The Tzitz: A Beacon Against Brazenness Message from Rabbi Zahtz

In Parshas Tetzaveh, nestled within three verses, the Torah introduces us to the *tzitz*, a golden plate worn on the forehead of the Kohen Gadol inscribed with the words "Kodesh LaShem". While the Torah explicitly states that the *tzitz* serves to atone for sins related to korbanos offered despite ritual impurity, its symbolism runs deeper, as elucidated in the Gemara.

The Gemara in Zevachim (Daf 82b) teaches that each priestly garment holds significance beyond its physical function. Regarding the tzitz, it states, ציץ מכפר על עוות פנים, the tzitz atones for brazenness. How do we know this? The Torah says שנות by the tzitz and it says שנות by מצח by מצח

What's the connection between the two? Yes, linguistically they are associated, but what does that point to? What does it reflect?

At first glance, one might question the necessity for the Kohen Gadol to be reminded constantly of his sacred duties. After all, he is immersed in the rituals of the Beis HaMikdash, adorned in garments reserved solely for him. However, the Gemara warns against hesech had'as, the

danger of forgetting one's sacred obligations, even in the holiest of settings.

The Gemara says that we learn from the *tzitz* that a person can't be *meseach da'as*, forget, that he's wearing tefillin- anyone ever forgotten maybe just for a second or two that he's wearing tefillin? Likely. If you told a bar mitzvah boy you can't ever forget you're wearing tefillin, he'll think you're mad- this is so special I've been counting down the days- how could I ever forget!

I believe the answer is known all too well to us, and that yes, it was certainly possible for him to forget. Whenever we constantly and consistently encounter something, as special as it may be, we run the risk of *hesech hada'as* of forgetting just how special that thing really is.

At work, in relationships, and yes even in shul and our performance of מצוות we are challenged as was the כהן גדול to avoid becoming bored, weary, and apathetic.

When does the potential for ymm, brazenness arise? When a person feels there's nothing special, irreverence, the pitfall of being bold, brazen and unashamed is created.

The *tzitz* serves as a tangible reminder to the Kohen Gadol, and by extension to us, to maintain a constant awareness of the sanctity of our actions. It admonishes against complacency and challenges us to infuse our rituals with passion and vigor.

In that way, the *tzitz* atones for the sin of panim- when used properly it serves as a reminder of the presence of Hashem and is the antidote for irreverence and brazenness.

Four years ago Parshas Tetzvaeh was Parshas Zachor and our last Shabbos in shul for quite a long time. I think during those first few traumatizing weeks we all had a new appreciation for Shul and couldn't imagine retuning and having things go back to how they were...

Where are we now? Have we lost some of that perspective?

It's worth thinking about...

Hashem should give us the strength and clarity and ability to open our hearts to what we know is right and make sure that our mikdash me'at is a place of Holiness that can prepare us for the Beis HaMikdash she'yibaneh bmheirah v'yameinu amen.



Israel at War: The Homefront Challenge

Mrs. Chava Kleinman is a social worker with 25 years of experience working with individuals, families, and communities, as well as an educator and writer. As Director of Community Services of Shiloh, a community of 450 families in the Shomron, she manages emergency and crisis intervention for the community. Since October 7th, they have been working around the clock to provide services and develop projects to deal with trauma now and after the war - for the entire community and especially for children. The current war has touched each of them: soldiers from the community have fallen in combat; a young man from the community has been taken hostage and is still being held by Hamas; they have been helping 130 families to cope while their husbands/fathers are away from home in reserve army service; as well as many of their young people who are in regular army service.

On a personal note, Mrs. Kleinman's 25-year-old son was called to reserve duty at the start of the war and has been serving in Gaza, leaving his wife and two young children worried and burdened. Her husband has also been serving in reserve duty in the Shiloh area. She speaks about the challenges the community has faced from both a personal and professional perspective.

Tetzaveh in "Hashtag" Form

- Last week, we learned about the construction of the Mishkan, the **#MikdashOnWheels**. This week we are told to collect the purest of oils for the Menorah. Subsequently, Moshe was told to proclaim **#Aharon&Co** as Kohanim. **#PriestlyProcession**
- We are then informed about some of the Bigdei Kehunah which were unique to the Kohen Gadol: the Ephod, the Choshen Mishpat, the Me'il and the Tzitz. Cuz you know, it's a #BigDay. Afterwards, we learn about the standard Bigdei Kehunah for #TheRestOfEm kohanim.
- Moshe performs a ceremony and consecrates the Kohanim, #CohanicConsecration #WelcomeToTheBigLeagues
 They went to the mikvah, put on their special clothing, and then Moshe offered korbanos. Moshe does this for seven days
 straight. #NeverEndingBBQ
- We are then told about the Korban Tamid, certain offerings which were brought every single day #ConsistencyIsKey #KlalGadolBaTorah #EinYaakov
- The parshah ends by discussing the Ketores and its special, golden, mizbeach. **#EvenTheSmellyChelbina #EveryoneCounts #SmellsLikeUnity**

... ריח ניחוח... הקטרת את־כּל־האיל המובח... ריח ניחוח And you shall burn the whole ram upon the altar... a pleasing aroma [for HaShem]... (29:18)

Does HaShem actually have a sense of smell??? Rashi, on the spot, quotes a

ma'amer Chazal, which clarifies that what is pleasing to HaShem is not the aroma, rather, it's the fact that we have adhered to HaShem's directive:

ריח ניחוח. נחת רוח לפני, שאמרתי ונעשה רצוני:

As a pleasing aroma before Me — that I commanded and My will was carried out (Zevachim 46b).

That, and that alone, is what is "pleasing" to HaShem.

Rav Itzileh Volozhiner, in his Peh Kadosh, notes that Rashi was very intentional regarding the placement of this comment. Rashi includes it here, in this situation, since one might surmise that HaShem would reject this korban, since the burning of the flesh could cause an abhorrent odor. Why would HaShem want my smelly korban?! Rashi jumps in and clarifies that HaShem doesn't care about the smell, He cares about our hearts and our actions: "since I gave a command and my will was done, this is a pleasing aroma before Me."
