Rabbinic Reflections



Dear Friends,

As we enter this month of December, and the darkest time of the year, we can take solace in the knowledge that soon our *chanukiyot*, our Chanukah *menorahs*, will provide the light needed. According to our tradition, the menorah in the Temple in Jerusalem illuminated the whole world. Therefore, King Solomon built the Temple's windows wide on the inside and narrow on the outside (which is the opposite of medieval castles, which tried to capture as much outside light as possible), for the Temple's windows did not convey light into the Temple, rather, they were a source of light to the outside world. This is the light of our menorah and the light that we see on Chanukah.

The meaning of Chanukah comes from the Hebrew letters *chet* (ח) *nun*, (ג) and *chaf*, (ג) meaning dedication. This root also forms the Hebrew word *chinuch*, (אינוף) meaning education. This is an important reminder of the importance of education to the Jewish people. For as we rededicate ourselves with the lights of Chanukah, we should be aware that there is a dedication to learning that is a Jewish value. It is this value that has allowed our people throughout history to expand our cultural and religious textual repertoire in addition to making great additions to the worlds of literature, mathematics, science, and industry. So, I would like to invite each of you, at this time of dedication, to dedicate yourself to learn something new. Come try out our Sunday morning adult education classes, Torah study or Mishnah study, volunteer to help in the religious school, or find some other way, alone or with a group, to broaden and deepen your Jewish knowledge.

When we dedicate ourselves to the expansion of our knowledge, we can better see the holy light of creation. Let it be this light of knowledge, as well as the light from our *chanukiyot*, which illuminates our world at this season.

We hope to see all of you at our Chanukah Musical Shabbat on December 15 at 7:30pm. Do not forget to bring your own chanukiyah with 5 candles to light! Also, join us for our Chanukah party on Sunday, December 17 at 10:00am.

Chanukah Blessings **HAPPY**CHARUKAH**

Candles are added to the *Chanukiyah* from right to left but are kindled from left to right. The newest candle is lit first. (On the Shabbat of Chanukah, kindle the Chanukah lights first and then the Shabbat candles.)

Light the *Shamash* - the helper candle - first, using it to kindle the rest of the Chanukah lights and say or sing:

Recite every night:

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יִיָּ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלֶם אֲשֶׁר קִדְשָׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתָיו וְצְוָּנוּ לְהַדְלִיק בר שֵׁל חַנִּכַּה.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tsivanu l'hadlik ner shel Chanukah.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who hallows us with mitzvoth, commanding us to kindle the Chanukah lights.

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלֶם שֶׁעְשָׂה נִסִּים לַאֲבוֹתֵינוּ וְאִמּוֹתֵינוּ בּימִים הַהֶם בַּוּמן הַזָּה.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, she-asah nisim laavoteinu v'imoteinu bayamim hahaeim baz'man hazeh.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who performed wondrous deeds for our ancestors in days of old at this season.

Recite the first night only:

ַבָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם שֶׁהֶחֱיָנוּ וְקִיְּמָנוּ וְהָגִּיעָנוּ לַזְּמַן הַזֶּה.

Baruch atah, Adonai eloheinu, Melech haolam, shehecheyanu v'kiy'manu v'higianu laz'man hazeh.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, for giving us life, for sustaining us, and
for enabling us to reach this season.

Q: Jenny, at what point does an elder and/or family member know when it is time to consult a geriatric care manager?


