BUILDING A LEGACY

A "legacy business" is a great company which has built successful products and services over a long period of time. However, along with the history and success comes a burden: business models, processes, and solutions are outdated and cumbersome and the company is experienced as either difficult or out of touch

There is a difficult analogy to be made between the "legacy business" and the institution of the synagogue. With the analogy above, synagogues are perceived to be "stuck"; unresponsive to today's needs. Additionally, the need to belong is less pressing than in years past. Thirdly, Jewish meaning-making is easier, especially with the aid of the internet.

The data drives this analogy—here are two examples:

In 2021, the Pew Report published a report on Jewish Practices and Customs in the United States, noting major shifts in the beliefs and behavior of the American Jew: only 35% say they live in a household where at least one member belongs to a synagogue.

In 2023, Jewish Education Project published a census of supplemental schools with data collected between 2019-2020, comparing data from a 2006-2007 survey. With data from 1,250 synagogue schools, there was a marked decrease in enrollment: "one could compare the 230,000 students in 2006-2007 to 135,087 in 2019-2020."

The research reflects what we know: synagogues are smaller.

This is a dire picture.

And now I will surprise you: I've never been more sure of the future of Suburban Temple-Kol Ami.

Courage, vision and innovation is the bedrock of our Jewish tradition and helped to sustain Jewish life for thousands of years. Suburban Temple-Kol Ami is built on the same foundation of courage, vision and innovation by our founding members.

Thanks to them, we meet challenges with agile responses:

Exploring the needs of our members and the shifts of society--and providing relevant, timely answers—has been a particular goal and success of this congregation: We're the first congregation to welcome interfaith couples; the first congregation to recognize a need for a person-centered dues model (Open Doors); the first congregation to disrupt supplemental education by creating Our Tent, a one-of-a-kind, nationally recognized learning model.

We are not a congregation "stuck" in our legacy—we're buoyed and inspired by it.

I am so excited by what's to come.


