Dear Friends,

I want to thank the members of the Board and Executive who are finishing their terms this year. Their commitment to the shul has been very much appreciated: Teddy Bercovici, Marcia Beck, Phyllis Berck, Benjy Cohen and Michael Freeman. I especially want to thank Joel Edelson who after serving as Development Chair, Vice President, President and Past President is now leaving the Board. We are all very grateful for Joel's diligence and strong leadership and the shul has benefited immeasurably from his service. Fortunately for the congregation, he is still serving on the Building Task Force. I also want to thank my predecessor, Harry Schachter, who has served us so admirably in so many ways, putting in many hours and great effort, all in the best interests of the shul. Harry is remaining on the Board as Past President and Chair of the Building Task Force.

RABBI'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

In February, the Supreme Court of Canada ruled unanimously that laws which criminalize the act of assisting someone to commit suicide are unconstitutional because they deprive people suffering from grievous and irremediable medical conditions of the right to life, liberty and security of the person as guaranteed under the Charter.

This ruling confirms and reinforces a societal trend in which the individual's right to self-determination has become elevated to supreme importance. A key argument underlying the decision is that individuals, and not the state, should have a right to decide what happens with their own lives and their own bodies.

No issue could be more personally impactful than this one. Many of us have watched loved ones suffer horrendous physical or mental pain, and felt helpless when they expressed a wish to die rather than continue to endure their suffering. Others of us are suffering ourselves, or if not suffering now, feel strongly that whenever the end comes, they would like the right to be able to receive help to take their own life. Yet others are gravely concerned about the implications of physician assisted suicide for society's attitude toward the sick and disabled, and also the potential for abuse.

Once a right is established by the general society in which we live, individuals will have to decide if they would like to exercise that right. In addition, health care providers will need to decide if they are prepared to provide this service to those who wish it. In our Jewish community, many people want to understand what our ancient tradition has to say about this very difficult topic as they think through what their own stance will be in the new Canadian legal context.

While there are narrative texts in our tradition in which individuals choose death over continued suffering, there is very little halachic ground for a position which allows physician assisted suicide. Our legal tradition has such a bias towards life that there is little room for a legal approach which sanctions helping someone cut short

their life. Compassion for suffering, yes – of that there is a great deal in our tradition. But permission to end that suffering by hastening someone's death – that is difficult to find in a Jewish legal context.

There are those in our community who will take this “no” for an answer, because their understanding of our obligations under the covenant with God can accommodate no other stance. Others will seek to find different paths, either within the bounds of Judaism or -- in our free democratic society -- outside it, to enable them to do what they think is right, to get to “yes”. As we Jews consider this issue, we have to confront the underlying assumption of the case for physician assisted suicide, the assumption that the individual has an absolute right to make determinations about their own body. While the Canadian

Supreme Court is pointing us to a system which affirms that right, Jewish tradition has historically placed the locus of authority over our bodies in God, represented in our world by the teachings of Torah.

Most of us naturally gravitate towards a system in which we have more personal autonomy and control than a system in which we have less. What do we gain by having this autonomy, and what do we lose?

This summer I am off once again to study Torah at the Hartman Institute in Jerusalem. This year, the theme is “Justice and Righteousness: Personal Ethics and National Aspirations.” I will have the opportunity to study Jewish sources that lie behind issues like Physician Assisted Dying in order to understand better the important conversation between the personal ethical positions we may hold and the obligation to maintain the principles of Torah which have guided our Jewish nation for so long. I look forward to bringing back insights which will help me further my own thinking on this and other issues, and which will help me in both my teaching and pastoral work in our community.

HIGH HOLY DAYS 5776

Rosh Hashanah this year starts Sunday night, September 13, and Yom Kippur starts Tuesday night, September 22. Once again, we will have services at the shul and at the Miles Nadal JCC, led by Rabbi Elkin and a new addition, Rabbi Aviva Richman at the shul, and by Rabbi David Weiss at the Miles Nadal JCC. All children's programming will take place at the MNjcc. Space at the shul is limited and booked on a first come, first served basis—if you want to make sure you have a seat at the location of your choice, then make sure to renew your membership at the Narayever sooner rather than later.

And we're looking for people to help. Whatever your skills, we can use them. Here are some areas where we need lots of people, the more the better.

Davening and Leyning

Can you lead a service, or part of one, or read an aliyah of Torah or the haftara? Great! We're always pleased to hear both new and familiar voices from the bimah. Kathryn Polson Ferguson is coordinating davening and leyning at the MNjcc, and Rabbi Elkin is organizing this at the shul, and they'd love to hear from you. If you contact Kathryn or the Rabbi regarding a part, please wait for confirmation from them—they may ask you to do a run through of the service part you are requesting before they give you the final go-ahead.

Youth Programming and Family Services

The Narayever's youth programming—from babysitting and family services through to teen events—is very important to us. And we are thrilled to consistently have strong leadership and terrific volunteers, both among the youth and their grown-up helpers. If you would like to help, please let us know.

Ushering

Are you good at helping people get where they need to go? Then consider signing up for a one-hour shift as an usher. You will stand at the door to the sanctuary and help people find seats or washrooms or page numbers, and answer any other questions that may come up. Added bonus: if you sign up at the MNjcc, we'll tell you the secret of how to locate seats at just the right temperature.

If you were at the MNjcc the last few years, or the shul this past year, you'll have noticed the excellent new page number sign introduced by our Accessibility Committee. We need people to flip the numbers and help to keep the congregation on track. You could be the one who is keeping everyone literally on the same page.

