Yossi Klein Halevi & Walid Issa in Conversation

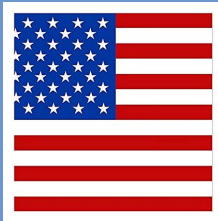

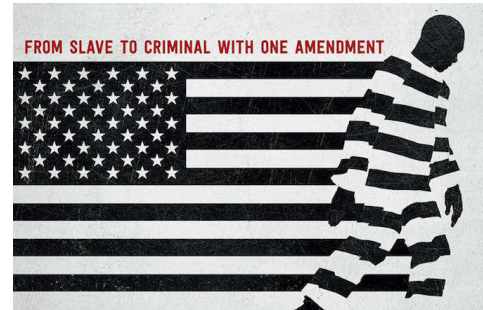
