Dear friends,

Once again, the High Holy Days have come and gone. We have repented for misdeeds of the past year, seen friends and fellow congregants whom we may not have seen in a while, shaken the lulay and etrog, and danced with the Torahs. So what comes next?

The next Hebrew month on our calendar is the month of Cheshvan, which the rabbis in the Talmud refer to as "Mar Cheshvah," the bitter month of Cheshvan, due to its lack of holidays, especially compared to the previous month. But let

me suggest that this coming month could be a "Matok Cheshvan," a sweet month of Cheshvan, and also a time to engage in the synagogue in many new ways.

Just in the next few weeks you will have the opportunity to:

- Come to Shabbat evening or morning services.
- Join our Social Action efforts by "Lighting up the Night" on October 6 in Piedmont Park to raise money and awareness for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society.

I may be just a bit biased, but I believe this year's High Holy Day services were some of the best at CDT. I hope each of you broke your fast with friends or family feeling inspired and even more connected to your Jewish life at CDT. Just one of my personal highlights was seeing many young families so engaged during both of our family services led by Rabbi Jordan and Mike Zuspan. Special thanks to both Dr. Terry Segal and Ruthie Cohen for each leading an enrichment program on Yom Kippur day. I would also like to thank so many who worked tirelessly to organize our services and ensure they ran smoothly: Jackie Berger, Marty Duke, Larry Benator, Penny Blitzer, Art Criden, Rob Lederman, Lesley Radov, Doug Katz, Lisa Danzig, Nancy Mittler, Lisa Oxman, our CDT staff, and our CDT High Holy Day Choir, whose beautiful voices filled our sanctuary.

Not to be overshadowed by the High Holy Days, our CDT Religious School is now in full swing, including the start to our exciting new hands-on curriculum for the middle and high schoolers. I was fortunate enough to attend my daughter's 8th grade class field trip to Ebenezer Baptist Church in downtown Atlanta. While sitting among their congregation for a Sunday worship service (my first at a Southern Baptist church), I had time to observe. As I watched our young teens soak it all in, I thought about how this will surely become a special memory for them. While, in time, they are likely to forget parts of the service, the overall experience and the related topics they will discuss as a class will certainly stick with them for years to come. This is just the first of many trips this class will take to churches, mosques and other synagogues this year in our new 8th Grade Comparative Religion unit. Meanwhile our 7th graders helped out in CDT's Gan Tamid garden as part of their Mitzvot unit, and the 9th grade traveled to the Anne Frank Museum to kick off their unit on Holocaust, Anti-Semitism, and Israel.

If I had a quarter for every compliment I've received about Jodi Rosa's heartfelt and inspirational High Holy Day Appeal on Yom Kippur day, I'd truly be a rich man. Jodi eloquently shared some of her personal challenges as a young person in NY searching for a connection with her synagogue and Jewish life, ultimately finding it here at CDT. Jodi described that without financial donations throughout the year, CDT's budget gets very tight, very quickly. The funds raised through our High Holy Day Appeal directly enable CDT to operate with a balanced budget. We have made donating to the annual appeal extremely easy – just Mail, Click or Come By. Cantorial Soloist's Message

Shalom chaveirim - Hello friends!

I hope that you and your families are doing well and are enjoying our autumn weather.

We have just celebrated *Simchat Torah*. *Simchat Torah* means "Rejoicing with Torah". This evening, for this joyous holy day, we will take out our *Torah* scrolls and danced around our sanctuary. We will sing songs, chant the last and first verses of the *Torah*, and then return the *Sifrei Torah* (*Torah* scrolls) to the ark as we sang *Eitz Chayim Hi* - It is a Tree of Life. One of my favorite parts of our celebration is when we unroll our Torah completely and circle the sanctuary with it. What a sight to behold! The entire *Torah*, the Five Books of Moses, will be on display — a truly awesome vision.

As many of you are now familiar, this past year we began chanting *Torah* on *Erev Shabbat*, Friday night, when there is not a *Bar/Bat Mitzvah* chanting *Torah* on the following *Shabbat* morning. Over the past year, mostly either I or Rabbi Jordan have chanted a paragraph or two from the week's *Torah* portion, making sure that *Torah* is always chanted for our community to hear on Shabbat. Lately, I have begun to have discussions with some of you about opening up the chanting of *Torah* to members of our congregation. In the process, I have discovered that some of you would like to chant *Torah* but are not sure that they remember enough from their *Bar/Bat Mitzvah* preparations to chant now, as adults. Others of you have never chanted *Torah* but would very much like to learn how.

Out of this desire, I will begin teaching adult *Torah* chanting/reading lessons beginning in the coming weeks. I know that many of you are at very different levels of Hebrew knowledge. Whether you don't know the difference between and *Aleph* and a *Bet*, can read Hebrew fluently but know nothing about chanting, or remember most but just need a refresher — I can teach you!



for the help of family and friends. With their help, he was able to contribute a tremendous amount to help the Foster Care foundation restock.


Lance Frazer


