Message from the Rabbi



One of the of the most delightful Jewish holidays is Tu b'Shevat (literally the 15th day of the month of Shevat). You may be asking – *what? Which* holiday is that? That's because Tu b'Shevat, the holiday of the trees, has never had a primary ritual that all Jews have observed. Chanukah has us lighting the candles of the menorah. Purim has us listen to the Book of Esther. On Rosh Hashanah we hear the blast of the ram's horn. But how do we celebrate the New Year of the Trees? It's murky.

In ancient days Jews brought grains to offer at the Temple in Jerusalem. Centuries later, in Ashkenazic communities it was customary to eat 15 types of fruits with preference given to the fruits of Israel. Then, in the 16th century, in the Sephardic community, under the influence of the Kabbalists of Safed, the holiday observance was given specific form. Nathan of Gaza created a Tu b'Shevat seder modeled after the Passover seder. There were four cups of wine and special prayers to express joy for the bounty of the earth.

Today the Tu b'Shevat seder is celebrated by many Reform Jews. The evening is filled with eating, drinking and making merry. There is a progression of wine servings (grape juice for the children,) that mixes colors from the first cup to the fourth, starting with all white wine and ending with all red, representing the change of the seasons. And there are blessings over many types of fruits – fruits with shells (e.g. etrogs, pomegranates, oranges, grapefruits,) fruits with pits (e.g. dates, apricots, peaches, plums,) and entirely edible fruits (e.g. figs, raisins, strawberries, apples, pear and carob,) each type representing some principle in our mystical tradition. The seder is short, without a long script, a mini-banquet of tastes, not a recitation of historical events. For us the evening will include a great vegetarian feast that will delight both children and adults.

It all happens on Friday night February 10, preceding a Musical Shabbat. The weekly Torah portion that week will describe the Children of Israel crossing the Red Sea. At our Tu b'Shevat seder, our own children will plant parsley seeds and take their little pots home, in order to watch them grow, later to be used for their own Passover seders a few months later. It's going to be a delightful, fun-filled, tasty event for adults and children.

Message from the President



I want to thank all of you who came out to our special Congregation Meeting this past Sunday. We had over 125 members of our Dor Tamid Community hear about some new things, listen to the Search Committee's presentation and recommendation and then ask some great questions, and learn about where we are budget-wise and what we all can and need to do to help out.

For those of you that could not make it, here is a quick summary:

-Religious School is selling Mishloach Manot baskets for Purim;

-CDT is holding a "Build Your Roots" campaign selling trees to be planted around CDT;

-Our Gala "A Night on Broadway" will be March 18th. Tickets are on sale now!

-Rabbi Search Update:

-The Search Committee received 17 resumes and after a thorough process that began in May, unanimously recommended Rabbi Jordan Ottenstein to the Board of Directors, which unanimously passed on the recommendation to a Congregational vote. The result of the vote was a 98% approval to ratify the recommendation.

-Financial Update. CDT is really good at some things, but not good at fundraising. We all need to share in the responsibility of fundraising, as our dues only cover 47% of our budgeted revenue. We are announcing a new program, Project 100, which will help our budget by reducing expenses and raising funds for a total of \$100,000! Look out for more information on this soon.

Once we have more information regarding our hopeful signing of Rabbi Ottenstein, we will send out some information to the community.





looks forward to summer camp all year long. He loves spending July at Camp Barney with all the great friends he has made there.






