

From our President: A Gathering Together



Wow! It's hard to believe, but our current Temple year (and my first year as president of the congregation) is winding down. I want to share with you some of its

highlights.

In June 2015, ST-KA was the first congregation in Northeast Ohio to adopt a philanthropic membership model. Our conversations with current and prospective members evolved — away from “dues” and toward a discussion of our community, spirituality, education, Judaism, and more. We have added 25 member families to our rolls — that's new ideas, new voices, more children in the religious school, more engagement. It's invigorating and refreshing to all of us.

The High Holy Days sparkled with amazing weather and a worship service for everyone. The sun shown brightly for our *Tashlich* ceremony at Shaker Lakes, where we cast our sins away (and fed the ducks).

Participating in the November URJ Biennial as part of the ST-KA delegation was, as always, an inspiring and deepening spiri-

tual experience. Our board, leadership team, and membership reaps the benefits of our learning and networking. November also found us with a packed house when we hosted author Shulem Deen at our annual Jewish Book Festival event.

Chanukah saw the dedication of our beautiful new Shabbat and High Holy Day Torah covers, created by Jeanette Kuvin Oren with the support of many generous donors. They are magnificent! I am awed every time the Ark is opened.

In January, a record number of women participated in the annual *Kol Nashim* Women's Shabbat, a beautiful and moving worship experience. In February, we welcomed renowned glass and metal artist Gary Rosenthal as artist-in-residence. Our students and dozens of members enjoyed making their own Judaic art under Gary's tutelage.

March brought Purim, the Purim carnival, Pints on Purim, and a comedic Purim *shpiel*. Can you tell it's one of our congregation's favorite holidays? As I write in early April and it's snowing outside, at Temple we're thinking spring — preparing for Passover with both the Congregational Learners' Seder

and the *Kol Nashim* Women's Seder. There is still so much more to come in May and June.

Transitions: We said goodbye to our long-time staff member (48 years), **Lois Bryant**, as she retired to enjoy family, bowling, and her favorite team (Go Indians!). We're sad to see Music Director **Bruce Shewitz** leave the congregation as he retires and heads off to New York for new adventures. Administrative assistants **Jill Ebenstein** and **Audrey Katzman** found new full-time positions. Our soloist **Laura Lindauer** has taken the helm as interim music director, and we welcomed **Dale Hopkins** and **Jonathan Payes** to our support staff.

To close, while it may seem as if we are winding down, our senior staff and lay leaders are very busy gearing up for 2016-2017. YOU! Last year, we began a new membership model which we call Open Doors. It is a paradigm shift, a statement of fundamental belief that membership in the Suburban Temple-Kol Ami community is first and foremost about all of the reasons that we choose to affiliate.

We want you to enter and partner with us through any of the doors that are open to you — religious school, Men's Club, worship, Vintage, *Kol Nashim*, and much, much more.

I am writing to update you on our first year of Open Doors and alert you that the new membership year begins on July 1.

Open Doors is working! We have 25 new member families since last June. They range from newlyweds and young families to more seasoned and experienced travelers on life's journey. Many have become regulars at services, adult education, and religious school. Others are engaging more slowly, in the manner that they feel is right.

Over 60% of our members increased their membership commitment last year. Thank you! The remainder is evenly split between a flat renewal of previous years' dues and a reduction. We were able to reach our financial targets for membership commitments.

In all cases, a pledge makes you a member — no matter the size of the gift.

Pledge forms for the coming year will be mailed at the end of May. As we approach the second year of Open Doors, your continued support is critical to the long term health of ST-KA, of your congregation.

When you receive your membership commitment form, please review the new sus-

taining gift level. Decide if you can reach that number, give more than that, increase this year's gift by 10%, or if you need to reduce your gift a bit. Whatever your decision, please fill it out immediately and return it to us. Please give as generously as you can. If you have questions or concerns, your president, Kim Rosner, Rabbi Vann, Ronni Bialosky (our membership vice president) and I are all able to answer your questions.

I often reflect on the Hebrew word, *kehillah*, which means community. We are blessed with an amazing *kehillah* here at Suburban Temple-Kol Ami. Please allow your membership commitment to continue keeping it strong.


Parents' Night Out


