# The Chutzpah to Seek and to Find



Pabbi Menachem Mendle of Kotzk once asked his disciples if they could tell him where God dwelled. Surprised they answered, "How can you ask such a thing? Is not the whole world filled with God's glory?!" Then the Rabbi answered, "God dwells wherever we let God in."

A child was playing hide-and-seek with a friend. After some time, he realized that his friend had abandoned the

game, and he ran crying to his grandfather. "I hid, but my friend didn't look for me." His grandfather lamented, "It is the same with God. God says, 'I hide, but nobody seeks me."

A 10-year-old girl is hard at work in class drawing a picture. The teacher approaches and asks, "What are you doing?" The girl replies, "I am drawing God." "But nobody has ever seen God," says the teacher. The girl looks up and responds, "They will in a minute."

We may know that God is everywhere, but we still have to seek God and be willing to let God in. And sometimes knowing and searching are not enough. Sometimes we need to see God.

This year the Our Tent Faculty had been learning from a book entitled *The Chutzpah Imperative: Living a Life that Matters*. In it the author, Rabbi Edward Feinstein, dares us to have the *chutzpah*, the guts, to ask the big, the deep, and the challenging questions. Doing so, he posits, will lead to a more meaningful Judaism and a more meaningful life.

The theme for Our Tent this year has been "Dare to..." and for the next three months I would like us to dare to ask the questions we may not have had the *chutzpah* to ask before.

#### Some questions for this month:

When/How do you let God in? Where do you search for God? Where do you find God? What do you see when you see God?

May we continue to create a sacred community of learning as we ask and endeavor to answer together.

FREE (now over 1 million books) to needy children. We at ST-KA are now a part of it. If you haven't done so before, please check out their website: kidsbookbank.org.

Flash forward to the present—ST-KA has held two (with another pending) mitzvah events at KBB and collected many boxes of children's books. These have been taken to KBB and subsequently delivered to dozens, if not hundreds of children in the Cleveland area.

The next phase of our involvement began in October of 2018. ST-KA has committed to

help with a Little Free Library (LFL.) Our initial goal is to stock one LFL, at least once a month. We hope to ramp this up in the future. 

Our noses may be cold but our *lewiot* (hearts) are warm! Here's what's doing to keep our hearts going:




