New North London Kol Nidrei Charity Appeal 2023

Our community has always looked within and beyond, and this High Holyday season it is important we recognise what we can do for others and the chances we can give them.

Many people just want a chance. A chance to get the best mental health support, a chance at an education, a chance to die with dignity at home, a chance to have access to healthcare no matter which side of the divide you live. We know that every person can take that chance if given, and this is reflected by the mission of each of the organisations chosen to benefit from this years appeal:

Jami – a chance to access mental health support. Funding the 'Front Door' programme we will help individuals from the Jewish community find the right mental health support when they need it the most.

Masambiro – a chance to have an education. Supporting children in Malawi to go to school. We will be funding girls to gain an education they otherwise would not have the chance to get.

North London Hospice – a chance to be cared for at home. Our support will go towards the Barnet Community Care team, helping people on end of life care spend as much time as possible at home, with their comforts.

The Road to Recovery – a chance to access healthcare. Crossing the Israeli-Palestinian divide we will be funding The Road to Recovery to transport children from Gaza into Israel for lifesaving medical operations.

The Masorti Family Fund – a chance to support young adults. The fund supports the Masorti Young Adults Outreach programme to keep young people in their 20s connected to Jewish life and community and the NNLS Nurturing Potential Fund will enable young adults pursuing professional journeys in Jewish Education or *Smichah* to receive grants and connect with our community.

JAMI

MASAMBIRO UK

Jami provides wrap-around mental health services to enrich and save vulnerable lives in the Jewish community.

In recent years the rise of children and adults' mental health issues has been exponential and continues to grow, with the pandemic, financial and housing insecurity and family breakdown being contributing factors. Whilst delivering professional, person-centred services for children and adults with mental health needs, Jami also supports their families and unpaid carers.

People who would previously have been supported by statutory services are turning to Jami in increasing numbers with increasingly complex mental health needs. The 'front door' at Jami is the first port of call for anyone that needs support with mental health issues, via phone calls or emails. Due to the urgent and exponential demand, Jami is seeking to increase the intake staffing at their 'front door' to provide expertise, knowledge, and a warm welcome at the first point of contact.

Louise's story:

Louise contacted Jami regarding her 18-yearold daughter, Amy, who was severely bullied at school and had been self-harming, drinking, and also struggling with bulimia. As Amy's distress worsened her behaviour became increasingly chaotic. While anxious to support and help her daughter, Louise was struggling to know how to talk with Amy without causing more arguments and further damage.

The Jami team allocated Louise with a Carer Coordinator who phoned her weekly and invited her to join the Parent Carers Group, where she was able to talk with others facing similar challenges. She now feels less isolated and more in control when she is with her daughter. For Amy, the damage inflicted during childhood was complex and she was referred for support offered by Jami's Young Adult Service.



You can help people like Louise:

- £50 could provide 24 people with strategies to cope with anxiety and/or depression
- £100 could help someone referred via the intake team to regain their independence through a one-to-one occupational therapy session
- **£250** could support two people in Jami's young adults' programme to take control of their own lives
- £500 could facilitate an ongoing support group for parents of young people living with an eating disorder
- £1,000 could provide 12 hours of one-to-one online counselling for people referred via the intake team, helping them to regain purpose and direction

Kunyanja Secondary School in Nkhata bay, northern Malawi, makes a transformative difference to the lives of local students and community. It provides secondary education and opportunities for students to develop and contribute to their country.

Masambiro UK's core support to Kunyanja is through the bursary scheme, which enables disadvantaged children to attend school when this would not otherwise be possible. In addition, Masambiro supports girls to stay in a hostel. It provides a safe space for schoolgirls to stay and study, removing the risks of rape, pregnancy and subsequent early marriage that they previously experienced on their long journeys to and from school.

Chimwemwe's story:

Aged 17, Chimwemwe Nkhata moved 150km away from home so that he could attend secondary school as there was a lack of schools in his district. He became the first student from Kunyanja school to win a place at University in Malawi, a country with one of the lowest per capita university places in the world.

Chimwemwe had been given the opportunity to study at Kunyanja through Masambiro's bursary scheme in the early days of the school. When he faced financial hardship during his third year of university, Masambiro UK supported his continued education, and committed to supporting any Kunyanja School graduate who made it to university.

Wanting to give back, Chimwemwe returned to Kunyanja Secondary School as a teacher after university. Today he is the Deputy Head at the school.

Chimwemwe has transformed his life and become a leader, and in doing so has transformed the lives of so many others.

He reflects: "Words can not explain how grateful I am to Masambiro for the support they have rendered towards my education.



I was the first university student, but now Masambiro has supported more than 100 students. Each one of us contributes to our families, to our communities and to Malawi."

You can help other students like Chimwemwe:

- **£60** would pay for a child to attend school for a term
- £115 pays for a year's living fees for a school graduate to attend university
- £300 would buy textbooks for one specific subject
- £600 would pay for a girl to attend school and live in the girls' dorm for the whole school year
- £1000 would restock the science lab for chemistry lessons

NORTH LONDON HOSPICE

North London Hospice has been caring for local people since 1984, providing palliative care and support, giving people the choice about where they receive care, and where they die, whether it be in their own home, or at the Hospice.

This Kol Nidrei, you can support the Hospice's Barnet Community Team which plays a vital role in helping patients remain in the comfort of their own home for as much of their time as possible. They give practical and emotional support to all those they visit, helping to make what is a distressing and difficult time for many, that little bit easier.

Pauline and John's story:

Pauline and John were married for 55 years. Five years ago, Pauline was diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease and John became her carer. Pauline was admitted to hospital where, unfortunately, she caught Covid-19 from which she would not recover. When asked if he would like to take Pauline home, John immediately said yes, and plans were put in place for a hospital bed and other equipment to be available at their home.

John cared for Pauline at home for seven precious weeks until she passed away. This was made possible by the Barnet Community Team who support those, like John, wanting to care for their loved one at home by providing medical equipment, knowledge of how to care for the patient and emotional support. John said of Margo, from North London Hospice "I found it so comforting to speak with someone who understood what was happening and how we as a family were feeling. Margo gave me the confidence to care for Pauline at home and reassurance to know that I had made the right decision by bringing her home".

Last year, over 1,400 Barnet residents were provided with care in their own homes by the team. Your donation will help many others like John and Pauline to benefit from the invaluable support delivered by the Barnet Community Team.



How your donation can help:

- £40 could fund one healthcare assistant to treat a patient in their own home for two hours
- £84 could fund a doctor to support and review four patients at the Hospice's Inpatient Unit
- **£210** could fund a healthcare assistant to stay with a patient in their home for one whole night
- **£681** could fund the whole Barnet Community Team for four hours
- £1,003 means the Barnet Community Team can provide full care for one patient

THE ROAD TO RECOVERY

The Road to Recovery (RTR) provides vital humanitarian support for sick Palestinians, bringing mainly children for life-saving medical treatments in Israel.

Volunteers from every sector of Israeli society meet patients and their families at checkpoints, liaising in Hebrew with Israeli officials to ease entry into Israel and transport patients to hospitals for treatment.

The Coordination Centre is the hub of RTR's activity. Staffed by 18 Israelis and 5 Palestinians, it works 24 hours a day, 7 days a week (except Yom Kippur) to liaise between the needs of the Palestinian families and the availability of the Israeli volunteers. It has experienced a substantial increase in demand.

RTR continues to maintain its aims to bring Israelis and Palestinians together, sharing experiences and building the mutual trust that is vital for the future of peace. RTR organises 4-6 Family Fun Days yearly, where Palestinians and Israelis can meet in a relaxed environment, away from the hustle and bustle of the daily trips to the hospitals. The activities of these gatherings are rich and varied, and of course food is a tried and tested conversation starter.

Bisan and Udi's story:

For the last year, 17 year old Bisan has been receiving cancer treatment from Sheba hospital. Her journey from home begins at 04:00, arriving at the checkpoint a few hours later. Crossing the checkpoint with the various security checks can take up to three hours and even after entering Israel there is no public transport to the hospital.

Without Udi, an Israeli volunteer, Bisan would have struggled to afford to travel to Sheba hospital for her cancer care. The simple act of driving Bisan to her treatment has potentially prolonged her life. The two of them have become acquainted with each other, resuming their conversation since the last journey. Udi says, "I feel angry and ashamed that they are not able to receive the needed care nearer their home".



You can help people like Bisan:

- **£50** can ensure that a child gets to a lifesaving operation
- £100 can help one patient make a return journey from a checkpoint to the hospital
- £150 can pay for the training of one new volunteer to help ensure life saving trips take place
- £520 could pay for the full activity of the Palestinian-Israeli Coordination work for one day, organising transport, appointments and documents to help patients be prepared
- £1,000 would cover the cost of expenses for a whole day of activity, including petrol expenses
