The Power of Music and Community

"The power of music" is commonly imagined as an art form that evokes a heightened emotional and physical state of being. Music brings people together, it heals, it energizes, and it stimulates parts of the brain that can literally heal damage to the body.

My cousin was a music therapist and spent much of her lifetime working with patients and helping in emotional and physical recovery. She did this as a second career and talked about the life-changing force that music had on her patients. I have witnessed physical and emotional transformations in hospital settings with both loved ones and congregants that, even if momentary, bring peace and comfort to those who are suffering.

Music also connects us—one to another—and to something much greater than ourselves. It is THE universal language that speaks to all.

I can think of countless moments when music has connected me to complete strangers. When everyone stands at a ballgame, singing the national anthem, or "Take Me Out to the Ball Game," I get teary. I can't explain why, other than that the community feels as one as they raise their voices together, and that sound is powerful beyond words. When I travel with groups of people, the bonds made are largely due to the shared musical experiences. When we sang "El Male Rachamim" in a recently-discovered hidden makeshift synagogue in Terezin, we all wept. It was more than being together in this sad and sacred space. The music swept us off our feet and bonded us for life.

We need community more than ever right now. There is so much sadness and confusion and anger in the world. Everywhere we look, it is there—it is inescapable. My own children, in the past few months, have been talking more than they ever have about their Jewish identities and their need for Jewish community.

In a September 24, 2023 *New York Times* op-ed entitled, "Want to Fight Anti-Semitism? Embrace Jewish Traditions," Deborah Lipstadt explains a moment while teaching at Emory University. "I noticed one of my students was wearing a kipa, or skullcap, something he had not done previously. Before I could consider whether to comment on his new attire, he pointed at his kipa and proudly—if not gleefully—proclaimed that, with antisemitism rising, he was intent on showing haters they could not frighten him. Rather than hiding, he told me, he would tell the world that he was a Jew. I appreciated his moxie, but my heart broke a little bit. He had handed our oppressors power over his identity. He had been pushed, not pulled, closer to his tradition".

Lipstadt suggests that in the face of anti-Semitism, the best way for Jews to respond is to come together in solidarity; to let the beautiful traditions of Judaism guide us and pull us closer to our Jewish identities.

Music is a catalyst for bringing people together and strengthening relationships. The Temple's Cultural Arts mission is to bring people together, to build community, through diverse art forms.

On the weekend of February 9-11, we welcome Elana Arian, one of the Jewish world's most gifted singer/songwriters, and whose music is a staple in our Shabbat services. She will join our Temple's choirs and bands for a weekend of soulful uplifting music that will surely lift our community in spirit and camaraderie. On Sunday, February 25 we celebrate the milestone (100th) birthday of Janice Rothschild Blumberg with an interview with WABE's Lois Reitzes as she takes us on her lifetime journey through beautiful pictures and art. The community building continues on the weekend of March 8-10 with the first ever Women's Wellness Weekend, as we come together for an unforgettable experience of music, prayer, learning and connecting.

We all need more music in our lives. I hope that you will find that spark of the divine in the musical and arts community with all of us at The Temple!


Project Connect

Why are you passionate about Women's Rights and **Gender Equality?**

Woman's reproductive rights and gender equality is a topic that I have spent my life fighting for. Do you know that in Judaism woman are considered on a higher spiritual plane? However, throughout history, women have had to continually fight for equality. As a wife and mother, it boggles my mind that still woman are not seen as equals to men in so many facets of our society. From equal pay to bodily autonomy, it is a topic that I will never stop fighting for.

What is one thing your group has accomplished that you are proud of?

In 2015 Roses for Roe was started as a way to spread the mission of Planned Parenthood and raise awareness. In 2017 It was first hosted by The Temple and Temple member Elaine B. Alexander. It has now become the second largest fundraiser for Planned Parenthood Southeast, and The Temple has played a large part in making it successful. Another fantastic program that I thought was particularly powerful was a conversation with Healthy Mothers, Healthy Babies, raising awareness about the maternal mortality rate in Georgia.
