Dear friends.

When you receive this, I will have been serving Congregation Dor Tamid and its families for four months. These past months have been exciting, challenging, and a great learning experience for me as you and I have come to know each other and begin our relationship together. It has been a truly great four months, but on the weekend of November 10th and 11th, I will be honored to formally assume the role of senior rabbi of Congregation Dor Tamid. Some of you will point out that since I am already the senior rabbi, this celebration seems to come a few months too late. It has been a privilege to worship with you, teach you and learn from you, to share in joyous

meals and celebrations as well as moments of sadness and loss. However, while I have been on the job for four months as your new rabbi, an installation weekend gives us the chance to formally ritualize the process. It is a chance to reflect not only on this special moment in my life but the sacred role that this congregation plays in each of our lives.

On Friday night, November 10th, beginning at 7:30 pm, we will join together in our beautiful sanctuary to celebrate Shabbat together, to express our appreciation for the past, and to share our hopes and prayers for the future. After our Torah scrolls are passed through, and from, the congregation to me, my teacher and friend, Rabbi Ken Kanter, will officially install me as your Senior Rabbi. We will then celebrate together at a festive oneg Shabbat. Then, on Saturday evening, November 11th, we will gather together at the Metropolitan Club for a night to "Celebrate our Future." If Friday night represents the formalization of our relationship together, Saturday represents all of our excitement for what is possible in the future. Rabbi Kanter will again be our speaker on Saturday night where, along with our Cantorial Soloist, Mike Zuspan, he will present an interactive musical tribute to "The Jews of Tin Pan Alley." Come celebrate and sing along with us!

This should be a very exciting weekend for the congregation as we formally take a step into our future together. I hope you will join me.






CDTTY has had a whirlwind of a year so far - we have had a few events and a few Teen Lounge nights.



Ask a Professional

Jenny Gay, LMSW, a Geriatric Care Manager with Aviv Older Adult Services, graduated from Tulane School of Social Work and is a Licensed Master Social Worker in the State of Georgia. Her commitment to the aging process was inspired by her grandmother as she witnessed the good, bad and ugly parts of the aging infrastructure in our society and was motivated to be a part of positive change. She has worked with the Council on Aging in Asheville, NC, with Jewish Family Services of Western North Carolina, and has extensive memory care training as well as hospice experience. Her expertise is equal to her passion for older adult care.

Q: Jenny, at what point does an elder and/or family member know when it is time to consult a geriatric care manager?

A: Subtle or obvious changes in daily life provide signs that a professional guide with the aging process is needed. When routine activities change... like getting lost driving to a familiar store, keys cannot be located, or car cannot be found in the parking lot... a professional perspective is in order. A more obvious sign presents if your loved one has a fall, followed by a hospital stay and then caring for that person upon returning home. Life can turn upside down in the blink of an eye and the professional supports needed to regain balance are difficult to navigate. We are often called a life-line for safety, stability and emotional grounding.
