LET MY PEOPLE SIGN!

Our sacred right to access life-saving medical care and our religious freedom will be on the ballot this November and you can help put it there!

This Passover, as we experience our people's journey from slavery to freedom, we are commanded to wrestle with the themes of oppression and freedom in our world

today. In Ohio, reproductive freedom hangs by a thread in the form of a court order that can be overturned shortly. Torah defines a fetus as a potential life - different and distinct from a human life - and teaches us to value the pregnant person's life first and foremost. Reproductive Freedom aligns with our Jewish values.

This year, RAC-OH joins the Ohioans for Reproductive Freedom coalition in a campaign to pass abortion rights through a ballot amendment during the Fall election. Just like the Israelites who joined with a "mixed multitude," reclaimed their freedom, and rose up out of Egypt, Ohio's Reform Jews are joining forces with a diverse coalition to take back reproductive freedom in our state. Our teens are awesome! Whether it is tech support, office help, or working with our younger learners, they set a great example of what it means to be a lifelong learner, and to give back to your community.


Our learners are the heart of our program. Our Tent would literally not exist without them! I want to thank each of them for their thoughtful participation, and for all the lessons they have taught us.

Following services on March 24th, ST-KA welcomed **Jeff Robertson**, Deputy Director of Community Wide Security for JFC, to give a security briefing. "There are haters out there that want to cause harm to the community," Jeff said. "We are continually staying ahead of those people that might want to cause harm."

What can each of us do? Jeff had two important suggestions:

1. **KEEP YOUR EYES OPEN.** Notice things that are out of the ordinary, things that give you "that feeling" that something isn't right.



2. IF YOU SEE SOMETHING, TELL SOMEBODY ABOUT IT!

There is a JFC Security Officer on duty at ST-KA who will look into it. Trust your instincts; "situational awareness" helps keep us all safe.


