#### A MESSAGE OF GRATEFULNESS, A MOMENT OF BLESSING



It's been a magnificent fall. The leaves have become jewel-box colors, and now the trees are shedding their leaves in preparation for colder weather. The crispness makes everything feel outlined with clarity. As we approach Thanksgiving, the message of gratefulness prevails.

Thanksgiving was established in 1863, when President Abraham Lincoln declared two national Thanksgivings; one in August to commemorate the Battle of Gettysburg during the Civil War, and the other in November to

give thanks for "general blessings." It's the second one that we celebrate today.

Our Thanksgiving tables are indeed an opportunity to give thanks—we often spend time with family and eat delicious food.

Judaism reminds us, additionally, to be grateful every day. We are challenged to say 100 blessings a day; our ancient rabbis understood mindfulness even a thousand years ago! Here's a prayer-poem of blessing by Alden Solovy that will serve for many occasions.

#### A Moment of Blessing

Every breath and every blink, Every moment and every heartbeat: Each one, a blessing. This is a moment of blessing. Blessings given. Blessings received.

Every trail and every vista, Every journey and every homecoming: Each one, an adventure. This is a moment of adventure. Adventures alone. Adventures together.

Every sunrise and every sunset,
Every crash of thunder and every roar of the sea:
Each one, a moment of majesty.
This is a moment of majesty.
Majesty from heaven. Majesty on earth.

Every birth and every death,
Every love and every loss:
Each one, a mystery.
This is a moment of mystery.
Mysteries hidden. Mysteries revealed.

Blessed are you, Adonai our God, God of blessings, God of adventures, God of majesty and God of mystery, You fill our days with Your glory And our lives with precious gifts. Praised are You, Source of love.

### THE RITUAL OF GRATITUDE

This past trimester I taught a class called *This I Believe*. The class was based on the radio broadcast and podcast of the same name, where people submit essays and voice recordings representing their core beliefs. As we approach Thanksgiving, here is an essay I shared with the class, entitled *The Act of Giving Thanks*:

I believe in meaningful expressions of gratitude. More specifically, I believe in the power of the well-written thank-you letter.

My sister and I were taught at a very early age to write thank-you letters for birthday and Christmas gifts...Every year. It was an important ritual in our home, and it has turned me into an avid thank-you-letter writer as an adult.

I still send a great deal of personal mail, and I am entirely smitten with all of the trappings of letter writing: unique stamps, beautiful stationery, fountain pens. I feel an incredible rush of satisfaction sticking a stamp on a carefully penned thank-you letter and sending it off in the mail.

Nearly every Monday morning I sit down with my favorite pen and write a few thank-yous. I write them for parties I attend, dinners I'm fed, or just to thank a friend for listening. It is one of the highlights of my week.

Several years ago, I even sent my mom a thank-you letter to thank her for teaching me to count my blessings on paper. Sending letters of thanks out into the world has made me more appreciative of the tremendous love, support, and kindness I receive daily.

My father died when I was twenty-seven. Even then, I found comfort in writing letters of thanks for the many gifts of words I received. At a time when all I wanted to do was retreat into my own grief, the act of giving thanks forced me to stay connected to the world and to the lives of the living.

And while it may seem trivial, my belief in well-written thank-you letters has secured my popularity. Since real thank-you letters are woefully few and far between, my social graces are considered a charming eccentricity, and my friends and family always seem genuinely moved by my efforts.

I was a middle school English teacher, and as I told my students, good manners are the cornerstone of a quality community. I believe that expressions of gratitude like thank-you letters keep me going. I am more motivated to do kind things for others when I feel appreciated, and I feel that I perpetuate kindness and generosity by genuinely expressing my thanks.

What many people consider to be a dreadful chore has become one of my favorite pastimes. So simple, the thank-you letter, but so powerful.


