

#### WHAT SUMMER MEANS

Summer in Cleveland is special. After months of cold and gray, unpredictable and damp—it's sunny and bright.

Parks and neighborhoods are filled with walkers and runners and cyclists enjoying the lush greenery, beautiful flowers, and majestic trees against perfect blue skies.

I think we're all a little friendlier in summer; there's so much

fun to be had! Late night sunshine means grilling and patio dining. Community pools, golf courses are open; the Metroparks paths are most accessible. Families with school-age children excitedly pack for overnight camp or happily prepare for day camps and adventures.

During these beautiful days, it is tempting to put to the side challenging or difficult issues—especially if they do not have an immediate or direct effect on us.

But we cannot do so. Rather, let's ask the sun and landscapes to give us strength for the continued work for a more just and equitable Ohio.

First, our continued work for collecting signatures to put a citizen-led amendment on the Ohio ballot this November. This amendment protects reproductive freedom in the state's constitution. Reproductive freedom is religious freedom; it is health care; it is racial justice. Please sign the petition—and make sure everyone you know does as well. To get involved, email Rabbi Vann: avann@suburbantemple.org.

Even as we collect signatures, we face a new challenge: a special election has been called for August 8. If passed, State Issue 1 would require future citizen-led ballot initiatives and constitutional amendments to have a 60% majority for passage. Furthermore, it would dramatically increase the requirements to even qualify to get something onto the ballot in the first place! State Issue 1 is a direct attack on the reproductive freedom amendment for the November ballot. Ballot initiatives exercise citizen freedom to make decisions that directly affect our lives in Ohio; it's the end of majority rule. Please vote NO in the August 8 election.

As we enjoy the sunshine and the beauty of Cleveland in the summer, I hope it inspires us to pick up the work that will make Ohio even more just and beautiful.


#### **Thank you and Congratulations**


## MAH RABU-HOW GREAT IT IS!

Each morning we recite a prayer called *Yotzer Or*, which thanks God for the world that God created. It is a prayer that we sing part of each Sunday during Our Tent *t'filah*. The full prayer

contains the verse from Psalms "Mah rabu ma'asechah Adonai, kulum bechochma asita malah ha'aretz kinyanecha!" Literally, how many are the things You have made, Adonai. You have made them all with wisdom, the earth is full of Your creations!

Your creations!

In his work, *The Book of Miracles*, Rabbi Lawrence Kushner teaches the following:



Rabbi Menachem Nahum from the Ukrainian town of Chernobyl taught that you can find God's presence everywhere. "There is nothing besides the presence of God...and the presence of the Creator remains in each created thing."...if you design and build a house, your presence dwells in that house. We are in what we make. And because God made the whole universe, God can be found everywhere within it.

When we say that God is everywhere, it does not mean that God is invisible. It means that if we look closely, we can find God's presence hidden everywhere because God created everything. And because God is hidden in everything, all things are connected to one another...

We are joined therefore, not only to people who have lived long before us and who will live after we have died, but to people now living, to people we do not know. Invisible lines of depending are everywhere, as if millions of glistening threads tie us to the universe and the universe to us. Nothing is ever detached, alone. We are all parts of one great living organism.

For the SEVENTH year of Our Tent our learning theme will be "Mah Rabu – Living a Life of Wonder and Awe". We will discover the greatness of the world God created, the awesomeness of all the places we can find God in it, and the wonder of all the ways we are connected. We will spend the year uncovering all the places we can find God, ourselves and community in this miracle of a world we live in.

Because of when the High Holy Days fall this year, we will not begin Our Tent until Sunday, October 1, 2023. Please look for First Trimester registration information in your Temple Times in late July and in your August Bulletin.
