


There was also social action awareness: These projects were driven by Omdim students who were raising money for their favorite causes, which they researched as part of their learning this year.





She is perhaps best known for her setting of “Mi Shebeirach,” the prayer for healing, which is used by hundreds of congregations across America. Ms. Friedman was a feminist whose music had its greatest impact on Reform and Conservative liturgy, though it also affected women's tefillah [prayer], and Orthodox feminist circles. She was a religious bard and angel for the entire community.



Instead of, or in addition to Chabad...

I just made a discovery which elicited a palm to my forehead reaction; there is an interesting, engaging Reform Jewish website for learning more about our religion and for reading about issues from a Reform Jewish perspective. The site called ReformJudaism.org: <http://www.reformjudaism.org>.

I frequently enough visit the Chabad website for technical information such as on which holidays I should light yorzeit lamps. At some point in the past, I was researching some questions about kabbalah, and found interesting information on the Chabad site, but I

vaguely wondered why I wasn't aware of something comparable from our own community. A few weeks ago, I went to the URJ website, but that was not the sort of thing I was looking for. Today I realized that a Google search on URJ is not the same as a search on Reform Judaism, et voila. (I only learned subsequently that all I had to do was check out the Jewish Community Resource Links heading in the left-hand column of The "News and Notes" weekly email.) I've included a few screen shots of the home page of that I hope will encourage you to investigate ReformJudaism.org. I plan to do this, too.

COATz Volunteers: Making Our Community A Better Place

COATz is Congregation Or Ami's social action group. The purpose of social action is to help others in the community and to repair the world. In a world where we are seeing so much sadness, this is a great opportunity to help make our community a better place.

Here are some of the things we did in the past or are currently participating in that have been extremely meaningful:

- Volunteering at the Ronald McDonald House. We made breakfast for the families staying there and visited with them.
- Participating in Warming Philly, which is clothing people in the local area with coats and warm clothing.
- Volunteered at Cradles for Crayons by sorting through clothing that goes to impoverished families.
- Participating in "Walk a Mile in Her Shoes" through the Laurel House. "Walk a Mile in Her Shoes" is an international men's march that consists of men who walk one mile in high-heeled shoes as a symbol of putting themselves in the shoes of victims of gender and sexual violence.
- Hosted "Stop Hunger Now" by packaging 10,000 meals for people starving all over the world.
- Partnered with JAFCO (Jewish Adoption and Family Care Options) and provided Chanukah wishes for children who are staying there.
- Provided Thanksgiving dinners and delivered them to local families.
- Collected items for the Norristown Ministry, which is a day shelter in Norristown that provides showers and meals for homeless people.
- Helped local families that are struggling by collecting gift cards and items for them.
- Volunteered at SHARE, which helps bring 24.6 million pounds of emergency food relief to low-income families in Philadelphia.

We know that everyone is very busy but it feels so good to participate in these different things. We hope that you will consider joining COATz and participating in some of these activities. We are always looking for new ideas and looking for people to help on the committee. It's a minimal time commitment.


