Rabbinic Reflections



Dear friends,

I am writing this to you in the hours following our service of memory, healing and hope to honor those fellow Jews slain in the shooting at the Tree of Life Congregation in Pittsburgh. Going into the service, and throughout, I was struck by the magnitude of support that was offered to our congregation and community from the interfaith community of Johns Creek. During that service, Mike and I were joined on the bimah, not only by our president, Dan Rosen, but by clergy and leadership from Johns Creek Baptist Church, Johns Creek

Methodist Church, Masjid Jafar, St. Benedict Catholic Church, and the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. Additionally, there were many members of these houses of worship, and others, in the congregation during that service, as well as Captain Christopher Byers from the Johns Creek Police Department and members of the Johns Creek Chamber of Commerce.

The support of all of these members of the community was truly uplifting. But it should not only take tragedy to bring us together. The Talmud teaches that no synagogue should be built without windows, because we are commanded to be present in our communities. This is why it is so important for all of us to be ambassadors of CDT and of the Jewish people in our neighborhoods, in our schools, and among the people we meet. It is also why the clergy who were with us will be continuing to meet, starting at the beginning of November at CDT, in order to build relationships and strengthen the communal bonds we have with one another.

We concluded our service of memory singing the words, "If we build this world from love . . . then God will build this world from love." It is up to each of us, even in these dark moments, to bring forth more love into creation. And this love will truly lead to more peace.

Like each of you, the horrific act of hatred and violence at Tree of Life Congregation in Pittsburgh last Saturday has left me heartbroken and stranded with so many unanswerable questions. Though this is not the first time a religious hate crime at a place of worship has made headlines, this time just feels a little different. Maybe it's the magnitude. Maybe it's my new vantage point as President of a Jewish congregation. I don't know. What I do know is that it makes me angry to think that a place of worship, of any religion, could feel

anything but safe and secure. It is truly unfathomable to me. It defies logic and reason.

Congregation Dor Tamid stands in unity with the families of Tree of Life Congregation and the entire Jewish community of Pittsburgh as they begin to heal. This is a time when we must come together as one CDT to pray and help and support each other through this most challenging of times. We must also not let the acts of one hateful person dictate how we go about our lives. I can't tell you how good I felt when our Homes Against Hunger volunteers were at my home by 8:30 on Sunday morning to continue their honorable work. While the events of this past week should cause us to pause, reflect, and speak out against antisemitism and all hate crimes, we can't retreat into our homes. We will heal faster as a community, as a family.

Security at CDT has always been and will continue to be the highest of priorities for the Board of Directors and the CDT staff. We take the safety of you and your family very seriously. This week, Rabbi Jordan and I met with members of our local law enforcement agencies and various Jewish organizations in Atlanta to review our security policies and procedures to ensure they meet the highest of standards. Shalom chaveirim — Hello my friends,



They logged into nearpod.com to explore a lesson covering the different aspects of the state of Israel.





WITH APPRECIATION ... EAGLE SCOUT SERVICE PROJECTS

This past year, Congregation Dor Tamid was the beneficiary of four separate service projects by four local boy scouts. These projects represent a near-final requirement for a scout to attain Eagle Scout rank.

The four Eagle Scout candidates were Noah Berman of Troop 2000, and Josh Gordon, Lakshman Ravoori, and Justin Zandstra, of Troop 429.

Noah's project was the four picnic tables with attached benches. They are outside, on the East side of our building. Noah and his family are members of our congregation. His parents are Darryl and Enid Berman.

Josh's project was beautifying the area at the end of the trail, by the Meditation Garden. He installed bushes, ferns, flowers, and other attractive plants, as well as cleaned up the previous weeds.

Lakshman's service project was the renovation of the trail that runs from the Gan Tamid charity vegetable garden, down over the bridge, ending at the Meditation Garden. The trail is now wider, completely covered in mulch, and bordered on both sides with secured landscape timbers.

Justin's contribution was the six cedar slat benches on the outside of our building, which are easily portable. Two are by our front entrance and four are on the East side of the building, outside on the concrete. Justin and his family are members of our congregation. His parents are Mike and Estelle Zandstra.

As stated, these service projects represent one of the final steps for these scouts to become Eagle Scouts. 
