PARSHA OUESTS

Approaching the King Uninvited

The Book of Vayikra begins almost in mid-sentence. The end of Shemos describes G-d's presence descending upon the Mishkan (Tabernacle) in a cloud that filled the Mishkan such that it prevented Moshe from being able to enter, until G-d invited him to enter at the opening of our *Parsha* (see Rashbam here, Ramban end of Shemos). notion of limited entry is reinforced later (16:2), when G-d warns Aaron that if he wishes to avoid death he must not enter the Holy of Holies any time he pleases, and prescribes the specific manner and order of service through which he may enter on Yom Kippur.

It is well known that traditionally we read the Book of Esther allegorically, understanding the many references to "the King" as alluding to the King of all kings, G-d Himself, Whose Name is never explicitly mentioned in the Megillah. Thus we find in the story (4:11) that entry into "the King's" inner sanctum uninvited is punishable with death, an apparent parallel to the warnings we read in the Torah about entering G-d's inner sanctum, the Holy of Holies. Note however that in the Megillah we find a specific possibility of exemption, for those to whom the King would extend his golden scepter. Indeed it is this exemption that saved Esther's life when she entered uninvited. Yet with regard to the Holy of Holies, we don't seem to find any parallel, where one would enter G-d's Holy of Holies uninvited and survive. Does the metaphor fall short?

The Gift of Shabbos -Purim & Havdala

Hot take: here's to hoping that the whole "Purim is eternally relevant" thing doesn't extend to the Purim tape (or, as Haman's frum grandchildren in Bnei Brak call it, When Zaidy was Hung).

We can only imagine how Jews worldwide must have felt on the 15th of Adar, 3405, when Haman's genocidal decree backfired, and the would-be massacre never materialized. The sheer relief, the simcha, and the palpable sense of Hashem's overwhelming love were surely felt by all. Indeed, haysa Layehudim orah v'simcha v'sasson v'yikar — the Megilla attests to a veritable explosion of simcha within the Jewish people, a recommitment to Torah and mitzvos, and a newly rekindled connection with Hashem.

Interestingly, we recall this very pasuk by havdala on Motzei Shabbos. Maybe the idea is that just as we smell besamim to console our departing neshama yeseira, and have a melava malka to see the Queen off, we need to console ourselves, as well, as we transition from the holy to the mundane. Would that the ecstasy of Shabbos, that the intimacy we so felt in the wake of our Purim salvation, could remain with us the entire week, that we'd never need to part ways. Indeed, there's no havdala after Purim; its wave of simcha reverberates within us long after it passes. Here's to infusing our lives with that song of Layehudim at the start of our week.
