Message from the Rabbi



Perhaps you have heard this quip: "All Jewish holidays go like this: They tried to kill us. We won. Let's eat!" This joke always draws a chuckle of recognition and as we approach Chanukah I've been wondering how true the witticism is. Upon review we see that it's not exactly true. There is no great festive meal associated with Chanukah or Purim. To be sure, there are hamantaschen on Purim and there are latkes on Chanukah but these are merely ethnic foods and they carry no legal weight. Only on Passover do we retell the story of a defeated enemy during a great meal that is central to the holiday.

But great meal or no great meal, these three holidays do concern anti-Semitic rulers (or their henchmen) who would have preferred us subservient or dead, and they do teach us how we might respond to anti-Semitism in our own day.

Chanukah is an innocent holiday, when children play with dreidels and fried foods are eaten. Though King Antiochus really reigned in Assyria in the year 168 BCE, Chanukah plays turn him into little more than a cartoon figure. What we do learn from Chanukah is this - and the lesson is very real: sometimes it is necessary to take up arms and fight against those who would oppress us.

Then there is Pesach where God performs miracles that save us. The horror of anti-Semitism is taken up at our family seders, where we discuss the themes of political and religious freedom. Two thousand years ago our Sages encouraged us to prolong our family gatherings in order to discuss these topics in depth. And in medieval times even as blood libels were cast at us, we were in our homes, discussing and pondering how there were those who rose up to hurt us in every generation. On Passover we are taught that sometimes the only strategy for survival is to escape.

Finally there is Purim where the theme of anti-Semitism appears in a fairy tale story of a little Jewish girl who gets to be Queen. There are no great sermons to give on the evening we read the Megillah. Little children are reassured that they can make fun of murderous figures and that the bad guy will lose. And we adults learn that we should never be afraid to identify ourselves as Jews. Here we learn of a third strategy for our survival: it is good to have connections in high places in order to circumvent those who would seek our harm. (I spoke about this strategy at the Friday night service before Thanksgiving in my remarks on the national election.)

"They tried to kill us. We won. Let's eat!" I suppose there is some truth in the joke. But the one-liner does not do justice to our holidays and the variety of ways we are taught to respond to the ever-living plague of anti-Semitism.

CDT Rabbi Search Update

The CDT Rabbi Search Committee has made some terrific progress, and we wanted to take this opportunity to update the congregation. There are 16 congregants who make up the search committee. The committee was selected to be representative of CDT's demographics and leadership.

We are thrilled to let the congregation know that we have identified several candidates who are vibrant, engaged, and excited about the possibility of joining CDT. The committee could not be more pleased with the progress, and we are confident that the strong pool of candidates will allow us to have some terrific options to choose from.

The first step in the selection process was to develop a comprehensive profile of CDT to submit to the CCAR (Central Conference of American Rabbis) (www.ccarnet.org). The CCAR manages the placement process for Rabbis. They are a resource for both congregations and Rabbis. All URJ (Union for Reform Judaism) Rabbis are placed through this organization. The Rabbis who are interested in finding a new congregation review profiles submitted to the CCAR and then submit their resumes and personal statements if they are interested.

The profile was developed by the committee after consulting with the CCAR, discussions with our Interim Rabbi, reviewing past search committee profiles, and through multiple meetings and extensive discussions and research by committee members. Our profile was submitted in the beginning of September.

We received our first group of resumes about 2 weeks after the profile was submitted. A total of 10 resumes have been received to date. The committee has conducted 9 phone & video interviews to date with the candidates. Of the 9 candidates interviewed so far, 6 were asked to continue to the next steps of our process.

The search process consists of phone/video interviews, written responses to questions, an interactive discussion with the committee, reference checks, reviews of Rabbi's sermons and public activities, visit to the Rabbi's current congregation, and a visit for the Rabbi and their family to CDT.

We will continue to keep the congregation updated on our progress. Once we have narrowed down the pool, we will invite them to come to CDT and meet our congregation before we make a final recommendation to the Board of Directors.



Hanukkah Blessings



Candles are added to the *Hanukkiyah* from right to left but are kindled from left to right. The newest candle is lit first. (On the Shabbat of Hanukkah, kindle the Hanukkah lights first and then the Shabbat candles.)

Light the *Shamash* - the helper candle - first, using it to kindle the rest of the Hanukkah lights and say or sing:

Recite every night:

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם אֲשֶׁר קִדְּשָׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתָיו וְצִוָּנוּ לְהַדְלִיק נֵר שֶׁל חֲנֻכָּה.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tsivanu l'hadlik ner shel Chanukah.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who hallows us with mitzvot, commanding us to kindle the Hanukkah lights.

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם שֶׁעָשָׂה נִסִּים לְאַבוֹתֵינוּ וְאִמּוֹתֵינוּ בַּיָּמִים הָהֵם בְּזִמְנֵי הַזֶּה.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, she-asah nisim laavoteinu v'imoteinu bayamim hahaim baz'man hazeh.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who performed wondrous deeds for our ancestors in days of old at this season.

Recite the first night only:

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם שֶׁהַחַיֵּינוּ וְקִיְּמָנוּ וְהַגִּיעָנוּ לְזִמְנֵי הַזֶּה.

Baruch atah, Adonai eloheinu, Melech haolam, shehecheyanu v'kiy'manu v'higianu laz'man hazeh.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, for giving us life, for sustaining us, and for enabling us to reach this season.




