Dear friends.

I want to thank each of you for the warm welcome that I have received from so many in the CDT family. I have truly enjoyed my first month here and, even more after meeting so many of you, am continued to be honored to be serving as the rabbi of this community. If we have not yet met, I look forward to meeting the rest of you in the coming weeks.

Anytime a new rabbi comes into a community there are bound to be certain changes, and I am sure that many of

you have noticed there have already been some noticeable changes to our services on Friday nights. First and foremost, we will now have the opportunity each Shabbat to hear the Torah being read and to learn from its ancient and holy words. 



We collected thousands of pounds of food during our "kick off" year. Ninety six (96) families participated throughout the year and we are looking to grow that number this year by at least a third. Thank you to all the donors and to our Social Action committee members (and their friends and families) who so graciously volunteered their time and muscles to collecting and sorting the food. Lesley Radov, Ruthie Cohen, Larry Berger, Drew and Dianna Fonoroff, Leslie Page, Linda Barton, Debbie Eskenazi and Stephen Mittler, I thank you so very much!!

By the way – this past weekend we collected more than 5 barrels of food, with 1/3 of the families who signed up either out of town or unable to participate. That was simply fabulous!!!

Our Gan Tamid Garden, under the direction and "hands" of Lesley Radov has gleaned an enormous amount of fresh vegetables, garlic and herbs which have been, and currently are, being donated to the Buford Food Coop. Dr. Radov is a master at her gardening. Her dedication and efforts go far beyond what can be reasonably expected, and for that, I extend to her a sincere, Yasher Koach.

Last year, CDT participated in the Hunger Walk, under the leadership of our esteemed team captain, Debbie Eskenazi (Thank you again and again, Debbie). 


Welcome to Our New Youth Director!
