Farewell to the Schachters

After 19 years – including three as Congregation Bnai Yeshurun's very first Assistant to the Rabbi – CBY will bid a bittersweet farewell to the Schachters as they bring their Aliya dream to fruition this summer. In a few short weeks, Rabbi Jonathan, Aliza, Racheli, Avi, Ezra, Sarah, and Yisrael will, בעצה"ת, be realizing their dream of moving to Israel. Rabbi Schachter will be a *rebbe* at Yeshivat Lev HaTorah and Aliza will be managing the human resources department of a tech start-up.

We caught up with Rabbi Schachter for a quick Q&A:

When did you begin at CBY?

"I became the first Assistant to the Rabbi from 2003 to 2005, and, since 2006, I led the teen minyan. Rabbi Kaminetsky, ל"ז, led it for 20 years beforehand, which makes CBY kind of like the Pittsburgh Steelers of Teen minyanim in terms of leadership continuity. והבן יבנין."

How has the shul changed since you arrived?

"Over the last seven years, the Teen minyan has become more intimate and close-knit. Until then, we had the only

Teen minyan in the neighborhood and kids from Rinat and as far as Keter Torah came. Ever since then, everyone has had to step up and participate more, which means everyone's contribution is more valuable."

How has your role changed since you started?

"My role has definitely evolved to more of a father figure as the teens approached the ages of my kids. It's funny, since I wondered when I started about how Rabbi Kaminetsky was able to connect and relate to them across that growing age gap. I see it from a very different perspective now."

How long have you thought about and planned Aliya?

"Why we're doing it is multi-layered and multi-dimensional. Aliya has been something we talked about since we got married, and the ages of our kids and their respective school transitions meant that this summer would be the least disruptive."

What are you most looking forward to?

"I'd say waking up in the land of the אבותה and אמיהות, the land that was gifted to us

by Hashem, being in a country where the majority of people you see and meet are working towards the same goal, with the same dreams and aspirations."

It feels futile to list the ways they have helped inspire and enoble our community by enhancing our learning, enriching our davening, and inspiring more מקצת שבח לפנינו, we shall try:

Rabbi Schachter has led the CBY Teen minyan for 19 years, meaning that children born when he started are graduating from high school this month. In that minyan, our children have developed a keen appreciation for davening and they have assumed critical roles in managing and leading a Shabbat morning minyan. Rabbi Schachter has also taught *shiurim* for high school boys on Shabbat afternoons, strengthening their learning skills and sharing his own boundless love of learning. His עוזר לנגידו, Aliza, has always been a steady presence at the teen minyan, and helped with everything from editing his speeches to.

A Plea From Your Neighbor**Message from Rabbi Zahtz**

Twice recently I was approached by people with a similar lament. The first, "How can someone be so insensitive to stand next to me talking, while I say Kaddish in memory of my father?!" . The second, "I'm dealing with some struggles with one of my children and come to shul to daven and have to listen to my neighbor talking about nonsense the whole time- how can someone be so self-centered?!" . Two different people, two different minyanim, two different sides of the mechitzah, but a common theme. If someone else doesn't want to daven that is his or her decision, but what right does he or she have to disrupt me!?

Although, I'm sure the perpetrators were unaware of the effect their talking was having on their neighbors, the fundamental complaints were legitimate. They asked me to share it with the community. Now I have and I'd like to add a broader perspective. Rav Yom Tov Lipman Heller was born in Bavaria in 1579 just a few days after his father, Rav Nossen, died. In 1597 at the young age of 18, he was appointed to be a Dayan in the city of Prague. He later moved on to become the Rov of Nicholsburg in Moravia and then later in Vienna before returning to Prague to become its new Rov in 1627.

He went to Cracow, Poland, where he became the Rov of the city in 1643. He was Rov of Cracow during the Chielminicki massacres, commonly known as Gezeiros Tach V'Tat (1648-49). Perhaps he is most famous for his commentary on the Tosafot Yom Tov.

Why do I share this?

The Tosfos Yom Tov was Rav during the Geziros tach v'tat and he was troubled about what brought them about. He davened and fasted and due to his piety, through a decree it was revealed that the source of the decree against the Jews-was talking during davening. As a result, he composed a special siddur for the people who are quiet and do not speak during davening.

1649 was 373 years ago and astonishingly talking during davening is still a problem. It seemed maybe we'd turned a corner after being forced from Shul during the pandemic, but alas.

I've been thinking about this in light of these two comments I received recently. I do not have the solution. There are "yetzer haras" that I completely understand, desires that make sense to me and I can relate to, and thereby try to decipher how to beat it, but I can't relate to the yetzer hara to speak in shul- I'm not drawn to do it, I'd rather have a nice quiet davening.

