A Letter to Dianne Ratowsky on the Occasion of Her 41 Years of Service to Temple and Retirement

Dear Dianne,

We often hear it said about Jewish honorees that he or she is so righteous that we refer to him or her as a *tzadik*. Elie Wiesel famously said: "The tzadik is no angel. The tzadik is simply more human than his or her followers." You, our friend Dianne, are one of the great *tsaddikim* of this generation. God, after all, has plenty of angels. What God needs is more holy human beings. More people who exemplify kindness, strength, and love like Dianne Ratowsky.

Over these past forty plus years, you have been at the center of everything at Temple. You have helped every bride to get ready, given each b'nei mitzvah student confidence, and been the first to console members in times of bereavement. Your depth of caring and concern for every person who calls The Temple home is unparalleled. A reporter once asked us both (over a decade ago)—why we each thought The Temple was selected as one of the fifty most vibrant congregations in the country. We both answered without hesitation: Dianne Ratowsky!

Psychologists have long divided people into two categories. The categories are not good and bad, for no one is entirely either one of these. The two kinds of people in the world are people *who lift up* and people *who lean on*. Dianne, you are a person who lifts us all up. You model for our entire staff what it means to be kind, to go the extra mile, to encourage others, and to bring dignity to those in need. You are an eternal optimist who believes that there is always another angle—always a possibility for a better outcome.

You know each soul at Temple, our current situation, our past history and our future hopes and dreams. You encourage us in happy times and support us through difficult ones. You keep us grounded in The Temple, our congregation, and our community.

For both of us, you were the first face we saw at Temple every morning and the last to say goodnight before heading home. You have become part of our own families and are adored by Barbara, Karen and all our children.

Dianne, you have paved the way for future generations. Your imprint is indelible—and many generations into the future will be shaped by you. As we celebrate your more than forty years of service to The Temple, we say *chazak*, *chazak*, *v'nitchazek*—

Freedom Day Bailout 2023

For the past few years, The Temple has partnered with the Historic Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta with other houses of worship and community organizations to bail loved ones out of jail in commemoration of the Juneteenth holiday. The Multifaith Initiative to End Mass Incarceration, a non-profit founded by The Temple and Ebenezer, led the Freedom Day Bailout - one component of our Freedom Day Project Campaign seeking to put an end to the unfair incarceration of disproportionately poor, black and brown people before their trial commences. We aim to shift prosecutor and judicial behavior with respect to bail and also to push local and statewide legislative bodies to proactively combat wealth-based detention. Our efforts are inspired by work being done by the National Bailout Network to fight the injustices of cash bail. Since 2018, we have posted over \$700,000 in bail bond funds to bring community members' home. Through working with public defenders and connecting our participants to direct service providers, we hope to serve as community support as their cases are adjudicated. There are many ways to help, including fundraising, communications, community education, jail intake coordination, and organizing care packages. RSJI: Green Team Update

The Rothschild Social Justice Institute's Environmental Protection & Sustainability group seeks out ways to reduce our synagogue's energy use. Recently, with the help of Executive Director Emeritus Mark Jacobson, Past President Jon Amsler, and the maintenance team, we've replaced the fluorescent light bulbs in the offices, the conference rooms around the chapel, and the workroom near the sanctuary with LED bulbs. What's the impact?

- We now use less than half the power than with the former bulbs in the areas where lights are typically in use 6 days
- We have recouped the cost of the new bulbs through reduction in The Temple's power bill in less than one year.
- We have ongoing savings to our power bill and reduced environmental impact of operating our synagogue.


Increase in Mental

The Atlanta region has 11 host sites, including local universities (UGA, Kennesaw State, Georgia Tech, Clark, Atlanta Tech), private schools (AIS, Galloway, Holy Innocents', Purpose Built, Woodward) and THE TEMPLE!

By building a scholar's literacy, math, swimming, and other life skills, the program aims to **eliminate critical barriers to success and clear the path for possibilities.** As scholars are expected to return year after year, the long-term investment and connection with the student/family are impactful and unique.
