Compassion and Connection Message from Rabbi Zahtz

However, Chazal viewed this through a very different lens. Why must he call out that he is impure? להודיע צערו לרבים, ורבים יבקשו עליו דחמים, to inform the public of his terrible affliction, so that they may daven to Hashem to have mercy on him. Not only is it not a punishment, it is for his benefit!

This statement of או"ל shifts the onus of appreciating ארעת from the afflicted to the audience, the people who have witnessed this person being punished.

When we hear of someone in a difficult predicament we immediately jump to action. Trying to think of ways in which we can help, in whatever way, money, helping someone find a job, food, a ride, babysitting, we are a caring nation and try to help. But what happens when we are stuck we can't think of anything to do? When we have no means to alleviate the pain, or perhaps someone wishes to address his or her tragedy or difficulty in private without much attention and isn't interested in help? We become frustrated, we throw up our hands to give up, I wish I could help, but I can't. I wish she would let me help, but she's not interested, there's nothing to be done- so we go back to our lives, our routine.

The Torah tells us emphatically "No"! There still is that which you can do יבקש עליו רחמים, daven for him, don't be frustrated there's nothing you can do, you can do something; something potent and powerful. And this doesn't have to mean writing down a name

and waiting for דפאנו to see if you remember to take out you're little piece of paper, right then and there- G-d is always available- say your own short tefillah anytime, anywhere.

But Chazal don't stop there, this isn't merely a nice thing to do for those who like to keep lists in their siddurim. Says the גמרא in Berachos (12b) כל שאפשר לבקש רחמים על anyone who can ask mercy for his friend and doesn't is called a sinner.

A sinner? That's a pretty harsh statement, he may not be such a nice guy, but a sinner! How can that be?

Rav Pinkus explains with a משל. You work in a large company and have the privilege of dining daily with the CEO. You grew up together, work together and enjoy each other's company. A friend of yours in the same field has come on hard times and is looking for a job- one that fits perfectly with your company's line of work. Could you fathom not mentioning it during one of your casual lunches or conversations? Forget begging, that may be inappropriate, but at least a short mention, even in passing. Who wouldn't? How could you not? You realize that he's suffering and you have something to contribute - will it work? Maybe not- but you've got to try!

We all have a relationship a- close relationship- with the One who can remove all suffering, how can we not at least make a mention to Hashem, to ask Him to help? Are we guaranteed the result we hope for? No, G-d has His plans, but how can we not ask for someone else's suffering to be removed?

That is why a person who doesn't ask is called a חוטא, such a harsh term, it reflects at least one of two fundamental deficiencies in the most basic areas in life. בין אדם לחברו it's an inability to relate and appreciate someone else's pain, if it was you, you'd daven for salvation and even בין אדם למקום if we

believed firmly and with full conviction that Hashem controls all- how could we not turn to Him to ask for someone's suffering to be removed. Would we not ask our friend the CEO?!

In the information age with email, WhatsApp, and various social media outlets everything spreads rapidly and with all of the good that offers we are unfortunately bombarded with the number of אַרוּת, tragedies, throughout the world, Israel and even within the community.

The unfortunate byproduct can sometimes be desensitization to the people involved and to feel for someone else in pain. It becomes '"ה" "just another tragedy". We must never allow the challenges and "דות" that exist to become routine, every person, every soldier injured or killed "ה", the hostages in captivity, the families balancing and challenge in so many ways, must never become routine- "that is just how it is"- we need to maintain our sensitivities as difficult as it sometimes may be.

Connecting to another person's מעל is fundamental to chesed, it puts the heart into what would otherwise be just an external act of chesed.

Why is it the מצורע who teaches us this fundamental lesson in chesed? Perhaps it is בודה כנגד בודה he spoke lowly of someone else trying to gain at another's expense through ישון הדע הדע היען הדע to not degrade and disconnect from others, but also to establish a stronger connection of feeling, to daven for another Jew who's suffering and help in any other way he or she needs.

As we enter the season of גאולה, may the new month renew our connections to one another and usher in בשורות טובות וגאולה

Our thoughts and tefillot are with our brothers and sisters in Eretz Yisrael, today and always.





- Tazria commences with halachos pertaining to childbirth, **#MazalTov #OnlySimchas**. This includes the fundamental mitzvos of mikvah and bris milah.
- Next, the parshah speaks about the halachos of tzaraas, a spiritual skin ailment, **#DivineDermotology #SomethingsNotRightHere.** Any suspicious **#tzaraas-esque** signs were brought to a kohen, who declared the person tahor or tamei, **#Pure4Sure**.
- Fun fact, sometimes the kohen would make a person quarantine for up to two weeks! #SoundFamilar?
- How does a person with tzaraas get better? Firstly, the metzora must remain outside of the city until all symptoms disappear, #challahkazam! Infected garments and homes must be destroyed. #TBC #NextWeek



A Mini-Vort from the Szafranski Table to Yours!




Regarding the halachos of tzaraas, we learn (next week... shhh!) that if a person sees a suspected tzaraas infestation on his house, he must report it to the Kohen, and say "בַּנגע נראה לי, something LIKE tzaraas has appeared on my house" (Metzora, 14:35 and Nega'im, 12:5).

Why does the owner have to say "LIKE tzaraas," why not simply say "there IS tzaraas on my house?" Speak with confidence and certainty!

The Tosafos Yom Tov suggests a number of answers. One answer is fairly pragmatic, but contains a deep lesson: "שלא ימהר הכהן", so that the Kohen won't rush and declare the tzara'as impure." We are all influenced by the perspectives and worldviews of our friends and neighbors. In order to ensure that the Kohen could make an unbiased decision, the owner shouldn't claim, with certitude, that it's indeed tzaraas. Let the Kohen figure it out on his own and come to his own conclusion!

When we speak about people, institutions, and communal events, please be sure to speak in a kind and sensitive manner and stick to the facts. We don't want to make other people declare something "impure" before they even have a chance to think it through in an objective manner! Regardless, when in doubt, silence is golden:)