So I can mention all the terrible things written about one who speaks during davening. The only עבירה described in שלחן ערוך as גורל עוננו מנשוא (too great to bear), is talking during chazaras hashatz (reminiscent of the language describing Kayin killing Hevel) and the list goes on- but I don't think that will really help. Instead, I'd like to make two points as we prepare for Shavuot, and ready ourselves to be worthy of reaccepting the Torah.

Firstly, everyone has struggles and challenges in life. The person who on the outside you may envy, has many struggles too and that's what we are to respond to- to grow from whatever challenges us. And when in a rut people will ask "what should I do? Should I check my מזוזות? Should I bake Challah?" Or they'll share with me the latest סגולות they picked up. And I always answer the same thing. You can try that if you want, but those things are easy; that's looking for a magic trick; I don't know much about that.

What I do know is that Hashem wants to see us grow. Look at yourself in the mirror- for real, in an honest way, and find an area in which you are lax and commit to improve it, not fix it, but to try harder; that's a true and tested סגולות because that's really what life is about.

If not talking during davening is hard for you, you are fortunate- what an easy fix to whatever struggles you have! It's free, it's limited to when you're in Shul (you're there anyway), it's relatively painless and that's a סגולות I can understand- I can't guarantee it- but it certainly makes a lot of sense. Show Hashem, from whom you want your salvation to come, how you cherish the time designated to speak to Him.

The second point is don't decide now to make a big permanent change. It won't work. But try something- try accepting upon yourself right now, as we approach not to talk during מתן תורה ח'זורת ה'ש"ג for the month of Sivan. Three weeks, only three shabbosim. Try it, what do you have to lose? Maybe you'll even find it powerful and uplifting- a chance to reflect on why we are in shul and what we are saying. If you have the fortitude, pause right now, mid-sentence, and say "I accept upon myself, בלי נדר, not to speak during ח'זורת ה'ש"ג for the rest of Sivan."

And if that doesn't speak to you, we are a caring community of chessed, do it simply out of respect for the people around you. You may not know who is going through what, and how they have come to Shul to connect to Hashem. Please give them their chance.

As we prepare for שבועות, let us consider strengthening our connection to Hashem through תפלה, and with that we should merit an inspiring, meaningful and lasting קבלת התורה.



Message from the President, Robbie Scharf



I originally intended to use my welcome message as a space to introduce myself, but after the wonderfully written and very thorough article about me and my family last week, I think that topic has already been covered. Thank you for the very kind words and good wishes.

In the past 30 plus days since the new executive and board slates were announced, I have been amazed by the number of people who have reached out just to let me know that they are available to support me and the shul in any way that is needed. I saw a beautiful idea in Rabbi Shalom Rosner's sefer *Shalom Rav* that I think highlights this point. The beginning of Parshat Bamidbar discusses the encampment of Bnai Yisrael in the midbar. Specifically, each shevet is represented by a unique דגל, a flag, with a different color and symbol. Rabbi Rosner raises the question regarding the significance of having separate flags? It would likely have been more unifying to have one flag representing the entire nation, much like the Israeli flag that we

proudly identify with today. He answers with a suggestion by Rabbi Yaakov Kamenetsky in his sefer *Emes L'Yaakov* that the message of the flags is not so much in what they symbolize, but the timing of their presentation in the Torah. The flags were not mentioned right after Bnai Yisrael left מצרים. Rather, they are presented one year later. At this point, Bnai Yisrael has already experienced Krias Yam Suf, Matan Torah and the building of the Mishkan. It was only after experiencing these unifying events and establishing a makom kedushah in the center of the camp, "a spiritual glue that would unify all of the tribes," that the individual tribes were ready to express their unique characteristics.

Our kehillah is comprised of many individuals. However, our common denominator is the מקרש מעט that we choose to place at the center of our community. We may daven in different minyanim with different minhagim, but we are united under the flag of Bnai Yeshurun. For those who have attended any of the recent shul-wide events, it is obvious that we are at our best when our אחדות is on display. And if you haven't yet had a chance to participate, please join us at one of the upcoming events over the next few weeks to experience this first-hand.

There are also numerous opportunities to get involved in all of the wonderful things that are going on in our shul, and I am hopeful that we can continue to raise the level of engagement from the entire membership.

On that note, I would especially like to thank our outgoing president, Dr. Steven Becker, for his tireless efforts on behalf of Bnai Yeshurun over the past few years. He, together with the board and lay leadership, have masterfully guided our shul through a successful rabbinic transition period and have put our shul on a path of growth. Steven has done all of this with a smile on his face and with his warm and caring disposition.

Finally, I want to thank the entire kehillah for giving me this opportunity. 


