PARSHA QUESTS

Succos

Our Parsha begins with the Jewish People at their first stop after leaving Egypt, at Succos (13:20; also 12:37). At this point, the Jewish People were still travelling the direct route from Egypt to Eretz Yisrael, and so one assumes that the location of Succos was south of Eretz Yisrael. On the other hand we find that when Yaakov returned to Eretz Yisrael from his own exile with Lavan, he also made his first stop at Succos (Bereishis 33:17). Yet then, Yaakov was travelling from Aram, an area to the northeast of Eretz Yisrael. Evidently there were two separate places, in very different locations, known as Succos. What they share in common is that they both served as the first stop of the Jewish People upon their return from exile. Why indeed is the first stop always Succos?

The Gift of Shabbos: Mizmor Shir L'yom HaShabbos

You probably expect this column to be about Shabbos. Or gifts. It would

be ridiculous, after all, for a column entitled "The Gift of Shabbos" to be about, say, how silent letters are a thing but invisible ones.

There is another, similarly titled column you will read today: Psalm 92 (are we supposed to pronounce the "p"? Can someone clarify this?), entitled "The Song of Shabbos." You may notice, however, that on its face, it has nothing to do with Shabbos. It is about praising and trusting Hashem even in the dark of night; Hashem's intractable ways; the ascendance and eventual downfall of evil; and the flourishing of tzaddikim. No mention of Shabbos whatsoever. What is going on here?

Shabbos is an oasis: not just from the flurry of our weekday lives, but from a society that denies Hashem's Oneness, who claims that the world came to be on its own and is headed nowhere. Shabbos is the day to reinforce our emunah in Hashem as Creator; to praise and thank Him in the good times, and hold on ever tighter in the bad times; to reiterate that evil, however prevalent, will dissipate, and we will witness its downfall; that truth will take hold; that tzaddikim will once again be "planted in the house of Hashem." We drink deeply from this precious oasis, shoulder up, and fortify ourselves for the coming week.
