Saturday, Sept 15th | After Kiddush

There is an ancient rabbinic tradition to dedicate the Shabbat between Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur to studying the topic of teshuva - return and repentance with the community. Following this tradition, Ebn will offer a teaching to the community on Shabbat after Kiddush. This teaching will focus on a Lurianic meditation on the physical act of striking one's chest during the ritual of confession. We will use this text as a starting point for reflection on the questions - Where is teshuva bringing us back to? What is the role of ritual confession in that process? How do the emotions of love and guilt function in the process of personal transformation?

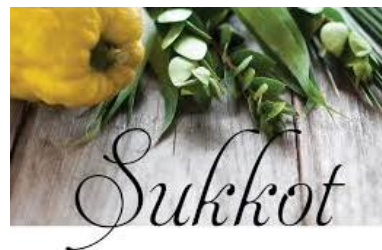

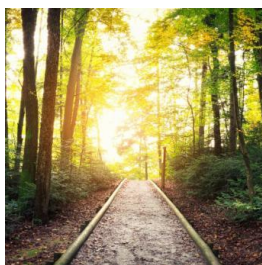

Rally in Copley Square to Support Transgender Rights!

THIS SUNDAY, September 16th | 10-11:30am

Join us at a massive rally to support transgender people this Sunday in Copley Square. If you're voting YES on ballot question #3 this November, to uphold important civil rights protections for transgender people, make your voice heard!

Why is it important to vote YES on 3?

This election, Massachusetts Ballot Question #3 asks voters if they want to keep current state non-discrimination law, which makes it illegal to deny service to transgender in public spaces such stores and hospitals, and which allows people to use the bathroom that matches their gender identity. Opponents are falsely claiming men will masquerade as women to attack women and children in restrooms. **The work we do at these phone banks and in-person canvasses is vital to educating the people of Massachusetts about these issues, and ensuring these important civil rights are upheld.**
