# **Rabbinic Reflections**



Dear friends.

As I write this month's bulletin column on first day of the month of Elul, we have officially begun our cycle leading to the Days of Awe and the High Holy Days of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. This is a season that begins today, coming out of the sadness of this past month, where we commemorated the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem, and, ultimately, will culminate with the joy of Simchat Torah, where we will dance and sing and celebrate the Torah along with our youngest students being consecrated.

But between now and then, we have some work to do, specifically the work of *cheshbon hanefesh*, the accounting of our souls. This time of year allows us the opportunity to look at who we are, where we have come from, and who we want to be in the coming year.

Starting with the first of the Hebrew month of Elul, Jews around the world will traditionally blow the shofar each day, serving as a spiritual alarm clock for our souls, telling us to wake up and look at who we are. We will adopt this custom at CDT and blow the shofar each day (except Shabbat). If you are in the neighborhood, please join us at 10:00 each weekday, 11:00 on Wednesdays, and during Religious School *t'filah* on Sundays hear the shofar blast.

As we get closer to Rosh Hashanah, we will have the official beginning of the Days of Awe on Saturday, September 16 as we celebrate the *selichot* service. This special service gives us our first opportunity to account for our mistakes and look to how we can be better as individuals and as a community. It will also be our first chance to start hearing the music of the holy days and to change our Torah covers to white.

I hope that our preparation for the holy days over these next couple of weeks provides us with the opportunity to pray, learn, and come together as a community in the New Year.

Shanah tovah.

# **High Holy Day Important Information**

We have arranged for additional parking at Saint Benedict Catholic Church, located on Parsons Road, with van service to and from CDT, **for all services other than** Erev Rosh Hashanah and all services/ programming starting at or after 2:30 PM on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Please follow the signs from CDT to the church parking lot. It is requested that passengers be dropped off at CDT, prior to parking your car off site. Please ensure passengers who are dropped off have their tickets in hand so they may enter the temple.

Seating is limited in the sanctuary; therefore, please fill in all the seats. Please do not save seats.

If you have a portable electronic device/cell phone, we kindly ask that you please silence it or power it off prior to entering our sacred space.

Please use the door in the rear of the Sanctuary (and not the side doors), to exit the Sanctuary during services.

There are additional restrooms available on the far side of the social hall.

Please remember to bring items for the Winter Coat - Accessory Drive and Project Isaiah (our HHD Food Drive benefiting the Atlanta Community Food Bank). Please take a bag on Rosh Hashanah to be filled up and brought back on Yom Kippur!

There is extremely limited time between the early and late services. Please exit the building and the parking lot <u>immediately</u> after the conclusion of your service. When leaving the parking lot, please utilize both exits, as police will be directing traffic to facilitate left hand turns.

If you are planning on attending any programming or services at 2:30 PM or after, on Rosh Hashanah or Yom Kippur, and have parked at Saint Benedict Catholic Church for morning services, please take the shuttle after services and move your vehicle to the CDT parking lot.
