinated or previously tested positive for COVID, should remain home and consult their doctor.
- COVID at CBY:** In the event that a member or non-member tests positive, we will send out a communication to the entire shul with that information. We will not identify the member or non-member by name without their permission but will attempt to report where (at which minyan) and when that person davened at CBY. Each individual in that minyan should then reach out to their doctor to discuss their individual need for quarantine. We request that any person who davens at a CBY minyan (either indoor or outdoor) contact Elysia Stein (office@bnaiyeshurun.org) in a timely manner in the event that they test positive for COVID.

We are trusting our members and other attendees to follow this practice. If you have any concerns related to a violation of this policy, please speak with the Gabbai of that minyan or please inform the shul office.

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Virtual Youth Wing! 14 Meaningful Questions to Help Bring Your Pesach to Life

1. "God took us out of Egypt with a strong hand and an outstretched arm!" Please tell us about a time in your life, or a specific episode that happened to you, where you saw the hand of God.
2. "Da, dayeinu, da, dayeinu!" Jews spend a lot of their day saying thank you: "Modeh ani," "berachos," "modim," etc. In fact, the Hebrew name for Jew, Yehudi, means "one who is grateful!" What is gratitude to you and why is it so integral to our faith?
3. Rebbe Nachman of Breslov teaches that when God split the sea for the Jewish people, He revealed the secret of "ein shum yeush ba'olam klal," that a Jew can never despair. What's one time in your life when you felt stuck between a rock and a hard place, with seemingly no hope in sight, and HaShem gave you the strength and vision to get through it and cross through the sea?
4. Pesach is the holiday of Emunah- faith, commitment, and Divine awareness. What's something in this world that inspires your own Emunah?
5. The Maharal of Prague teaches us that the purpose of the Exodus is to teach us that HaShem cares about each and every Jew. God didn't only create humanity, He actually cares about humanity as well. Can you please tell us about some of the people in your life who cared for you and helped bring you to where you are today?
6. The midrash teaches us that the Jews were redeemed because they safeguarded certain remnants of their culture, even amidst their assimilated society (for example, they kept their mode of dress, their hebrew names, aspects of their language). Which pieces of Jewish culture, or ritual, do you hold most near and dear?
7. The Seder functions as an opportunity for parents to pass on the baton of the Jewish tradition to their children. Therefore, the Skulliner Rebbe of blessed memory used to give over a tzavaah, an ethical will listing his values and priorities, to his children during this time. What would you put in your own ethical will?
8. Nachshon ben Aminadav, according to Jewish tradition, was the first to jump into the roaring sea. What is one time in your life that you stepped out of your comfort zone?
9. "God hardened the heart of Pharaoh." There is a vast discussion pertaining to whether or not God took away Pharaoh's free will. Please tell us about a time when you actively made a decision to do something that wasn't easy, thus utilizing your free will.
10. Pesach is "Zman Cheruseinu," the time of our freedom. What is freedom? When do you feel most free?
11. Why is it so important to incorporate maror and salt water and reminders of pain and bitterness into our celebration of joy? How does adding one actually enhance the other?
12. One idea we learn from the "four sons" is that we invite all different perspectives to the Seder. Can you think of a time that you experienced something with someone else and had a drastically different experience than them? How did that new perspective enlighten you?
13. Rabbi Akiva and co. were sitting around discussing the Exodus until their students reminded them it was time for Krias Shema. What is a time that you were so involved in something you lost track of time? #FLOW
14. "Harei ani k'ben shivim shana, it is as if I'm 70 years old..." What's an area of your life where you feel ahead of your years?

A Mini-Vort From The Szafranski Table:

Did you ever notice that even though we call this holiday “Pesach,” in the Torah, it is always referred to as Chag HaMatzot? The Kedushat Levi (Parshat Bo) explains that HaShem and Bnai Yisroel love each other so much, that we always want to compliment and praise each other. We call Pesach, Pesach (“Passover”), since we reference how amazing HaShem is for passing over our homes and saving our lives, #**HaShemIsGOAT**. Can you feel the love tonight?