Kol Nidre Choir

Can you sing? Maybe you'd like to join our choir for the Kol Nidre service, the beautiful and reflective introduction to Yom Kippur. This is the only service in the year in which the Narayever has a choir, in rich, four-part harmony, and you can be part of it. Sight-reading skills are not required, but of course you do need to be able to carry a tune.

Setting Up for Services

The day before Rosh Hashanah and the day before Yom Kippur are particularly busy, and that's when it's great

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to have lots of hands on deck. There are well over 800 seats in the MNjcc gym, and each one needs a book holder placed over the back and machzorim and other materials placed on the seat. As well, there are signs to be put up around the building, there's no-rip toilet paper to be put out, and there are Torahs to be transported from one building to the other. If you can spare an hour or two during the day for some light manual labour, we'd love to have you.



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BUILDING REPORT

The Building Task Force is grateful to all the Narayever members who completed the survey that was circulated earlier this year. That survey – an important step in our project to achieve accessibility and improved space -- asked three very basic questions: do you favour doing something at our current location; do you favour a move to a new location; or do you favour leaving things the way they are?



According to the results of that survey, a majority of Narayever members decisively rejects the status quo. And a majority wants us to work with the current site.

The Task Force reported the results of the survey to the Board at its meeting in May, along with a plan for further consultation. With the endorsement of the Board, and building on the first survey, the Task Force is moving on to the next step in its ongoing consultation with the Narayever community. After the summer break, the Task Force will circulate another survey, this one offering a much more specific set of options for discussion. All this, we believe, is moving us closer to our goal of an accessible building that better meets the needs of a growing congregation.

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FUNDRAISING

We are pleased to be coordinating the Fundraising Committee on behalf of Narayever for the coming year. We look forward to working with the various committees involved with fundraising activities and donations. We need new ideas and committee members, so please consider joining us - we promise it won't take too much of your time.

You will recall that last year was the first year that we made an appeal on Rosh Hashanah to raise funds to support the shul's operating costs and special projects over and above the approved budget.

Some of the benefits that we have enjoyed because of your generosity last year are:

- ❑ Membership fee increases this year are limited to no more than the cost of living. In previous years we were forced to raise our dues much more than that. One of our objectives as a shul is to ensure that we remain financially accessible to all, regardless of means.
- ❑ The High Holy Days ticket prices remain unchanged from last year, thanks in part to the success of last year's fundraising appeal.
- ❑ Funds are available to invest in the design and exploratory work required to make our shul accessible to those with mobility issues, and to provide new space for a variety of needs, a project that has been underway for a long time but which we hope to achieve within the near future.
- ❑ Enhancements to our High Holy Days programming and our programming for kids and youth.
- ❑ Funding for a new Scholar in Residence program in the coming year.

This year the Rosh Hashanah appeal will take place on the first day of Rosh Hashanah at both the Miles Nadal JCC and the synagogue. This is in addition to the Yom Kippur tzedakah appeal we have conducted for the past number of years on behalf of other organizations, and which continues to be important to all of us.

Jewish Music Week at the Narayever: Tramway Lider – Street Car Songs



Once again our shul was a host during Jewish Music Week when on Monday, May 11, despite the early hour and a Monday morning to boot, about 60 people came to listen to the inspiring and original song cycle Tramway Lider.

Performed by renowned composer, conductor, arranger and performer Charles Heller, accompanied by Brahm Goldhamer, pianist, Tramway Lider is a musical setting of Yiddish poems written by acclaimed Yiddish poet Shimen Nepom. Nepom, who worked as a College St. streetcar conductor until his death in 1939, tells of life on the streetcar and this performance is a lovely example of Toronto culture echoing through the decades.

To make the experience more authentic, the audience was treated to a slide presentation by Dara Solomon, Director of the Ontario Jewish Archives, entitled "My College Street": An interesting visual history of the Jewish businesses—delis, bakeries, photography studios, billiards, and theatres—that once thrived on College, west of Spadina.

SHUL MATTERS

DANIEL CAMENIETZKI LIBRARY NEWS

What does it mean to live one's life as a mensch? Oliver Sacks' memoir, *On the Move*, gives us some keys to this endeavour. As you may know, Sacks is a neurologist who wrote the book *Awakenings*, a clinical study of his encephalitic patients whom he brought back to consciousness after they were for years in a state of being "asleep" and not aware of their situations. It drew me to his work because of the deep empathy with which he approached his subjects. Always, he treats people with an admiration for how they have adapted to intriguing neurological conditions.

You might call his autobiography a case study of himself. The cover alone is worth the price of admission. It is a picture of a very handsome and virile youth astride a motorcycle. It contrasts with the bespectacled, bearded, classic clinician appearance of his middle and now elderly age.

Something we learn about him is that he is a gay man whose sexuality has had great influence on his emotional life. Something else we learn about him is that he is Jewish. He was very close to his mother, a physician herself. She had a very negative reaction to finding out about his sexual orientation, and told him that she wished he had never been born. She never spoke of the subject again. Naturally, Sacks was devastated by her reaction. He tried to reconcile himself to her rejection by telling himself that she was brought up Orthodox in the late 19th century, and so her reaction could be explained by the time and place in which she was raised. But the wound still went deep and affected Sacks' ability to be comfortable with this aspect of his identity.


Even so, when his mother died, he called it the greatest loss of his life.

Happily, at the end of the book, Sacks finds love and a relationship toward the end of his life and the end of his story. But there is a sad coda. After the book was published, he learned that the cancer that was confined to his eye had become terminal. He subsequently published an essay in which he comes to grips with the disease.

Sacks is an all-too human human being. If one has ever felt clumsy and inept in life, one can take heart by looking to the good doctor as an example of how to thrive in this world.

Check out Oliver Sacks' book from the library for an extensive reflection on a life well lived.
