

## Chanukah Blessings

Candles are added to the chanukkiyah ("Chanukah menorah") from right to left, but are lit from left to right so that the newest candle is lit first each night. Use the shamash ("the helper candle") to light the rest of the candles while you say or sing:

בַּרוּךְ אַתַּה יִיָ אֵלהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הַעוֹלָם אֲשֶׁר קְדְשָׁנוּ בִּמְצִוֹתִיו וְצְוַנוּ לְהַדְלִיק

Baruch Atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tsivanu l'hadlik ner shel Chanukah.

Blessed are You, *Adonai* our God, Sovereign of all, who hallows us with *mitzvot*, commanding us to kindle the Chanukah lights.

> בַּרוּךְ אַתַּה יִיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם שֵׁעַשָּׂה נָסִים לַאַבוֹתֵינוּ וְאָמּוֹתֵינוּ בימים ההם בומן הוה.

Baruch Atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, she-asah nisim laavoteinu v'imoteinu bayamim haheim baz'man hazeh.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who performed wondrous deeds for our ancestors in days of old at this season.

[Traditionally recited on the first night of Chanukah only]

בּרוּך אַתַּה יָיַ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הַעוֹלֶם שֶׁהַחַיַנוּ וְקַיָּמֵנוּ וְהָגִּיעַנוּ לַזְּמַן הַזָּה.

Baruch Atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, shehecheyanu v'kiy'manu v'hiqiyanu laz'man hazeh.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, for giving us life, for sustaining us. and for enabling us to reach this season.
