Mean What You Say and Say What You Mean Message from Rabbi Zahtz

In the process of interpreting Torah passages, our sages and the Midrash often delve into the juxtaposition of different topics or episodes. One of the most well-known examples of this can be found in the Midrash cited by Rashi at the beginning of our parashah.

The Midrash ponders the significance of juxtaposing the death of Sarah at the beginning of our parashah with the story of Akeidas Yitzchak at the end of the previous parashah, Vayera. What possible connection can there be between the two? The Midrash explains that upon hearing the news of the Akeidah, where her son was prepared for slaughter and was almost sacrificed (כמעט שלא נשרוט), Sarah's soul departed from her, and she passed away.

The שפתי חכמים are troubled by use of the expression "כמעט שלא נשחט", which literally means "he was almost NOT slaughtered", would it not have been more precise to say, "he WAS almost slaughtered"?

What does it even mean to say, "he was almost NOT slaughtered"? What is """ trying to teach us with this cryptic language?

The שפתי הכמים explain that the angel descended from הר המוריה and began describing to Sarah what transpired during the Akedah. He informed her that Yitzchak was bound and prepared for slaughter, but the angel delayed in revealing the story's conclusion, namely



that Yitzchak was saved and not slaughtered. The angel's choice to start with the dramatic preparation for the slaughter proved fatal for Sarah, as she passed away before he had the chance to say, "but he wasn't." He should have reassured her from the outset that everything was alright, and there was no cause for fear. כמעט שלא נשחט signifies that she heard the story, and her soul departed a bit before the angel stated that he wasn't slaughtered.

The great Mirrer mashgiach, Rav Yerucham Levovitz, comments in one of his shmuessen that we see from here the power of the words we choose to use. The exact same message can be delivered in different ways, and it will not necessarily yield the same outcome. The way we choose to express ourselves profoundly impacts how the message will be interpreted. The same story of what happened to Yitzchak could have been introduced with the conclusion of the story so as not to worry and pain Sarah, but instead, it seems to have led to Sarah's death.

The words we use carry more weight than we sometimes realize. Inadvertently we can cause tremendous pain to others simply because we aren't thoughtful before we open our mouths. The old adage of "sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will never hurt me", is simply false as משלי, tise teaches us in משלי, life and death are in the hands of our tongue, exactly the message of our """".

Perhaps this also yields a new understanding of the phrase שנאת הנם, baseless hatred, that is mentioned by חו״ל as the reason for the destruction of the second בית המקדש. The difficulty is glaring, why would anyone hate another for no reason? With our new understanding of "" we can suggest that it means "unnecessary hatred", of course there were underlying reasons for whatever disagreements existed between people, but it escalated unnecessarily, בחנם, because the way it was expressed, the words that were chosen were too harsh.

I've noticed over the past month that many of us are living on edge. The stress of the war and its uncertainty permeates all aspects of our lives and sometimes results in us saying things we otherwise would not have said. In our passion and with the best of intentions, the wrong words are sometimes chosen and inadvertently can lead to insulting another. As part of our crusade for achdus and ridding the world of שנאת חנם, perhaps part of the challenge is to choose our words carefully, in spite of the pressure, and in the merit of our efforts to use our words for good, our tefillos should be more potent and bring about a safe and speedy salvation!

Am Yisrael is in an *eis tzara*, a moment of immense difficulty. Over the past several weeks, we have risen up together on behalf of *acheinu Bnei Yisrael* in *Eretz Yisrael* in *Torah*, *Tefillah*, and *Chesed* in such a beautiful way. We now call upon all members of the Bergen County Jewish community to stand up once again.

On Tuesday, November 14th at 1pm, there will be a massive rally in Washington, D.C.

This is a moment to show the world that the Jewish community of the United States stands with unwavering commitment with the State of Israel, the courageous soldiers of the IDF, and the hostages who remain in captivity. We must also show the world that we will not remain silent in the face of an unprecedented rise in antisemitism throughout the United States and the world.

We strongly urge every member of our community to join us at this historic rally. Am Yisrael is depending on all of us.

In the merit of our standing together, united as one, may Hashem respond to our prayers for a decisive victory in the war against Hamas, the safe return of all hostages, and the defeat of antisemitism in the United States and throughout the world.

The Ksav Sofer notes that Eliezer's behavior was very much intentional. Eliezer was nervous that had he first asked Rivka to introduce herself, she may have developed ulterior motives for performing her signature acts of kindness. If she had lost her anonymity, she may have wished to protect her family's prestige and reputation by acting in a "selfless" manner: #nachas.

Eliezer's test proved to the world that Rivka didn't desire the limelight and fame, she simply wanted to help a person in need. She was righteous and altruistic, through and through. What a marvelous shidduch and what a profound lesson for each of us! Chessed isn't quantified by the amount of likes one gets on social media; it can even happen in the shadows.
