## FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

The power of coming together And the sacrifice of change

In the weekly Torah cycle, we are currently reading through the Book of Leviticus. And of the main themes of the book, from the very beginning of the very first Parsha, is sacrifice.

Sacrifice, and all of the details that come with it. Sacrifice for one person, one leader, one priest, one community, all the way up to community festivals for the entire people of Israel. Everything from a bowl of grain or a pigeon, to large farm animals and even 8 bulls at once in what is, essentially, the biggest Sukkot barbeque ever.

In the sea of Levitical details on the "how," there is much less on the "why." But the short version is...because we want something. The few things that are listed in Leviticus - to seek forgiveness, for health, for prosperity, for gratitude - are still some of the same things we pray for today. And as far as worship goes, prayer has replaced animal sacrifice. But that isn't to say that sacrifice is gone from modern Jewish communities (more on that in a moment).

Switching topics, but not really, I hope you were at one of the three incredible Purim events this past weekend (at the time of this writing). We had a fabulous Purim carnival, a wonderful off-site mix and mingle with TAS / KD on Saturday with 70ish people, and Friday night for our Shabbat, Purim Spiel, and Megillah reading we had well over 300 people! Friday night was particularly powerful. 100+ people for Shabbat dinner evenly split between TAS and KD, and triple that for the service. Families and kids all over the place. It was truly amazing - and a powerful, emotional example of the path available for our community, for our building, and for the future of Reform Judaism in central Bergen County.

I can't emphasize what that Friday evening represents. It was the largest evening gathering of the Reform Jewish community for Purim in Bergen County. It was a wonderful showcase of why our building is being retained and will be used for large community religious, social, and life cycle events in a merged Kol Dorot. There were more kids on the bimah and more people in-person for a religious service than we have had since the fall of 2019 (including the last two in-person High Holy Days).

It was a vision of what the Reform Jewish community in our area could offer. A vision that neither TAS nor Kol Dorot is capable of offering alone. It is the power of coming together.

But coming together won't happen without sacrifice. I have had many one-on-one conversations, listening to how people feel about the proposed merger. Believe me, I share the sense of loss and grief. I wish we didn't have to give up anything to gain back a vibrant Jewish community - but that is not an option. We have a path that will secure a fantastic future for Reform life in our towns. This is for us, but it is also bigger than any one of us.

And yes, we will have to give up some things to make that happen. When an ancient Israelite family or clan sacrificed a large animal, that was a really expensive loss felt by the community. If it wasn't, it wouldn't be a sacrifice. I won't get into details here, but we are on the verge of losing a lot of aspects of TAS life that we love the most, no matter what we do. That being the case, isn't it much better to sacrifice some things to gain the community that could exist, that we saw in our building this Friday, that we could continue to serve with our building and our passion, volunteerism, and leadership? This isn't to say we wouldn't lose things. Loss is the very nature of sacrifice. We have a chance to take the best of our two central Bergen County communities into the future, and I for one would love to see more of what I saw over Purim. It simply blew me away.

As always, please reach out to me. I can only move so fast, and I would love to hear from every person about how you feel about the proposed merger at this time.

## RAC'S Every Voice, Every Vote Campaign

Voting is vital to protecting and strengthening our diverse democracy. On March 20, the Religious Action Center of the Union For Reform Judaism launched its 2024 Every Voice, Every Vote Campaign, which focuses on connecting volunteers with voters who face the biggest barriers to voting and inspiring them to cast their ballots.

Since the launch of RAC's first Every Voice, Every Vote campaign in 2016, over 10,000 volunteers have contacted more than 2.5 million voters. Protecting the freedom to vote has paved the way for progress in reproductive freedom, voting rights, criminal justice reform, LGBTQ+ rights, climate justice, and more.

As we begin to prepare for the presidential election, American voters face disinformation, polarization, and increased barriers to ballot access. Additionally, significant parts of America's population don't believe that the outcome of the last election was legitimate. In this context, YOUR efforts to defend democracy and ensure that all eligible voters can cast their ballots - and that they choose to do so - are even more imperative.

Each of us has a role to play in making sure that all voters have an equal say in the decisions that will impact our lives. Through the Every Voice, Every Vote campaign, Reform Jews and their allies come together to address the most critical issues facing our communities, including:

- Protecting voting rights on the local, state, and national levels-
- Sending postcards through Reclaim our Vote to contact voters targeted by barriers
- Writing, calling, and speaking to voters who can expand reproductive freedom in states where it is on the ballot (Florida Arizona, Maryland, Nevada, and New York)
- Supporting the passage of the California Climate Justice Ballot Initiative

## Vote-By-Mail in New Jersey in 2024: A Brief Guide

The 2024 General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 5, 2024.
The 2024 Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, June 4, 2024.

There are a few changes to New Jersey Vote-By-Mail for 2024. Here's a brief guide to voting by mail in this year's elections in New Jersey.

- Eligibility: All active registered voters are entitled to vote by mail. Unaffiliated mail-in voters must declare their party affiliation with the Democratic Party or the Republican Party to vote in the June
 4, 2024 Primary Election.


## - Party Affiliation:

o Voters wishing to change their party declaration must do so by Wednesday, April 10, 2024.
o Unaffiliated voters may declare their party affiliation and vote at the polls during inperson early voting or on Primary Election Day.
o Unaffiliated mail-in voters must declare their party by Tuesday, May 28, 2024 to receive a mail-in ballot by mail, or by 3:00 p.m. on Monday, June 3, 2024 to be issued a ballot in person or by authorized messenger from the County Clerk's Office.
o Change your party using the declaration form provided by the county or online and submit it to your county Commissioner of Registration or your municipal clerk.

- Requesting a Ballot:
o By Mail: Request at least seven days before an election.
- Primary: Tuesday, May 28, 2024
- General: Tuesday, October 29, 2024
o In-Person: By 3:00 p.m. the day before the election.
- Primary: Monday, June 3, 2024
- General: Monday, November 4, 2024
- Ballot Mail-Out:
o Counties commence mailing ballots at least 45 days prior to Election Day.
- Primary: Saturday, April 20, 2024
- General: Saturday, September 21, 2024
- Voter Registration Deadline:
o Register by Tuesday, May 14, 2024 for the Primary Election.
o Register by Tuesday, October 15, 2024 for the General Election.


## - Returning Your Ballot:

o Mail: Postmarked by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, received within 6 days postelection.
o Drop Box: Place in a secure ballot drop box by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. o In-Person: Deliver to the county Board of Elections by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

- Tracking: Verify receipt of your ballot via the Track My Ballot Portal.
- Opting Out: If you usually vote by mail but prefer to vote in person, opt out through your County Clerk. If you opt out after a ballot has been issued, you may vote by provisional ballot at the polls during Early Voting or on Election Day.
- Correcting Errors: Contact your County Clerk for a replacement if you spoil or lose your ballot.
- Vote Counting: All valid ballots postmarked by Election Day and delivered by mail to the County Board of Elections no later than 144 hours (six days) from the time of the closing of the polls will be counted. Valid ballots delivered by the US Post Office no later than 48 hours (two days) without a postmark will be counted.
