Seeing the Invisible



ver the last number of years, conversations among Jewish professionals have emerged about the attendance at High Holy Day services, which has significantly decreased.

It's true that High Holy Day services can be difficult to follow or understand. The goal of our new High Holy Day *mahzor* (prayer book) is to make the worship more

accessible, relevant, and engaging. The additional readings and essays in the volumes are there to bring deeper meaning and value to the experience.

Judaism, teaches Rabbi Alan Lew, reiterates a profound teaching: that the *invisible* is more important than the *visible*.

Our visible worlds are made up of that which we deal with every day, and that which does provide fulfillment: our homes, those we care about, our jobs. Our visible world takes up the bulk of our time and energy.

Our invisible world is that internal driver. It is so often hard to describe, but is often our primary driver in life. It is so important, that Rabbi Lew writes, "It is only beneath the surface of this world that the real and unseen drama of our lives is unfolding..." We often describe the invisible layer as our souls and our hearts.

The focus is on the busy-ness of the tasks of daily life. Therefore we may not pay enough attention to our hearts and souls (the invisible)—and that which is so primary.

However, as Rabbi Alan Lew wrote, "Every soul needs to express itself. Every heart needs to crack itself open. Every one of us needs to move from anger to healing, from denial to consciousness, from boredom to renewal..."

The High Holy Days provide the opportunity to look to the invisible. When we fasten onto the "high" in these High Holy Days we can look upward even as we look inward. Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur allow us to articulate, or re-articulate, to ourselves, our primary, innermost thoughts and needs.

This year, I know that our hearts and souls will express themselves during our High Holy Day experiences at Suburban Temple-Kol Ami.

We encourage you to keep your eyes open for opportunities to connect with a friendly group of women in a welcoming atmosphere.


