shmooze for about 30-40 minutes, during which time, HaRav Weiss will offer *divrei chizuk* and *hashkafa*.

Rav Asher Weiss is a beloved and highly respected religious leader in various segments of Israeli society. In

his inimitable style, Rav Weiss presents a unique

blend of vast Torah knowledge and profound insight, drawing hundreds of listeners from all religious sectors to his weekly shiurim. Rav Weiss is equally sought after and welcomed in the halls of Ponevitz and Yeshivot Hesder, including Yeshivat Sha'alavim, Yeshivat Har Etzion,

Facing Up To Our Problems

Message from Rabbi Schrier



One of the most surprising stories in *Sefer Bamidbar* occurs in the *Sefer's* twenty-first chapter, toward the end of *Parshat Chukat*. The story begins with the Jews wearying of their incessant travels through the desert, and voicing complaints against Hashem and Moshe. "If only we had stayed in *Mitzrayim...*" The Jews are then afflicted with Divine Punishment, in the form of a

horde of attacking venomous snakes. Thus far, the story is actually rather ordinary. The Jews complaining and discussing rebellion is, unfortunately, hardly surprising in *Sefer Bamidbar*. Nor is the Divine punishment that ensues (even if Divine punishment doesn't always come in the form of snakes). What is quite out of the ordinary, however, is G-d's instruction to Moshe regarding how to end the Divine punishment:

וַיֹּאמֶר יְקוֹק אֱלֹהֵי מֹשֶׁה עֲשֵׂה לְךָ שָׂרָף וְשִׂים אוֹתוֹ עַל-נֶסֶם וְהָיָה כָּל-הַנִּשְׁחָץ וְרָאָה אוֹתוֹ וְחָיָה: וַיַּעַשׂ מֹשֶׁה נַחֲשׁ נְחָשֶׁת וַיִּשְׁמָהּ עַל-הַנֶּסֶם וְהָיָה אִם-נִשְׁחָץ הִנְחֵשׁ אֶת-אִישׁ וְהַבֵּית אֶל-נַחֲשׁ הַנְּחָשֶׁת וְחָיָה: (במדבר כ"א:ח-ט)

And Hashem said to Moshe, make for yourself a Saraf and place it on a staff, and anyone who was bitten by the serpents will see it and live. And Moshe built a copper serpent and placed it on a staff, and if the serpents had bitten anyone, they would look at this copper serpent and live.

Moshe is told to craft a copper snake – an idol of sorts – and have the *Bnai Yisrael* gaze upon it to recover and heal. Needless to say, the utilization of a graven image to facilitate healing seems completely foreign to our traditional belief. And, accordingly, our commentaries jump in to offer varying explanations of this strange command.

Rashi and Rashbam suggest that the true intent was to facilitate prayer. When the *Bnai Yisrael* looked upwards toward the raised symbol of their serpent-affliction against the backdrop of the heavens, they would begin to pray for recovery and healing. The *Baalei Ha-Tosfot* (*Daat Zekenim*) suggest it was to highlight G-d's power, by demonstrating that He can use the very same thing to both punish and heal. Perhaps most tellingly, the *Ibn Ezra* says that there may be no immediately evident explanation for the significance of this engraved serpent; we simply follow the commands of Hashem, whatever they may be, even when His intent is hidden from us.

But perhaps there is an additional subtle message of this *nechash ha-nechoshet* that underlies the various commentaries and goes far beyond an ancient affliction in the wilderness. A friend of mine, Rabbi Dr. Josh Herbert, once suggested that perhaps the message of the *nechas ha-nechoshet* is this: sometimes, in order to solve or fix a problem, we first need to face and confront it directly before we can heal or move on.

Right before G-d's command to construct the *nachash*, the *Bnai Yisrael* approach Moshe, acknowledge they sinned, and ask him to pray on their behalf. And, of course, Moshe Rabbenu does.

And the nation approached Moshe and declared, "We have sinned, for we spoke against Hashem and you. Pray to Hashem on our behalf and let Him remove these serpents." And Moshe prayed on behalf of the nation.

But at that moment Hashem swoops in and (figuratively) declares, “Not so fast!” You, Bnai Yisrael, can’t always rely on Moshe to fix all the problems you get yourselves into; he cannot always be the one to save you. It’s not enough to acknowledge you did wrong and then ask for prayer. You need to look at your sin and source of your affliction directly, to confront it, grapple with it, attempt to address it before you move on. In the spirit of Rashi, you need to pray for yourselves; you can’t just have Moshe do the praying for you. In the spirit of Tosfot, you must recognize that sometimes confrontation of the problem is itself the source of healing. While the healing of the copper serpent was certainly a miracle from above, it was simultaneously a call to action from below: confront your own problems, and in doing so proactively begin the process of healing.

And while we hardly encourage sculpting animal images on the day-to-day, that is a lesson of eternal relevance. When facing problems in life, we should (and must) pray to Hashem for healing. We can ask others to pray on our behalf as well. But if we truly want to fix our problems, we must be willing to confront them. We must go through the process of identifying underlying causes, acknowledging personal responsibility, and strategizing and planning future improvement. That process of grappling with problems is often difficult – it’s certainly far easier to have Moshe Rabbenu solve all our problems for us. But more often than not, the process is necessary, and in embracing it, we ourselves have the power to mend, fix, and heal.

Rabbi Dr. Howard Apfel is a senior RA'M at Yeshivat Mevaseret Tziyon and teaches contemporary machshava at Michlala College for Women in Jerusalem. He then served as a rebbe in the Bais Medrash Katan program at MTA. After making aliyah from Teaneck in 2010, Rabbi Apfel served as a Shana Bet RA'M in Yeshivat Torat Shraga and Yeshivat HaKotel, and later as a maggid shiur at Yeshivat Shaalvim. Over the years, Rabbi Dr. Apfel has given courses in Medical Halacha and Bio-ethics at many institutions. He is a sought-after lecturer and has published extensively on contemporary halachik and hashkafic issues. He is also the chief medical advisor for MILL, a non-profit organization in Israel that provides cardiac care, recommendations and support for children with heart disease.



And all of Bnai Yisroel arrived in Midbar Zin, on the first new moon, and the people stayed at Kadesh. Miriam died there and was buried there.

ולא היה מים לעדה ויקהלו על משה ועל אהרן:

The community was without water, and they joined against Moshe and Aaron.

Rav Avraham Menachem Rapaport (1520-1596) writes in his Minchah Belulah that these two events -the death of Miriam and the lack of water- were purposely placed next to each other. In fact, Rav Rapaport claims that the former event caused the latter event to unfold. Since Bnai Yisroel withheld its watery tears following the death of Miriam, HaShem withheld His wellspring of water from us as well.
