

All in Moderation

ewish tradition encourages us to enjoy life—food, alcohol, sex, hot baths—but all of it we are commended to enjoy only in moderation. I would posit that this Jewish infatuation with avoiding extremism is more important and relevant today than at any time in our history.

There is a simple statement in Proverbs that says: "Do not swerve to the right or the left; Keep your feet from evil." This straightforward statement reminds us every day to follow the middle path of moderation and to avoid walking on the path of extremes. So much of the world tries to justify extremist activity under the guise of holiness. Our faith rejects both ascetism and excessiveness, asking us, instead, to embrace the middle, and it is on the middle path that holiness can be found.

About a decade ago, it was not popular for Jews to engage in partnerships with individuals or groups with whom we agreed on one issue but disagreed on others. Today, it is almost impossible to find people who agree with us on everything. As such, we should build relationships with many different groups. We don't have to agree on every matter to be in conversation.

Remember, engaging with someone of a completely different ideology does not need to be viewed as validating their views. In fact, Jewish tradition suggests the opposite: Sh'tikah k'hodaah, "silence is like assent." It is not engaging, but rather disengaging, that is viewed as validating.

With antisemitism (Jew hatred) on the rise—we often have an obligation to speak truth to power. If not to persuade others, we are to speak up to mark our disagreement with false contentions and harmful propositions. There is so much at stake in the marketplace of ideas. We must learn to determine when to simply ignore faulty marginal ideas and when to openly confront them.

But, sometimes we disagree about the issues of the day. This is when we must step out of our respective comfort zones to learn about those who view things differently from us.

In the Exodus narrative, Moses could have merely waged war and led a slave uprising. Alternatively, he could have advocated having the Israelites avoid the risk of resistance by simply remaining slaves. Moses chose neither extreme. Instead, he approached Pharoah and engaged him in the pursuit of justice.

We can be like Moses, too. We can trust in truth and moral values to triumph over extremism—if we learn to live with holiness in our lives.

About Rabbi Berg:

Peter Berg became the fifth senior rabbi of The Temple since 1895 in July 2008. He is thrilled to serve this diverse and multigenerational congregation as a spiritual leader. Rabbi Berg is passionate about Jewish learning and meaningful worship, and he is an advocate for social change. A native of Ocean Township, New Jersey, Rabbi Berg holds a degree in Education and Human Development, with a focus in human services, counseling and Judaic Studies from George Washington University in Washington, D.C. He earned his M.A. in Hebrew Literature and his rabbinic ordination from Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in New York and Jerusalem. In 2013 Rabbi Berg was named by Newsweek and the Daily Beast as one of the most influential rabbis in the United States. In 2016, he was named by Georgia Trend as one of the 100 most influential Georgians and in 2019 and 2020 as one of Atlanta's most powerful leaders.

RSJI – Voting at the Center

We, at the Rothschild Social Justice Institute, believe every person who is eligible to vote has the right to vote in an easily accessible manner. We also believe in the importance of an informed electorate. In the days and weeks leading up to the general election, we plan to provide you with information about the voting process in Georgia. Be assured that as 501c3, The Temple does not endorse any party or candidate.

IMPORTANT DATES

General Election-November 8, 2022

- August 22- October 28: Absentee ballot application period
- October 10: Elections Offices begin mailing absentee ballots
- October 11: Voter registration deadline
- October 17: Advance in-person voting begins
- November 4: Advance in-person voting ends; access to drop boxes ends
- November 8: General Election

VOTING in GA is EASY!

Here's how!

Register to vote... Update or confirm your registration. Know where and when to vote. Go to MVP.SOS.GA.GOV to

- Register to vote ASAP if you're not already registered.
- Log in to check your registration: confirm correct name, address, birthdate
- Update it if you moved or changed your name. See sample ballots. Locate your election day polling place or early voting poll locations
- Find election dates, early voting dates and locations.

 Request an absentee ballot if you can't vote in person

Never miss an election... Go to TURBOVOTE.ORG to sign up for election alerts by text or email.

Have the right ID... Go to DDS.GEORGIA.GOV/VOTER

- See acceptable forms of ID to vote. There are several options including Georgia
- Don't have an ID? Get one ASAP. VoteRiders can help: call or text 844-338-8743.

Plan to vote in every election... Go to

- . Vote EARLY in any poll place in your county up to 3 weeks before Election Day,
- Vote on Election Day at your assigned precinct (log in at MVP.SOS.GA.GOV),
- Vote by mail if you can't vote in person. Contact your county for application
- . Stay informed and know who and what are on the ballot.


